



Omega Psi Phi was started on November 17, 1911 on the campus of Howard University: There were three Howard University students aided by a faculty advisor. These men gave birth to Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. This event took place in the office of Ernest E. Just, the faculty advisor. The three students were Edgar A. Love, Oscar J. Cooper and Frank Coleman. Manhood, Scholarship, Perseverance and uplift were selected as cardinal principles.

On December 5, 1921 the Rho chapter of Omega Psi Phi was established on Johnson C. Smith's campus by Dr. George and Dr. Wyche.
