How do you choose your music?
"You really couldn't type the music we sing. It's very diverse- a lot of older tunes, a lot of swing, and dowop. It's filtered in with some more modern stuff and ballads, gospel- some of the more contemporary stuff. All of our tunes though, for the most part, are arranged and conducted by Duke's Men ourselves or Duke's alumni. So the musical creation of the group is really self-perpetuating.'

"That's a good question. I suppose it is- I know how cliche this is going to sound!- the guys in the group. I mean we sing some really nice music and we tell a lot of funny jokes, but it's the same thing over and over again and it would get boring if it weren't for the group. We spend an awful lot of time together, but fortunately we come together and we have a great vanety. It's a great bunch of guys."

## Mark Russell



"My two favorite things about Jesse Helms," Russell boomed, "are that he is colorful and he is not my senator!"
Mark Russell, the piano-playing political comedian of PBS fame, had clearly done his homework for the Winston-Salem crowd that gathered in Wait Chapel on Friday, March 22. The audience delighted in the way Russell personalized his show for North Carolina fans, including jokes about toxic waste, Piedmont Airlines, Ross Johnson, and of course Senator Helms.
Russell entertained for more than an hour with his unique blend of political satire and musical compositions. In between jokes about the Gulf War, Gorbachev, and the S\&L crisis, Russell crooned original songs about Schwarzkopf, taxes, and the 1992 Democratic presidential nominee.

Before signing on with PBS in 1975, Russell worked with local radio and television stations in Washington, D.C. His first job was straight piano playing at Washington's Shoreham Hotel, where he added jokes and songs to his repertoire. His act was so popular that he remained at the Shoreham for 20 years.
"I got into politics only because of the physical location of that hotel," Russell said. "If it had been Detroit, I would have done jokes about the automobile business. If it had been Winston-Salem, I'd have been the official tobacco comedian."
"It's a boring story," he said, "because I would rather tell a journalist, 'Well, I worked for a senator and I didn't like what I saw, and I thought with my little piano I'll change things.' but it wasn't like that."

It seems that there aren't any political situations that Russell can't make humorous, but he said that the Gulf War was hard to handle. Especially on the night of January 16:
"The night the war started was opening night at Ford's Theater in Washington. We thought to ourselves, should we cancel? We don't want to appear insensitive here. But people didn't turn in their tickets... they trusted me."

Russell said that when he walked on stage, he was really nervous.
"I said, 'There is only one thing we are thinking about tonight. One topic about which we are so obsessed. Sould Pete Rose go to the Baseball Hall of Fame?' And I just went on from there and it was fine."

Just as sure as politics will continue to occupy Americans' minds, Russell will continue to add humor to difficult national situations. After a few laughs with Mark Russell, politics doesn't seem so serious after all.

"Just two hours ago, Allied forces began an attack on military targets in Iraq and Kuwait These attacks continue as I speak. .. This conflict started August second when the dictator of Iraq invaded a small and helpless neighbor Kuwait. a member of the Arab League, and a member of the United Nations was crushed, its people brutalized. Five months ago Saddam Hussein started this cruel war against Kuwait. Tonight the battle has been joined .. Now,the twenty-eight countries with forces in the Gulf area have exhausted all reasonable efforts to reach a peaceful resolution, and have no choice but to drive Saddam from Kuwait by force. We will not fail. ... Our objectives are clear.
Saddam Hussen's forces will leave Kuwait. The legitimate govermment of Kuwait will be restored to its rightful place, and Kuwait will once again be free.... Some may ask, why act now, why not wait? The answer is clear The world could wait no longer. Sanctions, were tried for well over five months and we and our allies concluded that sanctions alone would not fcrce Saddam from Kuwait.
While the world waited. Saddam Hussein systematically raped, pillaged, and plundered a tiny nation, no threat to his own. He subjected the people of Kuwait to unspeakable atrocities and among those, maimed and murdered innocent children.

While the world waited, Saddam sought to add to the chemical weapons arsenal he now possessed, an infinitely more dangerous weapon of mass destruction, a nuclear weapon.

And, while the world waited, while the world talked peace and withdrawal. Saddam Hussein dug in and moved massive forces into Kuwait.
While the world waited, while Saddam stalled, more domage was being done to the fragile economies of the third world and the emerging democracies of East Europe.
While the world waited, Saddam Hussein met every overture of peace with open contempt.
While the world prayed for peace, Saddam prepared for war.

This is an historic moment. .. We have before us the oportunity to forge for ourselves and for future generations a new world order where the rule of law ... governs the conduct of nations, ... an order in which a credible United Nations can use its peacekeeping role to fulfill the promise and vision of the United Nations's founders. We have no argument with the people of Iraq. Indeed, for the innocents caught in this conflict, I pray for their safety. Our goal is not the conquest of Iraq. it is the liberation of Kuwait. ... But even as planes of the multinational forces attack lraq. I prefer to think of peace, not war. I am convinced, not only that we will prevail, but that out of the horror of combat, will come the recognition that no nation can stand against a world united."

"The Nicaraguan people have shown that they want to live in democracy, in peace and in freedom," Mrs. Chamorro told more than 1.000 cheering supporters at her election headquarters on February 26, 1990.

June 26 the U.S. Senate rejected a constitutional amendment against flag buming with critics arguing that it was already dead and being debated largely as ammunition for use against them at election time. ## A Gathering Together

On Tuesday, September 11, the rituals of Wake Forest University were renewed at the traditional Opening Convocation. As we headed into our one hundred and fifty sixth academic session, Ed Christman asked those present to help and aid any person that might not have ever experienced hope. This request set the tone for the duration of the ceremony, as each individual recognized or installed that day was a perfect representation of hope and that desire to help others.

Weston P. Hatfield, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, installed David G. Brown as Provost. As Provost, Dr. Brown will be called upon to direct the faculty. He has "a zest for dealing with change" and will become integral to Wake Forest as a national academic institution. Along with this presentation, both the Honor Council and the Judicial Board were installed, as each member promised to work to the best of his or her ability in such leadership roles.

The Jon Reinhardt Award for Distinguished Teaching was presented to Carl Everest, former Professor Emeritus of Classical Languages. His years of dedication span from 1956 to 1989.

Finally, President Hearn introduced the speaker, John G. Medlin, President, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of the First Wachovia Corporation. His address entitled "The Importance of Studies in the Humanities to Prepare for a World Undergoing Fundamental Change" emphasized that to succeed in the world of the Nineties, a liberal arts education, such as the one offered here at Wake Forest, is essential. In order that the US maintain its position as the main "economic engine and peace maker" in international affairs, the students of today must take hold of the challenges and opportunities awarded to them.

The Deacons had an overall good season. Five of the conferences losses were by seven or less points. They played several nationally ranked teams in conference, including number 1 ranked Virginia.

The Lady Deacons aren't looking back, but to a new season. The Lady Deacons return 8 players in 1991-92, including Beth Davis and freshman Nicole Levesque.

## What a Season!

The Wake Forest Deacon Men's basketball team had a strong season with a 19-11 record and an 8-6 record in conference. This was the best season the Deacons have had since 1984. The Deacons had a third place finish in the ACC and earned a bid to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in seven years.
The Deacons played well throughout the season, but moved for the top in January with a 21 point victory over NCSU in WinstonSalem. Freshman standout Rodney Rogers led the Deacons in points and rebounds.
The Deacons continued to do
damage in the ACC in February when they won back to back victories over Georgia Tech and Virginia, Feb. 9th and 10th. The Deacons, led by Freshman Randolph Childress with 28 points, defeated Tech 86-74. Then 24 hours later, once again under the leadership of Childress and Rogers, the Deacons beat UVA 7466. Phil Medlin said, "It was great but we aren't looking back. We are losing only four seniors. We'll be better next year. We won't be as young."

Then less than a week later, the Deacons manhandled number five nationally ranked Duke, 86-77. Duke only led one time in the game. Anthony Tucker led the team with 31 points and 11 rebounds. Tucker said, "lt was great to score 31 points, but it was a total team effort.'
The Deacons next victory came over Clemson. The Deacons destroyed the Tigers 81-55.
The team's last regular season conference game was in Raleigh against NCSU. The Deacons won 89-84 and handed NCSU its first loss in Reynolds Gym in 1990-91. The Deacons were led by Rogers and Chris King. This second victory over NCSU gave the Deacons a third place ACC finish and guar-
anteed a NCAA bid to the Deacons. Derrick McQueen said, "It was a very big game for us. We took out the crowd. Our guys went in and stayed focused for $40 \mathrm{~min}-$ utes and stayed in the game plan."

The Deacons were voted 5 th seed in the Southeast in the NCAA. They faced La. Tech in the first round and with the leadership of Childress, C. King, and McQueen defeated them 71-65. Next the Deacons faced Alabama. Despite King's 29 points and Rogers 12 rebounds the Deacons lost 88-96.

The Deacons are looking for great things next year. They return 12 players under the leadership of Coach Odom, the ACC Coach of the Year.

Wake Forest had their ups and downs on the grid iron this season but continued in Deacon pride and spirit. The Deacons opened the season with a 33-17 loss to Rice. The Deacons fell behind early, but scored two touchdowns in the second half to make it close. Coach Bill Dooley said, "I have to give Rice credit. They mixed up their offense well.'
In the home opener against Appalachian State the Deacon defense forced four turnovers and held the A.S.U. offense to 259 yards of total offense. Tony Rogers and Anthony Williams each ran for a touchdown, while placekicker Wayne Tollison kicked a school re-

Coach Faircloth said, "Everybody played well againsi Army and we got them on a good day.
A home town crowd gathered in Groves Stadium to watch as the Deacons played their arch-rivals, UNC. The Deacon offense was only able to generate 126 yards in the second half, as Wake Forest came up short, 31-24.
The Deacons next travelled to Maryland to take on the Terrapins.

Anthony Williams returned a Maryland kickoff 98 yards to set up a Deacon touchdown shortly before the start of the fourth quarter. Yet it was too little too late, as the Terps walked away with 41-13 victory.

The Deacons put up a tremendous first half fight against the newly crowned number-one ranked Virginia Cavaliers. With three minutes left in the first half UVA scored 14 unanswered points. The Deacons lost to the Cavaliers 49-14.

The Deacons next encounter was with the Clemson Tigers. The nation's third ranked defense

The Deacons then travelled to Durham to take on the Duke Blue Devils. Duke rushed for 294 yards on 46 attempts. They compiled 500 total offensive yards and glided to an easy 57-20 victory. Coach Dooley said, "We made too many mental errors...We took an old fashioned whipping today. It was embarrassing.

## Colothon

Volume 89 of the Wake Forest University Howler was published by the Hunter Division of Jostens Printing and Publishing in Winston Salem, North Carolina. The trim size of the 1991 Howler is 9 by 12 and contains 336 pages. The book was printed using the offset lithography process with $100 \%$ black ink.
The 1991 Howler is smythesewn with 160 point binder boards and headbands. The cover is number 499 - Nighthawk with a Spanish Grain. The cover lettering is hot foil stamped silver. The black artwork is lithographed.
All color transparencies were laser scanned using 150 line screen for individual reproduction. Color transparencies and prints were processed and printed at Talton Professional Photofinishing of Winston-Salem, North Carolina. With the exception of student contribution section at the end of the book, all photos were provided by the Publications Board Photography Staff using Fujichrome and Ektachrome film.

All black and white photographs were individually reproduced using a 150 line screen. Student portraits were photographed and processed by University Portraits of Raleigh, North Carolina.
The 1991 Howler contains 64 pages of four color processing, 1 page (opening) with spot color chosen from the Pantone Color Matching System.
Typestyles vary from section to section. The overall typestyle was souvenir light. The cover and division pages used Mistral typestyle. Point sizes also varied, generally body copy was 10 pt, headlines 36 pt and captions 8 pt .
The Howler staff was allotted $\$ 60,400$ from the Student Budget Advisory Committee for the publishing of the 1991 Howler and maintenance of the Howler office. All expenses incurred which exceeded the budgeted amount were paid from incoming revenue from the portrait commissions and advertisement sales. All advertisements were sold and managed through Academic Periodicals of Marietta, Georgia.
The 1991 Howler has a press run of 2750 copies with a contracted delivery date of August 26, 1991. There is no charge per book for students. The 1991 Howler was prepared by a volunteer staff selected through an application process. Section Editor positions were filled by an application process and through interviews. The 1990 Student Publications Board elected the 1991 Howler Editor in Chief to serve in that position.
