### Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc.

On Friday evening, November 17, 1911, three Howard University undergraduate students, with the assistance of their faculty adviser, gave birth to Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. This event occurred in the office of biology professor Ernest E. Just, the faculty adviser, and three liberal arts students were Edgar A. Love, Oscar J. Cooper and Frank Coleman. The fraternity has emerged as one of the prestigious Black fraternities in America. Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. was the first Greek letter organization of national standing to be established on JCSU's campus. On December 5, 1921 Rho Chapter was established and began a career on the campus which has been rewarding to many local Smithites.

Sigma Gamma Rho was founded on November 12, 1922, on the campus of Butler University in Indianapolis, Indiana. The group became an incorporated national collegiate sorority on December 30, 1929. Seven distinguished young teachers founded Sigma Gamma Rho with the idealism that greater service resulted in greater progress. Hence, the birth of a sisterhood dedicated to its African American brothers and sisters to help provide the means that they may promote cultural awareness. educational and health programs, and recreational activities. Today Sigma Gamma Rho has grown to over 72,000 members with over 600 chapters in US, Bermuda, Bahamas, and the Virgin Islands. The Beta Upsilon Chapter Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority came to JCSU in 1955 and was the first sorority in the Pan-Hellenic Council.

#### Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc.

Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. was founded at Howard University in Washington, DC, January 9, 1914, by three young Black male students. The founders, Honorable A. Langston F. Morse and Honorable Charles I. Brown, wanted to organize a Greek-letter fraternity that would truly exemplify the high ideals of brotherhood, scholar-ship, and service. The founders deeply wished to create an organization that viewed itself as "a part of" the general com-munity. They believed that each potential member should be judged on his own merits rather than his family background or affluence, without regard of race, nationality, color, skin tone, or texture of

hair. They wished and wanted their fraternity to exist as a part of an even greater

brotherhood-sisterhood which would be devoted to the "inclusive we" rather than the "exclusive we." From its inception, the founders also conceived Phi Beta Sigma as a mechanism to deliver services to the general community. Rather than gaining skills to be utilized exclusively for themselves and their immediate families, the founders of Phi Beta Sigma held the deep conviction that they should return their newly acquired skills to the communities from which they had come. This deep convection was mirrored in the fraternity motto, "Culture For Service and Service For Humanity.'

#### Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc.



Zeta Phi Beta Sorority was founded on January 16, 1920, by five women on the campus of Howard University. It was the idea of these founders that the sorority would reach college women in all parts of the country who were sorority-minded and desired to follow the ideals and objectives of finer womanhood; scholarship, service, and sisterly love on which Zeta Phi Beta Sorority was founded. Zeta Phi Beta was the first Greek letter college sorority to organize in Africa. More than 250 undergraduate and graduate chapters are divided into nine regions in the United States and Africa. The Kappa Chapter of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. was established on the campus on Johnson C. Smith on November 26, 1946.





T.S. Monk, drummer, bandleader, composer and vocalist was drawn the drums before the age of 10 and his destiny was sealed when Ma Roach, with whom he studied gave him his first drum set. His father we the greatest pianist Thelonius Monk. Upon graduating from high schoot the young Monk joined his father's trio and toured with him until the eld Monk's retirement in 1975. T. S. Monk then worked in the R&B Fieltouring with the group, Natural Essence. Later, he formed his own grout with his sister, Barbara, and released two recordings Honse of Music ar More of the Good Life. Not until 1992, did T.S. Monk form his jazz setet, forging a cohesive and driving style that has shot the group to the forfront of jazz today. His album Monk on Monk won the 1998 Down Bejazz Album of the year. On September 29, 1999, the T.S. Monk Sext delighted the audience in Biddle Auditorium with a touch of jazz ar R&B sponsored by the Lyceum Series Committee.
