


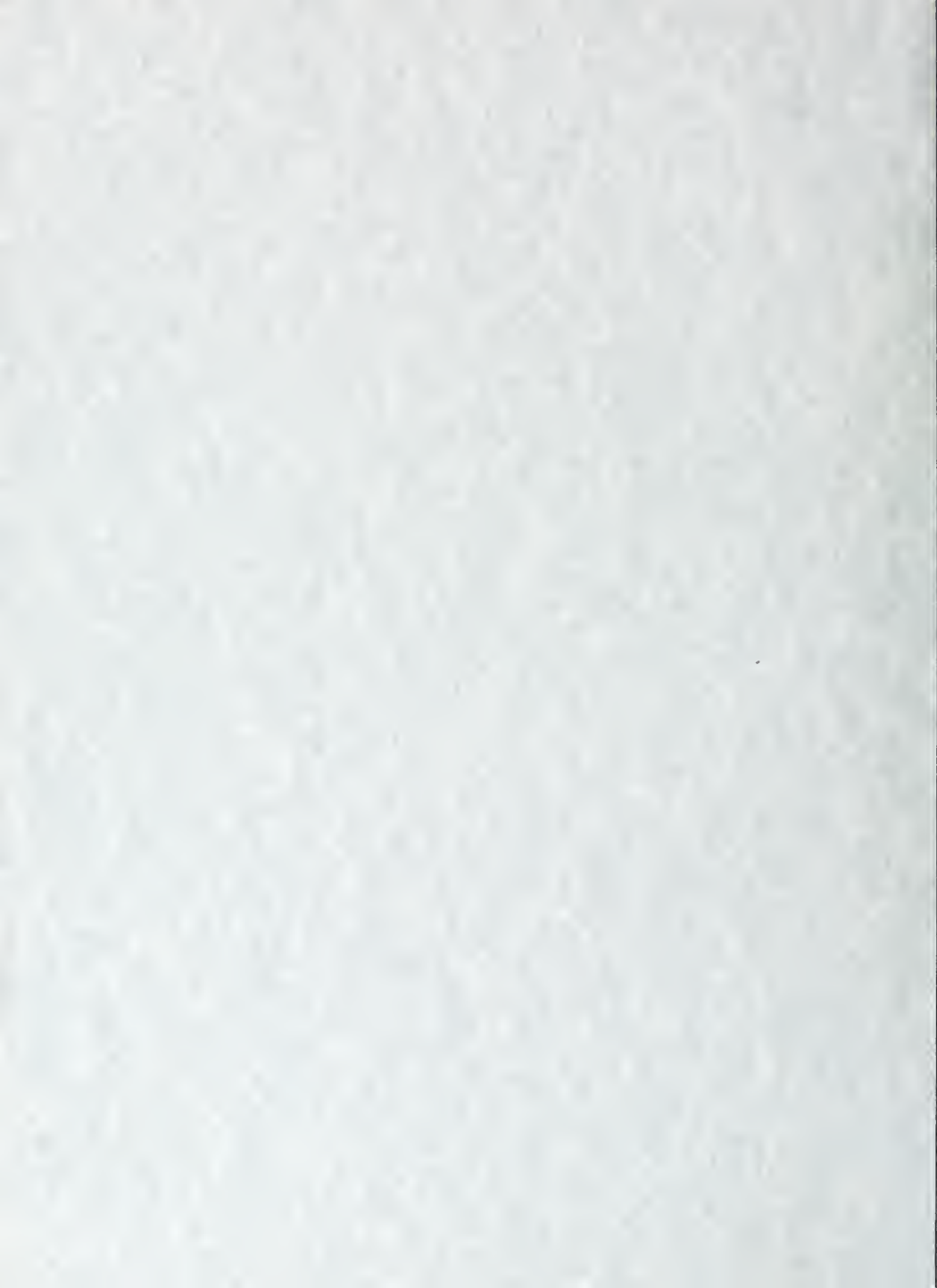

History of Johnson C. Smith University

In 1867, the Rev. S. C. Alexander and the Rev. W. L. Miller saw the need to establish an institution in this section of the south and began to devise such plans as would secure the desired results. On April 7th, 1867, at a meeting of the Catawba Presbytery in the old Charlotte Presbyterian Church, formerly located at the corner of D and Fourth streets, Charlotte, N. C., the movement for the school was formally inaugurated, and these two ministers were elected as teachers.

Information concerning the establishing of the school was brought to the attention of Mrs. Mary D. Biddle, and excellent churchwoman of Philadelphia, Pa., who through appeals on behalf of the work in one of the church papers, pledged \$1,400. In appreciation of this first and generous contribution, friends of the project requested Mrs. Biddle to name the newly established school after her late husband, Major Henry Biddle. After the request was granted, the school was named Biddle Memorial Institute and later was chartered by the state legislature under that name.

Colonel W. R. Myers, a wealthy citizen of Charlotte, donated the first eight acres of land used as the site for the school, from 1867 to 1876, the school was known as the Biddle Memorial Institute. In 1876, the charter was changed by the Legislature of North Carolina, and the name of the school became Biddle University. The institution operated under this name until 1929.

From 1921 to 1922, the late Mrs. Jane Berry Smith, of Pittsburgh, Pa., gave funds for the erection of a theological dormitory, a science hall, a teachers' cottage and a memorial gate. In addition, she provided a handsome endowment for the institution in memory of her late husband Johnson C. Smith. In recognition of these generous benefactions, the Board of Trustees voted to change the name of the institution to Johnson C. Smith University. The charter of the school, accordingly, was so amended March 1, 1923, by the Legislature of the State of North Carolina. From 1923 until her death in October 1929, Mrs. Smith gave funds for the erection of the most building, including a campus church.

James B. Duke, a wealthy businessman of Somerville, N. J., further strengthened the University from 1924 to 1925 as a result of a substantial provision. Mr. Duke also had a home in Charlotte and had been contacted by the president of the university, Dr. H. L. McCrory, several years prior for a contribution. Mr. Duke did not respond to Dr. McCrory's letter, but in the authority of the establishment of the Duke Endowment on December 11, 1924, Johnson C. Smith University was included as one of the beneficiaries. Through the Duke Endowment has been of inestimable value to the planned development of the university.

Also in 1924, the institution was recognized by the North Carolina State Board of Education as a four-year college. In 1929, the high school department was discontinued and the standard program was restricted to a college of liberal arts and sciences and a theological department.

In 1932, the constitution was amended, providing for the admission of women to the senior division. The following year, provision for men then the university coeducation.

In 1928, the institution was granted the status of an independent college, affiliated with the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America, reporting to the General Assembly through the Board of Christian Education.

Johnson C. Smith University joined the United Negro College Fund in 1944. This fund was organized primarily to help financially related schools to better learning to repay their training programs, to expand their facilities to promote faculty growth, and to create new areas of service. The institutions' membership in the fund began in that first, immediate year.

Mission Statement

Founded in 1867 under the auspices of the Committee on Freedmen of the Presbyterian Church, U.S.A., Johnson C. Smith University is an independent, private, coeducational institution of higher learning. Located in the rapidly growing metropolis of Charlotte, North Carolina, "Queen City of the South," this historically African-American University has a residential campus with a familial atmosphere in which students are stimulated and nurtured by dedicated and caring faculty and staff.

Consistent with its Christian roots, the university recognizes the importance of moral ethical values to undergird intellectual development and all endeavors. JCSU believes the unrelenting pursuit of knowledge and in the values of cultivating the life of the mind. The university assigns great significance to the development of self-confidence, to the understanding of ones' own heritage as well as an awareness of the cultures of others, to exploration of the myriad forces affecting people of a complex technological age, and to formulating a sense of one's role in this schema.

This mission of JCSU is to provide an outstanding education for the diverse group of talented and highly motivated students from various ethnic, socioeconomic, and geographical backgrounds. The university offers a liberal education in conjunction with concentrated study in specialized fields, in preparation for advance study and specific careers.

The university endeavors to produce graduates who are able to communicate effectively, think critically, learn independently as well as collaboratively, and demonstrate competence in their chosen fields. Further, it provides an environment in which students can fulfill their physical, social, cultural, spiritual, and other personal needs through which they can develop a compelling sense of social and civic responsibility for leadership and service in a dynamic, multicultural society. Likewise, the university embraces its responsibility to provide leadership, service, and lifelong learning to the larger community.

Regarding teaching effectiveness as paramount in its educational enterprise, JCSU has a commitment to the recruitment and retention of an outstanding faculty. To this end, the university promotes faculty development, encourages faculty involvement in research and other creative activities, and endorses the principle of academic freedom.

To insure the integrity and stability of its status and the perpetuation of its rich legacy, Johnson C. Smith University has a firm resolve to maintain the fiscal and human resources requisite to be a truly distinctive institution—a hallmark of excellence in its students, faculty, staff, administrators, academic and other programs, facilities, operation and environment.

The History of Miss JCSU

Information taken from the student activity "finding aid" in the archives written by Monika Rhue, Associate Archivist.

The athletic team selected the "Sponsors" of Johnson C. Smith University from Barber-Scotia College and the city of Charlotte. During the 1930's upper class Scotia women were admitted to Johnson C. Smith University. The upper class Scotia women were selected by the athletic team to be the "Sponsors" of JCSU. The title "Sponsor" underwent a change and the title "Miss Johnson C. Smith Homecoming Queen" was adopted.

Miss Johnson C. Smith University was selected by the football team and crowned by the President during halftime at the homecoming games. This practice continued until 1944. Dr. Hardy Liston, then the Executive Vice President, installed the student government association and its first president Mr. William Davis to handle all homecoming events.

Glamour during homecoming started when Mrs. Inez Moore Parker staged the coronation of the Queen as a special feature before the homecoming game. The ceremony resembled the British Coronation with all its beauty and glamour. Soon the coronation became the pride and joy of every Smith female. The coronation took place in Biddle Hall until 1965. When the new gymnasium was built, the crowning of Miss JCSU was held at the gym. The homecoming queen activities were filled with glamour and prestige under the sponsorship of Mrs. Inez Moore Parker for 30 years.

During the 1960's when the phrase "Black is Beautiful" expressed the sentiments of black in America, the style of the coronation changed to reflect an afrocentric perspective. Mrs. Joyce Crisp, then the student union Directress in 1972, headed the first afrocentric coronation. The script for the coronation was written in Swahili with assistance from Le Roi Jones (Amiri Baraka). Mrs. Crisp designed the set with an African motif. Everything was designed with the most exquisite taste and related to the homecoming theme.

Young Buck

Coming out of Nashville, Young Buck started rhyming in his early teens, splitting his time between the studio and the streets. In the late 1990s he hooked up with the Cash Money Millionaires, who were on the verge of blowing up nationally. After several years signed to the Cash Money label, he had toured a lot but still hadn't released any records. Tired of waiting, he split from the label and put out an independent album called Thuggin' Til The End with his homie D-Tay. Shortly thereafter, Young Buck teamed up with Juvenile, who had left Cash Money to start his own crew/label, UTP. While touring with Juve, Young Buck met up with 50 Cent, and the two started recording tracks together. When 50's career exploded, he reunited with Buck and added him to the G Unit roster, putting him on Get Rich or Die Tryin' ("Bloodhound") and giving him a co-starring role on G Unit's Beg For Mercy. Young Buck added a Dirty South flair to the crew and set the stage for his first solo album, Straight Outta Cashville, which was released in August 2004.(rollingstone.com)





Yung Wun



Hailing from Atlanta, Yung Wun is the only member of the Ruff Ryders who's not from the tri-state area. He has contributed to albums by Swizz Beatz and Jadakiss and appeared on the Ruff Ryders' Vol. 2 and Vol. 3 compilations. In 2004, Yung Wun released his first official single, "Tear It Up," featuring DMX and David Banner. (rollingstone.com)

Miss. B -AKA- Miss. B'Havin'

Born and raised in the ATL, Miss B (short for Miss B'Havin') describes her style as "R&B/pop/hip-hop" and started her career singing in a group called Protégé. Still, it took a crunk, rowdy club banger to get her big break. Inspired by the success of songs like "Headbussa," Miss B recorded the official 2004 anthem for feisty women, "Bottle Action," which is gaining airplay on mixtapes and radio stations throughout the country. "I don't fight, I don't argue, I just hit that b***h with a bottle," she raps, recalling last year's incident that she used as the basis for her single. Still, Miss B emphasizes that violence isn't her way of life. "This is just a stepping stone for me to get in the door," she says. "This isn't really who I am." Apparently, it worked, since "Bottle Action" enabled her to ink a deal with Playmaker/So So Def Records. She's currently focused on recording for the So So Def Dirty South All-Stars compilation as well as her upcoming debut album. With the current shortage of stand-out female MCs, Miss B caters her music towards women, but doesn't plan to sex up her image for attention a la Lil' Kim and Foxy Brown. "They do their thing, and I do mine," she says. "But I'm more hip-hop punk. It's very sexy, but it's punk at the same time." (Julia Beverly at ozonemag.com)

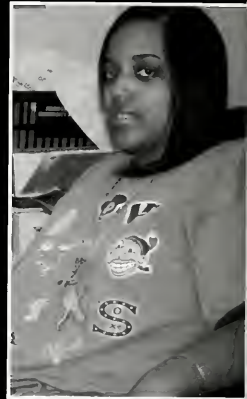
When Dr. Condoleezza Rice spoke to more than 500 Johnson C. Smith University students Monday morning, she didn't focus on national security. Instead, Rice talked about JCSU's importance to her personally and also reminded students that they should value their education at a Historically Black College or University. Her father, the late John Rice graduated from Johnson C. Smith in 1946 with a degree in history. He later came back and received a seminary degree and became a Presbyterian Minister. Rice reminisced about the years she spent on the JCSU campus as a little girl when her father would come back to visit Charlotte and attend conferences for Presbyterian ministers. Rice stressed the importance of attending and supporting Historically Black Colleges and Universities. She shared with the crowd a story of how her grandfather was a sharecropper in Alabama and had saved money to attend Stillman College. After completing the first year, he was told that he also had to pay for next year's tuition. When he explained to them he had no money, they told him he had to leave. Being a quick thinker, her grandfather then asked how some of the other men were able to pay for college and he was told they had scholarships for seminary training to become Presbyterian Ministers. Rice ended her short 15-minute talk by encouraging students not to go into a major because of a specific job. "The jobs will come. The key is to find your passion."

In 1906, seven brave men studying at Cornell University founded Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. and, in doing so, established the nation's first intercollegiate fraternity for African Americans. Known today as the "Seven Jewels," these men overcame the racial hostility of their time and founded an organization built on the principles of scholarship, fellowship, good character, and the uplifting of humanity.

As Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. expanded, the ranks of its prestigious membership grew to include the likes of W.E.B. DuBois, Thurgood Marshall, Paul Robeson, Martin Luther King, Jr., and many other accomplished men. Today Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. has a membership of over 80,000 with more than 700 chapters worldwide.

Kappa Alpha Psi was founded on the campus of Indiana University in Bloomington, 1911. The Esaterity's fundamental purpose is achievement.

Each in this century, African American students were actively precluded from attending college. Formidable obstacles were erected to prevent the few who were enrolled from remaining into 44-club days. The story of this discrimination at Indiana University in 1911 causing Eric W. White, Donald K. Armstrong, and other black students to form the Alpha Psi Fraternity, which remains the only Greek-letter organization with an Alpha Chapter on the University's campus.

The founders sought a formula that would give the sight of 1000 collegians and students an accomplishment higher than they might have imagined.

Fashioning achievement as its purpose, Kappa Alpha Psi began as a college men of culture, patriotism, and honor in a band of fraternity.

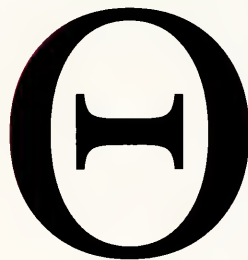
Delta Sigma Theta Sorority was founded on January 13, 1913 by twenty-two collegiate women at Howard University. Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., was organized at Howard University on January 16, 1920 as the result of encouragement given to the five founders: Arizona Cleaver-Stemmons, Fannie Pettie, Viola Tyler, Myrtle Tyler, Pearl Anna by Robert Taylor and A. Langston Taylor, members of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. These two visionary Sigma Brothers felt the campus would benefit by the development of such an organization as sisters to the fraternity. Though often imitated, we can never be properly duplicated Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity Inc. and Zeta Phi Beta Sorority Inc. still remain the first and only constitutionally bound Brother & Sister Greek-letter organization in existence. Others have come along and tried to imitate what Sigma and Zeta began, but they were not built from the same framework and thus, can never be called a true family.

As Iota Phi Theta continues to grow and strengthen, so will its commitment to make meaningful contributions to society in general, with particular emphasis in the African-American community. Throughout America, Iota Phi Theta has come to represent excellence in all areas. The Fraternity is, and shall forever remain dedicated to its founders' vision of "Building a Tradition, Not Resting Upon One!"

On September 19, 1963, at Morgan State College (now Morgan State University), 12 students founded what is now the nation's fifth largest, predominately African-American social service fraternity: The Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated.

The founders of Iota Phi Theta were: Albert Hicks, Lonnie Spruill, Jr., Charles Briscoe, Frank Coakley, John Slade, Barron Willis, Webster Lewis, Charles Brown, Louis Hudnell, Charles Gregory, Elias Dorsey, Jr., and Michael Williams.

Each of the Nine NPHC organizations evolved during a period when African Americans were being denied essential rights and privileges afforded others. Racial isolation in predominantly white campuses and social barriers of class on all campuses created a need for African Americans to align themselves with other individuals sharing common goals and ideals. With the realization of such a need, the African American Greek-lettered organization movement took the persona of a haven and outlet, which could foster brotherhood and sisterhood in the pursuit to bring about social change through the development of social programs that would create positive change for Blacks and the country. Today the need remains the same.

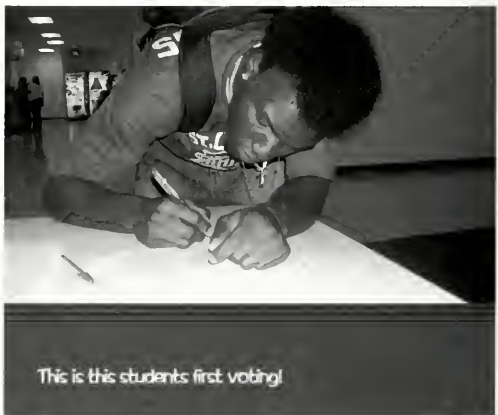
