Upon Graduation from law school Ms. O'Neal intends to practice animal rights laws.



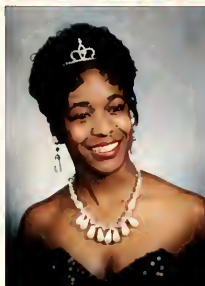

Omega Psi Phi was started on November 17, 1911 on the campus of Howard University. There were three Howard University students aided by a faculty advisor. These men gave birth to Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. This event took place in the office of Ernest E. Just, the faculty advisor. The three students were Edgar A. Love, Oscar J. Cooper, and Frank Coleman. Manhood, Scholarship, Perseverance and Uplift were selected as cardinal principles.

On December 5, 1921 the Rho Chapter of Omega Psi Phi was established on the campus of Johnson C. Smith University by Dr. George and Dr. Wyche.

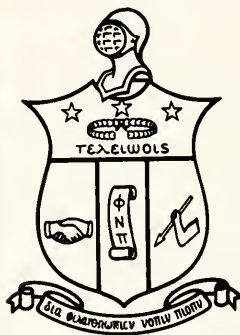

Early in this century, black students were actively dissuaded from attending any college or university. Formidable obstacles were erected to prevent the few who enrolled from assimilating into co-curricular campus-life. This social ostracism characterized Indiana University and caused Elder Watson Diggs and Byron K. Armstrong, joined by eight other men of vision to form Kappa Alpha Psi Frat., Inc. on January 5, 1911. The founders sought a formula that would immediately raise the sights of black collegians and stimulate them to accomplishments higher than they might have imagined. Fashioning "achievement" as its purpose, Kappa Alpha Psi began uniting college men of culture, patriotism, and honor in a bond of fraternity.
