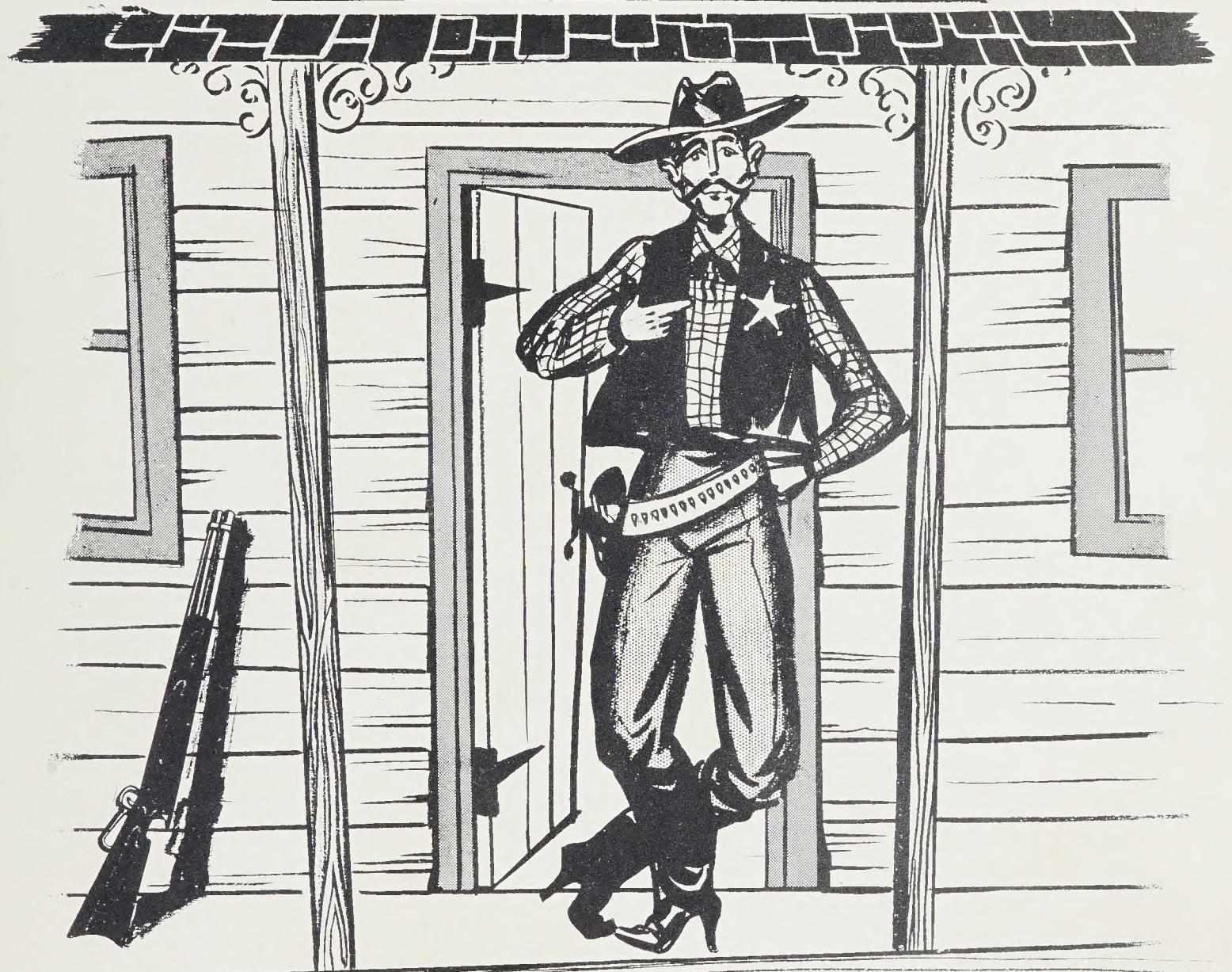
Billy Welch

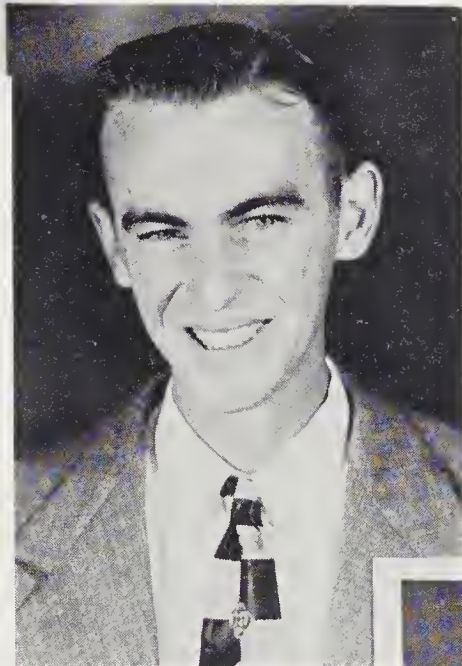

We had "hide out class" in the tenth grade and listened to Mr. Schibor teach Spanish.

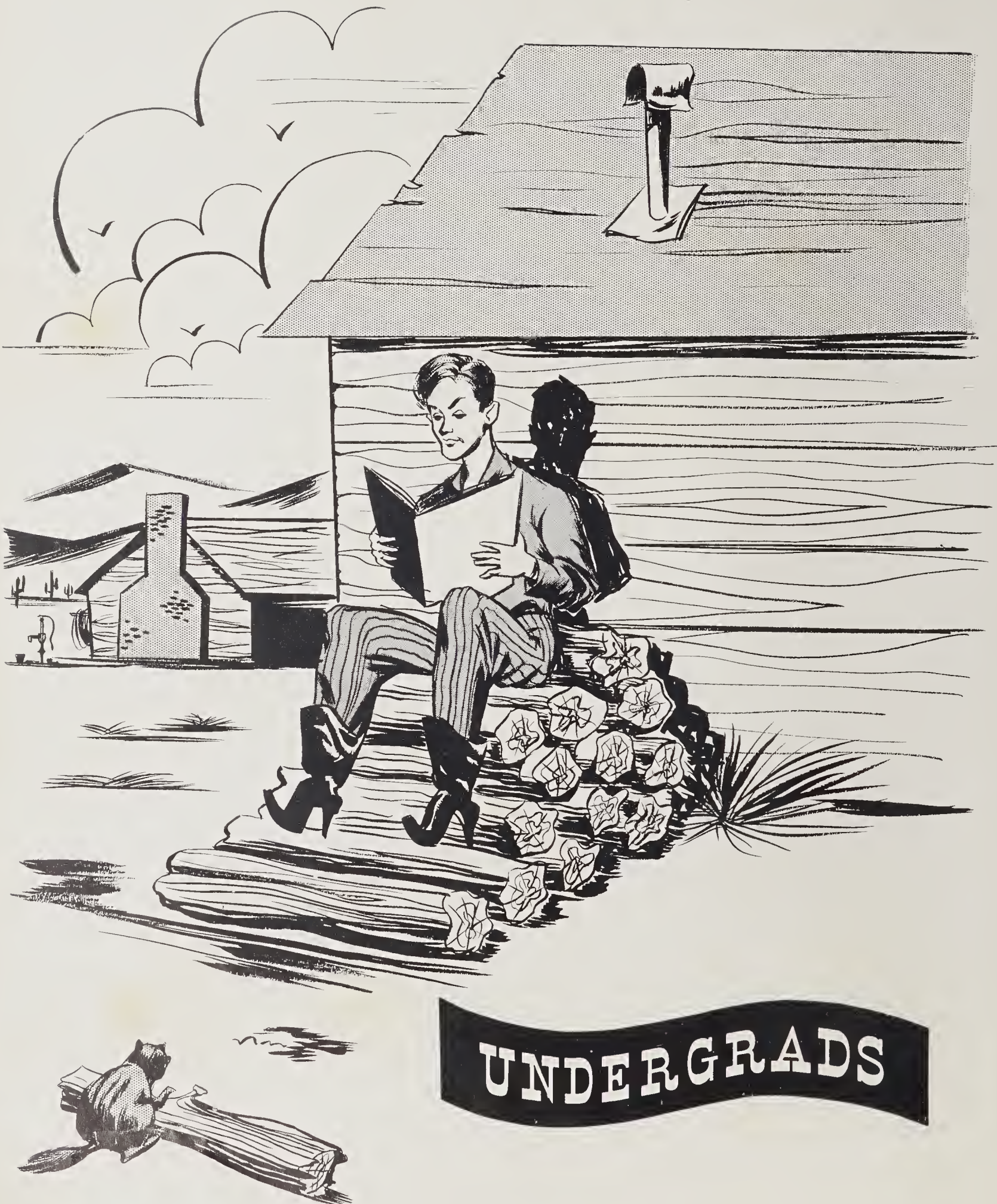
