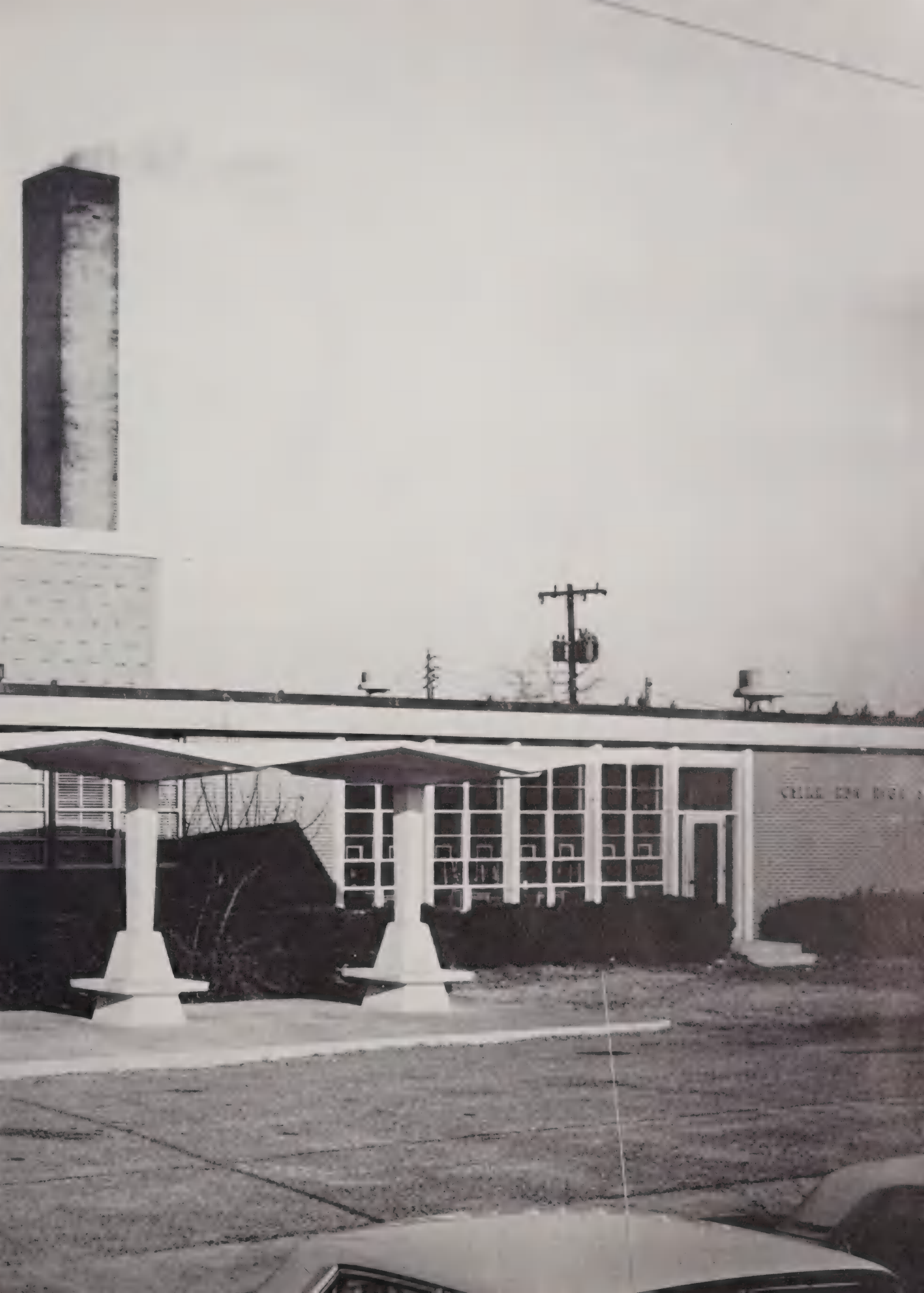

May success crown your efforts as you go forth lighting candles in the dark, so that, others may also see.

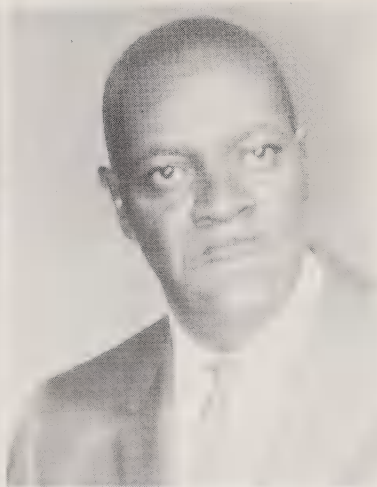
