## Trained <br> Industrialists

Trained to be the foundation and building blocks of an automated world, students of the industrial department prove their ability to understand and apply principles.

In general departments - wood work, shop, and carpentry - students create practical products from rough disheveled wood. A study of electricity provides a means of probing into the mysteries of wiring and currents. It teaches the student the elementary principles of radios and the operations of motors and generators. Machine shops give future technicians or supervisors first hand knowledge of intricate machines and let them apply skills. Mechanical drawing teaches exactness and precision through blue prints, geometric construction, lettering, pictorial drawing, projection or technical sketching.
