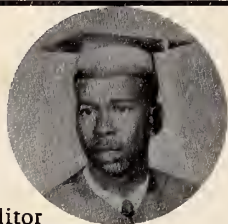
Her interest is shown in youth not only in the classroom but on the street, on the play grounds, in Sunday School, Church and wherever a word of encouragement is needed.

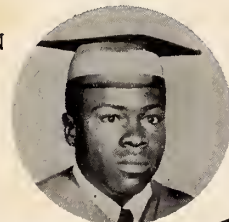

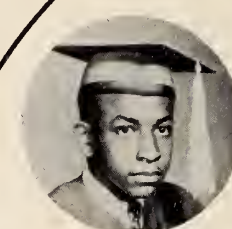

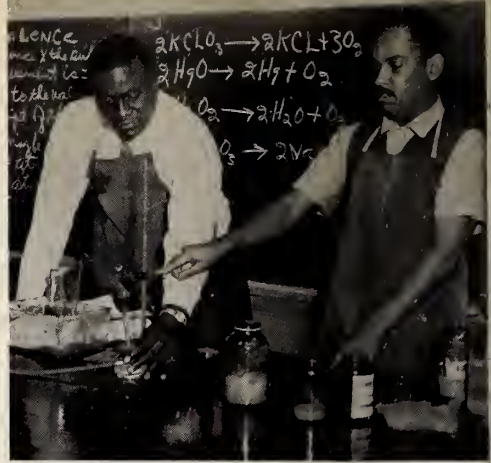
I congratulate you on your accomplishments to date; and strongly urge that you seek Divine Counsel and Guidance in your future efforts.

With the aid of our sponsors, Miss L. M. Blair, Mr. Q. K. Wall, and Mr. R. Ennis we were determined to make the best year ever.

Members of the class participated wholeheartedly in all clubs and activities. Glenda Clarke reigned as Miss J.C.T.S. Christmas Queen. Soon the time came that we were all waiting for.
