I.C. Smith Begins Fund Campaign

announced a 10-year, \$20-million nearer the student population and capital funds campaign.

The local campaign will seek \$300,000 in endowment for faculty salaries and scholarships, \$700,000 for a student health center, and \$1 million for an instructional facility in humanities.

The Center for Humanities and the Arts will house programs in communication, music, art, drama, literature, religion and philosophy, and will provide studio, gallery, exhibition and rehearsal space.

An auditorium for the performing arts, seating 1,600, will be added later for concert, theatrical

and speaking purposes.

The health center will be located

Other priorities include an out-

Reaching Our Potential


A decade into our second century, the record of this important and courageous institution is far out of proportion to its limited resources.

"Don't worry about Alfred on the weak side," added Stroud. "Here will get his tackles and anyone foolish enough to try running at him all day is welcome to try."












