BRIEF HISTORY OF JOHNSTON CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL

Our school has been a standardized one since 1925. It is a union or consolidated school where grades 1 through 12 are taught.

Since 1922, it has increased its faculty from 11 teachers to the present 49 teachers; and the student body has grown from 513 to the 1015 presently enrolled. From the student body, the graduates have increased from 16 in 1925 to 109 in 1960.

Of the principals, our school has only had eight; namely John Byrd, Charlie Smith, William M. Cooper, J. B. A. Prather, W. H. A. Howard, A. J. Taylor, W. R. Collins and our present Principal J. F. McNeill.

The many other achievements and praiseworthy growth of our school can best be seen when written in the following manner:

AREAS:

 A Homemakers Center which approaches the model set by the state.
 The school plant consists of six modern buildings; a 23 classroom building, a 10 room annex housing the primary department, a vacational building, a physical education center, a cafeteria and a south campus elementary building. 3. An active Alumni Association with branches in New York City and Brooklyn, New York, Baltimore, Maryland, Washington, D.C., Raleigh and Smithfield, North Carolina

4. Physical Education Department which sponsors Intramural and Interscholastic competition.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

1. The volumes in the library increased from 350 in 1922 to a book collection

2. The teachers of Home Economics have become the connecting link between the school and the home where the girls do their practice work as homemakers.

3. Our graduates are represented in the leading colleges of the nation and at work as teachers, ministers, doctors, mechanics, morticians, nurses, cosmetologist, and government workers. Locally, we maintain fine inter-racial relationship.

4. Once a year at commencement, the school has adopted the practice of presenting awards to members of the Alumni Association who have in some way excelled their positions. This Honoray Achievement Award has been presented continuously since 1945.

CUR PHILOSOPHY:

We believe in the democratic way of life, and education is the best device for perpetuating this way of living. Growth in democracy is predicted on action, thus every person is provided with the opportunity to participate in activities which are designed for the fullest development of the individual and improving society. Since curriculum planning must originate with the school and include the community, it is necessary that pupils, teachers and parents cooperate to their fullest extent in shaping the educational program to fit individuals for complete living.

We believe that human relations constitute the greatest challenge to man -his ability to get along with one another and that it is the responsibility of the school to provide extensive opportunities for pupils' experiences in sharing and working together. We further believe that education will produce a selfreliant individual who is mentally and physically healthy; conscious of the problems which concern social groups, interested in solving these problems; poised in his contact with others; and appreciative of the finer things of life.

SCHOOL LOCATION:

Johnston Central High School is located in the Eastern part of the Town of Smithfield in the well known residential section called Belmont.

The school plant occupies a partial square. The main entrance is on East Massey Street. It is bound on the East by Durham Street, on the South by Harris Street, on the West by Collier Street, approximately five hundred yards from the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad Station.



We can not express our gratitude to our principal Mr. J. F. McNeill for giving us permission for this great expedition.


