Marching Golden Bulls Take Top Honors In Competition

Surely it was a grand day for the Irish, but it was even grander for Charlotte's Marching Golden Bulls.

Johnson C. Smith University's marching band took top honors in the international competition in the St. Patrick's Day parade in Dublin, Ireland, Saturday, beating out 37 other bands.

"You wouldn't believe it," said a breathless Duncan Gray, band director. "We are the No. 1 band on the international level."

For a time, it didn't look like the band would get to compete. Members raised most of the \$75,000 needed for the trip, but the university loaned them the final \$10,000 to \$15,000.

Apparently, people really know how to throw a parade in Dublin. Gray said the weather was beautiful, and Dubliners lined O'Connell Street 10 deep. News accounts reported 300,000 in attendance.

Simply put, the Marching Golden Bulls wowed the crowd.

"We were so well-received we actually received police protection to deal with media and crowd control," Gray said.

Before the Lord Mayor of Dublin, U.S. ambassador, prime minister and other dignitaries and judges, the band performed Earth, Wind and Fire's "In the Stone."

"We have been treated like true ambassadors of music," Gray said.

Times have been heady — and hectic — since the Bulls left Charlotte on Wednesday. They have seen St. Patrick's Cathedral, Trinity College and the Book of Kells. And they presented the key to the city of Charlotte to the Lord Mayor of Dublin.

Today, the band travels to Limerick, where it will march in another competition, this time against 36 other bands.

Then it's back to Charlotte, where the band expects to arrive Tuesday night, holding high the crystal trophy won Saturday.

But band members would like to go back. The Lord Mayor and the Irish Tourist Board both have extended invitations.

Smith Makes The News

J.C. Smith Track Teams Running With Purpose

Johnson C. Smith's track coach Reggie Bodrick remembers the days just after he took over the Bulls program. The men's and women's teams were in disarray and the future was not so bright. Now things have improved to the point that Bodrick is expecting good things, like CIAA championships.

"These teams are like a rebirth of the teams of the past, like in the 60s and early 70s that produced the likes of two-time Olympic gold medalist Vince Matthews," Bodrick said. "All the athletes have taken a personal responsibility to bring this program to where it once was."

The Bulls, who are preparing for the April 7 S.C. State Relays in Orangeburg, S.C., have fared better this season due to a combination of improved competition and hungry young athletes.

"I can grade our success in terms of our youth—we have all freshmen and sophomores except two seniors," Bodrick said. "A lot of our success is attributed to the quality schedule. We have something to prove to ourselves. We feel that we are back. Right now, we're feeling pretty good about where we are."

Where the Bulls find themselves during the legs of its speediest men and women to respectable finishes in some of

the southeast's toughest meets. Smith has done its share of traveling this spring, participating in meets in Florida to Georgia, and Bodrick said he's been impressed with the efforts of his sprinters.

Dee Singletary, Duane Johnson and David Bugge have been mainstays in the men's sprints, especially in the 100- and 200 meters. Bugge, an Oron Hill, Md. freshman who finished third in The Athletics Congress (TAC)

national finals as a high school senior, was the Bulls' top recruit this year.

Singletary, the 200- and 400-meter specialist, is the most experienced runner, and has shown steady improvement this

season. Johnson, who runs the 100 and 200 was one of the top sprinters in S.C. last year at Orangeburg Wilkeson High. The six-athlete women's team is anchored by Mary Martin and Tanya Willis, two of the best

runners in the CIAA. Martin is the top sprinter, running in the 100-, 200- and 400 meters. After a leveling off last season, Bodrick said her performance has seen a major turnaround.

"She's having a rebirth for running. She's going out each meet and she's improving," Bodrick said.

Willis, an all-conference performer, is the main cog in the women's wheel, and Smith's focal point for the CIAA title chase April 19-20 in Hampton.

"In terms of the women, I think we should be able to claim at least third," Bodrick said.

The men are capable of taking it all, Bodrick believes because in addition to speed, Smith now has some power in the field events, which were neglected in past years.

"I believe the men have a real good chance to win. We have a javelin thrower, a high jumper and a long jumper now," he said. "We're now able to fulfill just about all the events now and score points."

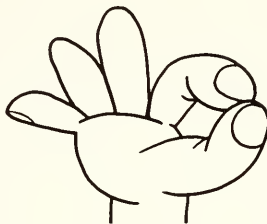
