


# **Cross Country**

Defeating every opponent at least once, their only losses were the opener with Lees-McRae, and to a revengeful Wingate team.






They join an elite group of students selected from more than 600 institutions of higher learning in all 50 states, the District of Columbia and several foreign nations in North and South America.

#### HIGHLIGHTS OF PROGRESS:

- 1901-Waldensian Hosiery Mills founded.
- 1905-Major expansion of knitting machines.
- 1916—Operation expanded to include a box factory.
- 1928—Pilot Full Fashioned Hosiery Mill (later Alba Hosiery Mills) founded.
- 1928—Separate plant established to produce men's hosiery.
- 1932-Yarn processing plant established.
- 1935-Plant addition for men's seamless hose.
- 1948—Additional seamless plant established at Lenoir, N. C.

- 1955—A method of manufacturing women's stretch pantie briefs and pantie girdles on full-fashioned machines was developed and patented.
- 1957—Research and Development Department established.
- 1961—Alba Hosiery Mills, Inc. merged with Waldensian Hosiery Mills, Inc. to form Alba-Waldensian, Inc.
- 1964—Computerized (IBM) data processing installed.
- 1967—Redeco, S. A., formed in Switzerland with four European manufacturers for research in the hosiery and knitting industries.


