At the beginning of the year we chose the class officers. They were:



Our gradeparents for the year are Mrs. J. E. Isley and Mr. C. S. Laughlin.


Everyone in our class except two belongs to the Glee Club, and many of them are entering the "Recitation-Declamation" Contest.







We had a hard struggle through Algebra with Mr. Barker to help us, and enjoyed "Julius Caesar" when Miss Cates told us about it.



During the year, we presented two chapel programs and when the Glee Club was organized, all our musical minded crew fell in to singing and from reports, it sounds very pretty.



We're all looking forward to being a big class of Juniors next year.





A number of our boys and girls went out for basketball this year and some of them won a suit and some even made the first team.


Our class went to court on Monday, April 29th, as a part of our civics studies. We heard some very interesting cases but we did not get to stay until the court adjourned.





During this time we were glad to welcome to our room June Carol Jobe, who returned to us from Graham and a new boy, S. J. Moore, who came from Alexander-Wilson.


We entered Janice Thompson and Barbara Ann Smith in a beauty contest at the school carnival. Barbara Ann received the most votes.

We are now looking forward to next year and entering high school.







The boys got off to a pretty good start this year. We hoped, as in past years, to land on top, but did not quite make it. We made a fairly nice showing as the following scores prove:





The girls' basketball team did not enjoy a very successful season this year but we went into it with a determination to do the best we could.


We thank Miss Porterfield for unlimited patience in helping us to reach a higher goal. We also wish to express our appreciation to Carson Leach for helping us so much.







THE 4H-CLUB


The Haw River 4H Club has had a successful year under the direction of Mrs. Strickland and Mr. Bason.

We held our meetings on the first Wednesday of each month and followed the program material provided by our directors.



The members have been greatly helped as they have tried to practice the true principles of good 4H Club members.


