



The Academy was the first building to occupy the present school site, and the third to be used as a school building. It followed the Throneburg School and was built shortly before 1900 by "Northern ladies"-Mrs. Sarah Rand, Miss Carrie Rand, and a Mrs. Tuttle. The first floor was used for the classrooms and the auditorium; the second, as living quarters for the boarding students and the teachers. The school served, roughly, the district it does at present. The entire course of study was equivalent to the completion of the eighth grade today. One "graduated" when he was able to score 98 on all the subjects. Box Suppers were held frequently for the purpose of raising operating funds.



This was Hudson's first brick building and the fourth "school house" to serve the community. It replaced the Academy which was torn down in 1912. The life of this building was only thirteen years. One of the walls cracked and it was condemned by the authorities. Classes were held in a local church until the new quarters were ready. The first pupils to be transported by a "school conveyance" attended this school. The first such transportation was a wagon; this was followed by a Ford truck equipped with curtains. Pupils came from as far away as Burke County. One of the early principals was Mr. J. F. Goodrich from the state of Michigan.

This modern one-story brick building replaced the "Dome" building in 1925 and became the fifth school structure. A special feature of this building was the courtyard, which was an uncovered space surrounded on four sides by classrooms. The auditorium occupied a prominent place near the center of the building. In the fall of 1940, this building was destroyed by fire. Immediately, construction was begun on a replacement; but in February, 1942, just weeks before it was to be occupied, it, too, was razed by fire. Students continued to gather at Hudson each morning, then board assigned school buses for Granite Falls, Sawmills, Whitnel, and Davenport College in Lenoir. Two senior classes graduated "away from home."





This sixth building replaced those lost by fire and was occupied in the spring of 1943. It is an exact duplicate of the second building that burned. Currently, it houses grades one, two, three, seven, eight, and nine. In 1949, a lunchroom and an auditorium were added. There are twenty-five classrooms, a lounge, and the principal's office. This is Hudson's first school building to be constructed with "fire walls." For ten years, all grades were located on the two floors and in the basement of this structure; however, enrollment increased, and the need for more room was inevitable.

Hudson's seventh school building, with its eleven rooms, is currently housing the fourth, fifth, and sixth grades. It was occupied in January, 1952, and is still considered "modern" even by present standards. The first tiled floors and pastel walls in Hudson's buildings appeared in this addition. It stands between the teacherage and the 1943 structure. These two buildings, located on a six acre tract, comprise the present elementary school. Because every foot of available space is taken up by buildings and playgrounds, it became necessary to find a new location for the erection of a senior high building. A sixty-six acre tract on the Lenoir-Hickory by-pass was secured, and plans were made for further expansion.
