#### CENTRAL INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONS

It all started four (4) years ago when Head Coach Eddie C McGirt recruited thirty (30) some odd athletes. He knew that from this fine crop of athletes he could build a football power house and win the conference championship. In order to do this first, he must keep his "boys" in school. This want't much of a challenge because several of them became Dean's List students. The first year Coach McGirt's inexperienced freshmen had a dismal season, 3-5-1. With the aid of a good spring practice and the return of Robert Wells, Edgar Larmer, Wiley Williams, and Coleman Tyrance, things began to brighten and McGirt look forward to a highly successful season.

The second year with the addition of freshmen Etro Duncan: detensive end, Larry Jones and the tremendous improvement of running backs Thad Jones and William Dusenberry, linemen, Ldward West, Paul Reed, Charles Stowe and Grover Smith and wide receiver Benny Johnson, only a 6-6 tie to A &T kept the Bulls from winning their first CIAA championship. A 6-2-1 record was good but not good cought. However, McGrit's idea of building a power house looked good as forty-eight (48) lettermen returned to try to bring the bacon home next year.

Many moons later, Tootball season returned once again and the Bulls began training for another victorious season. After a brillant "come back" victory over the golden Tigers of Tuskegee Institute and a disheartening lost to the Agges of North Carolina A & T State University, the Bulls, for some odd reason or another, lost their spirit. They just showed up and played lackadasical tootball for the remander of the season. The 5-4 record for the highly rated Bulls was a "Nightmare".

Coach McGirt evaluated the past season and said, "You guys are a bunch of lazy pricks. You have lost all your pride and desire to play the gaine, you have the material to be the best team in the nation o you might as well come back prepared to work, and I mean that".

Many, many moons later, August 24, 1969 to be exact, 39 angry seterans returned with championship tever. With experience in every position, Coach McGurt immediately went to work. First be brought back an alumnus, Bill Davis, to coach the horses: the offensive linemen, this youthfulness, drive, and winning affittude were welcomed assets to the team. It was all over school, a desire to be someone, a desire to be a chamb.

The under rated defense made itself known fast. The Front Five, John "Wild Man" Fairley, I dgar I armer, "Round Robin" Smith, Larry "Hookfoot" Jones, Robert "Boo" Johnson played every game as though it was the last. Occasionally, a back would slip through the line

thinking that he was gone, but low and behold, a sturdy built middle hnebacker named Wilhe "Clarence" Martin hi him as though he had stolen something. Each opposing offense feared that defense, because they knew that everytime they touched the ball, something terrible was going to happen to them.

The offensive machine was headed by none other than quarterback "Skinny Roy" Duncan, One scout defined the Bull offense as "The lastest Collegiate Team in the Nation".

With turbo-jets such as 9,4 Benny Johnson, 9,5 Bernard Parker, 9,7 Wilham Dusenberry, one can easily see how this statement was made. Edward "Big Mae" West, Paul "Pablo" Reid, and Arthur "Roche" Hardy were all clocked better that 5.0 flat in the 40 yard dash, thus being able to pull a supply sufficiently down field blocking for the "astro-backs". The offensive line was so good that their quarterbacks were dumped less than three times a game.

The Virginia Union Panthers were the first to pay for the previous dismal season. The Line blocked, Duncan threw, Dawkins, Johnson and Parker caught, Dusenbury and Jones ran, the defense let fire to the Panthers, and McGirt coached.

Week after week after week, the "Herd" trampled over foe after foe. Gate recepts began to over flow as Homecoming crowd just couldn't believe what they saw. A catastrophe, The "Mighty Bulls" couldn't even muster a single score as the "Eagles" flew home victoriously. As the world caved in on them, all thought the championship was still but a year away: all except the team. A pep talk by Dr. Newson Sunday night lifted the Teams spirit, now they knew that "Ole Doc Newsome" was still at their side.

Coach McGirt's team of veterans still had an outside chance. With the Dickerson rating still in effect, a victory over Fayetteville State and a defeat and a tee to North Carolina Central University would clinch the title to Johnson C. Smith. University. As the season came to a close, Union beat North Carolina Central University and A. & T fought them to a 28-28 tie. The "Ole Veterans," dejected and heart broken, pride got in their way, as they barely got out of Fayetteville alive. With a keen interception return Wille Martin, two scrambling touchdowns by "Skinny Roy," some "I ancy-Dan" tumble recovery in the end zone by "Big West," and a game saving tackle by "Sweet Herb" Boyd, we were victorious 28-22.

As we live on, let us remember this quotation

### Edward "Big Mae" West Offensive Tackle Center

It's almost impossible to believe that as a freshman, Eddie was a frail six feet. 190 pound guard. He quickly developed into the finest center ever to play the game as a 6' 2". 220 pound center. However, a torn carrilege at mid season sidelined him for the remainder of the season. A car wreck that following summer further Dampened his career. But sheer determination and a lot of weight liftung enabled him to return as a 6'3"-260 pound junior center. His senior year. Head Coach Eddie McGirt, who knicknamed him "The Wrecker," switched West to Tackle where he was drafted by the Pros.

Good blocking was his game, sure-hands was his name. Known by his teammates as "Good Hair", Richard could always be counted on for first down yardage. He lead the team in receptions his final season and was drafted by the Houston Oilers in the 11th Round.



Paul "Pablo" Reid Offensive Tackle

Better known as "Mr. Durable", Paul is the only player in modern day history of the "Golden Bulls" to start and play every game of his collegate career. Neither injuries nor inconsistent play resulted in his being benched. Paul was an "ALL-CIAA" selection and co-captain and was drafted in the 4th round of the Atlanta Falcons.

### Coleman "Big T" Tyrance Guard

The mark of a champion is being able to step into a new position and play it like a vecteran. Being a defensive specialist, his first three years at Smith, "Big T" was switched to offensive guard by Coach McGirt to strengthen his powerful line.





Indescribably viscious Captain "Smitty" has made life miserable for the opposition during his four years as a middle guard. He has the quickness of a cat and gracefulness of a ballet dancer. His famous saying was, "These young boys are fools. You don't play football with muscles no more, you use your head". This saying, along with his consistent play and leadership, lead his teammates and coaches to call him "The OLE VETERAN."



Robert "Bobby Boo" Johnson (81) Defensive End

Wrecking crew as a freshman, second team as a soph, Bob made himself known as a guard as a junior and a defensive end as a senior. His notorious play at end made opposing quarterbacks direct their attacks in some other direction.





Charles "Mule" Stowe (86) Tight End and Linebacker Defensive Tackle

Tight End, Linebacker, Defensive Tackle and Offensive Tackle, "Chuck" played them all. Coach McGirt knew that he could depend on Stow. His versatility lead him to being drafted to the Pros as a Free Agent.



Edgar "Big Red" Farmer (75) Defensive Tackler

Probably the "meanest" looking athlete in the country, the bone crushing bruiser from Fayetteville, N. C., terrorized visiting teams so much that they wished they could have stayed home and played with the kittens. All-CIAA and NAIA for 2 years, along with being drafted as a Free Agent, Farmer is a sure bet to be All-Pro within the next 5 years.



Wylie "Choo Choo" Williams (32) Halfback

Called "The Cuban" because of his resemblance to Castro, his home boy. 
"Choo-Choo" Williams was a very able-bodied substitute. He could be and was ealled upon at almost any time to replace any one of the first team running



William "Wild Bill" Dusenberry (27) Halfback

All the rushing and scoring records of J.C. Smith now belong to "Mr. Football Man". "First Down Dusenberry", "Touch Down Dusenberry", "Pass caught by Dusenberry" these remarks were heard at almost every football game. He has received every honor capable of being given to a football player. His outstanding clutch play are the main reason for his being one of the top draft choices of the professional football league. Don't be surprised if you hear, "Rookie of the year is presented to———".

### Thaddeus "Big Albert" Jones (35) Fullback

"It's lones with the ball, he's hit on the 10 yard hine. Watta-minute folks, he dragging the whole team. See him run, see him run to the end zone for the touch down." The fastest man on the team, Benny, could always be counted on to convert a long yardage situation into a first down. His "rabbit" like feet made him a scoring strike anywhere on the field. He was picked in the sixth round by Houston.



John "Rockhill Rocket" Parker (26) Split-End

"Give me a ball and I'll kick it off the face of the earth." This coming from Parker doesn't sound impossible if you've seen him in action. There are few, if any, athletes in the nation who can outrun Parker for forty yards. His exceptional hands and tricky moves make him almost impossible to defend against. "Nard Lee" was drafted by the Pros as a free agent.
