

Yearbook Allocations Fall Way Short *"If important — How important.. ... Is a Yearbook Production?"*

The University has allotted \$13,000, this year for the 1978-79 yearbook, *The Bull*, approximately \$4,000 less than the estimated cost of the annual.

According to Anothy Hayes, the yearbook editor, the funds supplied by the school may go up to \$14,000, depending on student enrollment, which has not yet been totalled. Each student pays ten dollars in tuition fees for the yearbook.

The Student Government (SGA), in its last meeting, proposed an allocation of \$1,000 to be added to the yearbook funds. With the probable additions to the budget, Hayes said approximately \$2,000 will still be needed to meet the \$16,880 figure, given to him by the publishing company. This balance will be obtained by profits from advertisements and fund-raising projects that the yearbook staff will sponsor, such as socials and dances. The staff will also ask for donations from community organizations and individuals, Hayes said.

Student ads will be available at one half the price of business ads. Hayes explained that student ads, under the topic, "Express Yourself", can be purchased by groups or individuals who want a space reserved in the yearbook for their pictures. Group pictures may have no more than ten people. The price for student ads is fifty dollars per page. Hayes

said he is optimistic about this year's yearbook production, in spite of the monetary problems. He expects to have a basic book with about sixteen color pages. There will be no special effects, tints or elaborate cover. "Still I expect the yearbook to be better than last year's", Hayes commented. "This just means that everyone will have to work harder."

Last year, the total yearbook cost was \$20,000; \$7,000 more than initial \$13,000 appropriation. Eventually, the university was able to provide more funds for publication of the book. There is no guarantee that the university will provide additional funds this year, and Hayes urges the student body to take an active part in eliminating

this financial crisis. "*The Bull* is used to recruit students to Smith," he stated. "This should bring concern from the university as well as the student body." Hayes said he regards the yearbook situation as a test of student awareness and concern versus student apathy.

The 1979 "Bull Staff" was the recipient of several difficulties, concerning the "79 Production." In spite of a cut-back in our allotted budget for the production, we continued to produce the "Bull". This obstacle placed a heavy burden on our creativity. A lot of things that we wanted to present through this medium were left behind, due to a lack of funds. However, what we have prepared for you is a pictorial of life at Johnson C. Smith University 1978-79. You are the main characters. The setting is in Charlotte, N.C. We hope you enjoy your story.

'Like a family'

Smith is big enough for talented Bob Moore

Bob Moore's office in the basement of Johnson C. Smith's Brayboy Gymnasium is a tiny cubicle. The door is covered with clippings of newspaper and magazine stories about black athletes who have fouled up their lives, blown opportunities.

The heating in the office is capricious, sometimes suffocating, sometimes absent.

On the walls are a few photographs of some of the basketball teams Moore has coached and of his three sons. Coaching accolades are mounted on a desk and file cabinet.

And on the floor sits a baited mousetrap.

This is a long way from the spacious, carpeted, paneled coaching offices of Reynolds, Coliseum or Paley Pavilion or any of the other palaces of bigtime basketball.

Moore wants to keep it that way. Oh, he wouldn't mind an office like Dean Smith's. But he isn't interested in coaching at that level.

The first-year coach of the Johnson C. Smith Golden Bulls, who has strewn spectacular success all along the circuitous route of his career, says: "I've never had aspirations to get into major college coaching."

"I want to take kids that the other schools don't want and make doctors or lawyers or some other kind of successes out of them."

"I think that's the mission of black colleges — take what's left."

"When our kids finish college, they're better prepared for life because they've gone through more and done without."

"Schools like North Carolina can help some of our kids get it more advantageous for some others to go to a school like Smith or Virginia Union (where he coached before coming here)."

'79 BULLS

Moore, 6-foot-4, 210 pounds, 37 years old, could be in a position to land assistant coaching jobs at many big schools. He was named Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association Coach of the Year Monday after taking one returning starter from a 10-18 team, mixed in some freshmen and sophomores, losing his first three games and four of his first five, then turning out an 11-12 team and a CIAA title contender.

Before this season, Moore has been coach of the Year almost every year he's been in the business, with sparkling high school records and some ultra-successful teams at Virginia Union.

But Moore says, "If I were at North Carolina, I'd be the coach. It's a job here. I'm part of the family. I coach and teach math classes and I'm part of the total school."

"I enjoy just what we're doing now. It's more like a family than a job."

Moore is as eloquently simple and straightforward as the message of that mousetrap there on the floor.

When he talks about his team's style of play, which is fast-paced, fast and not yet defense-oriented, he says: "We could hold the score down like they do in the ACC. If we wanted to pass the ball right times but in this league, the fans like to see action, so we take more shots."

"I've had players who could run the four corners

and could've frozen the ball forever but the fans hated it. We could play a slower, lower-scoring brand of ball in the CIAA but we wouldn't have anybody come to see us."

When he speaks of his nature as a coach, he says, "I don't curse. I don't yell and fust and get all emotional."

But if we play badly, I might come back to the gym and hold a practice from midnight to three in the morning. If that's being tough, then I'm tough."

On recruiting, Moore says, "I sit right behind the desk and do my recruiting. I really went out and recruited only one player on this team, Blue Oliver."

"I stay in touch by phone and mail with my former players and assistant coaches and they give me information on prospects and need players to me."

"One of my former players now living in Texas sent me Phil Flores. I never saw Phil until he walked into the dormitory here. Now, he's one of the best guards in the conference."

"That's typical of how I get a lot of players."

"My father (himself a former coach) visited Eldorado, Ark., and told me about seeing the best player in Arkansas, a guard named Isaac Greer who set a state record with 54 points in one game."

"I said, 'Aw, he'll go to Arkansas.' He didn't. He went to Grambling. But he didn't like it and went home."

"Now, he's here, sitting out a year before he's eligible."

"So that's my recruiting. A black college needs to get a coach with a lot of contacts if it's going to recruit well."

"I figure every one I graduate in his lifetime will send me at least two ballplayers."

As Moore said, it's like a family.
