On Friday April 1, at 7:30 we gave our Senior Class play " All On Account of Polly". The play was a success and we made a reasonable profit on it.

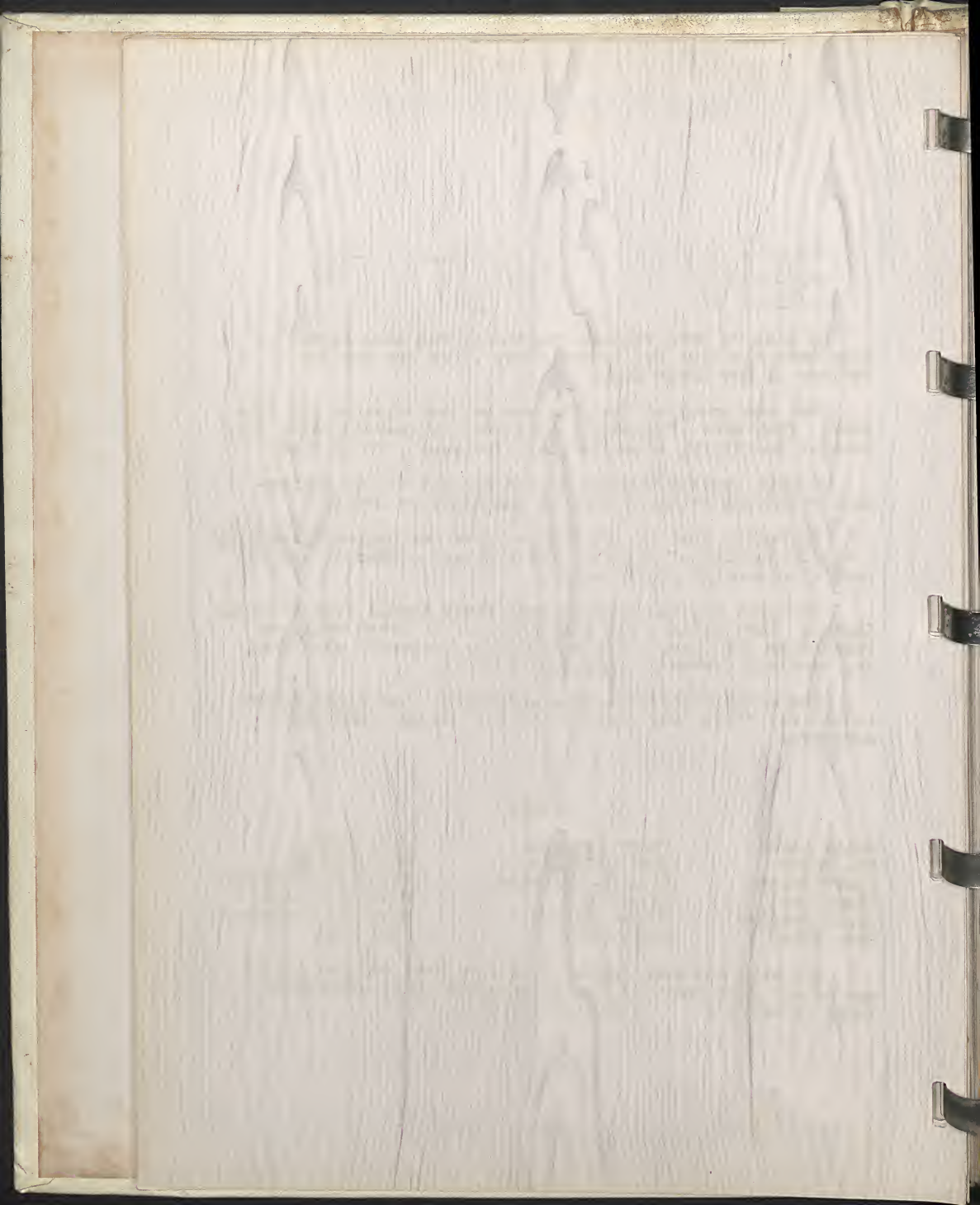

I think that everyone that reads this agrees with me, that we have had an enjoyable year, and we're all looking toward that great goal-----DIGNIFIED SENIORS.

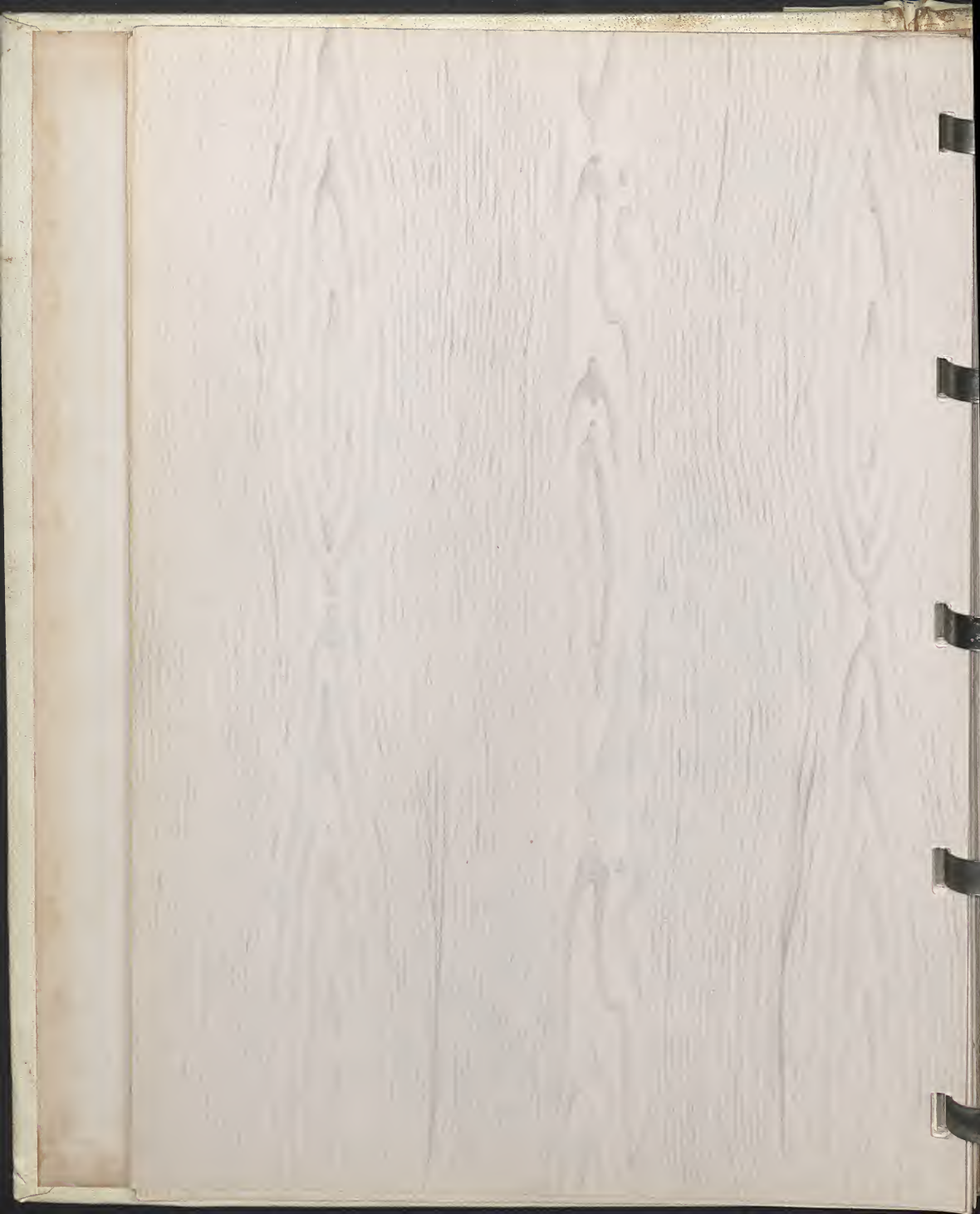

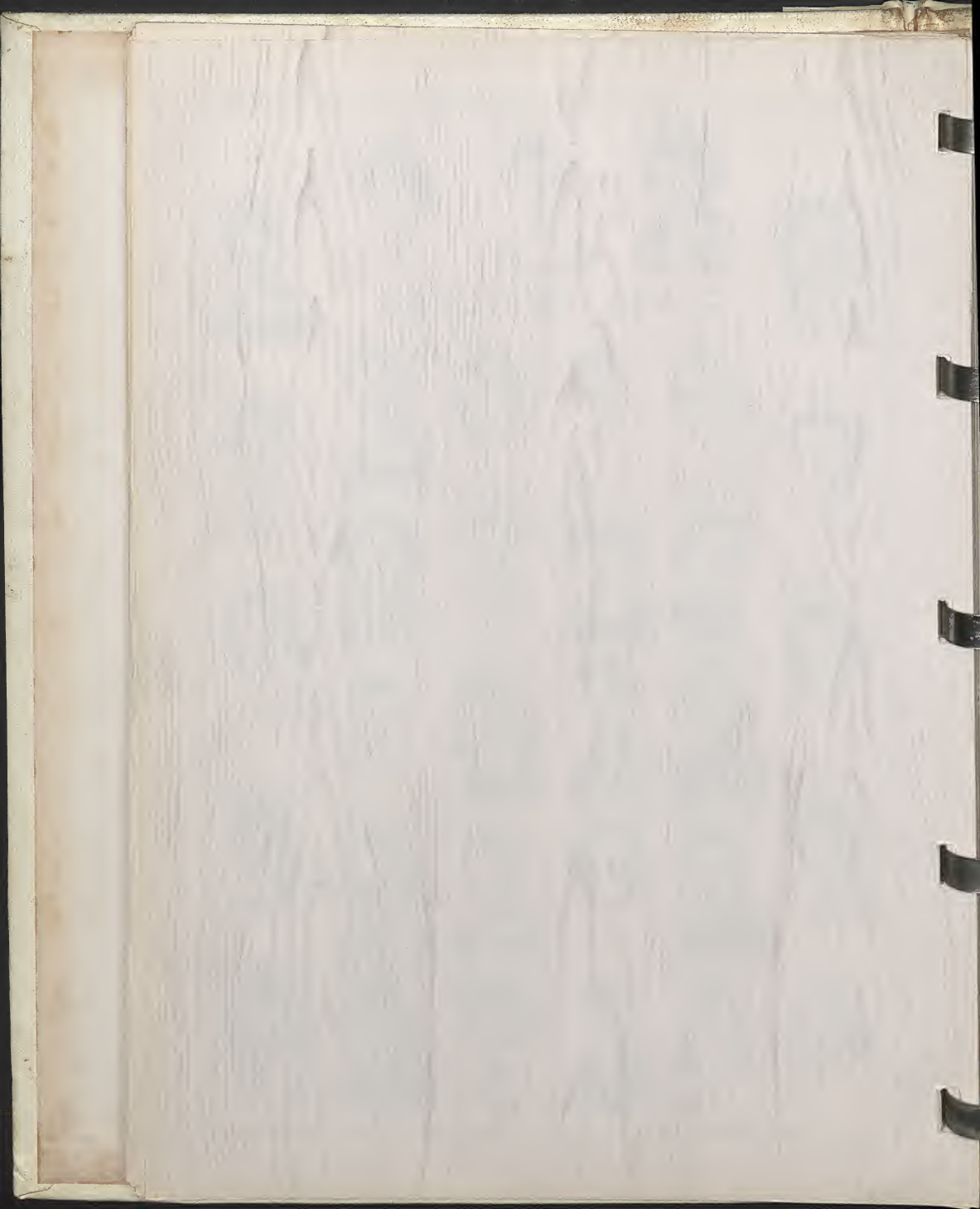

The semi-formal Christmas Prom was sponsored by our . . . class. It was the first program of its kind to be given at our school, everyone is looking forward to more such programs.

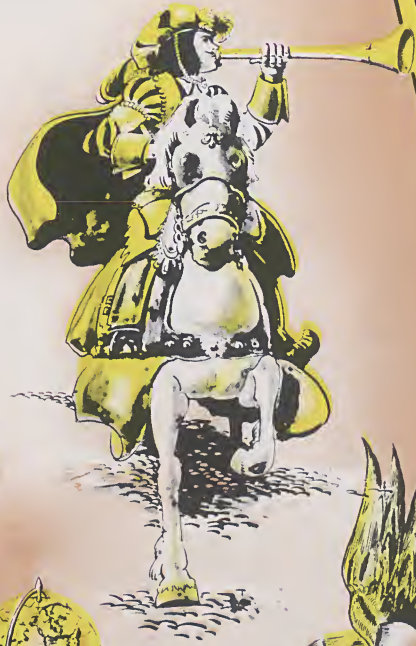

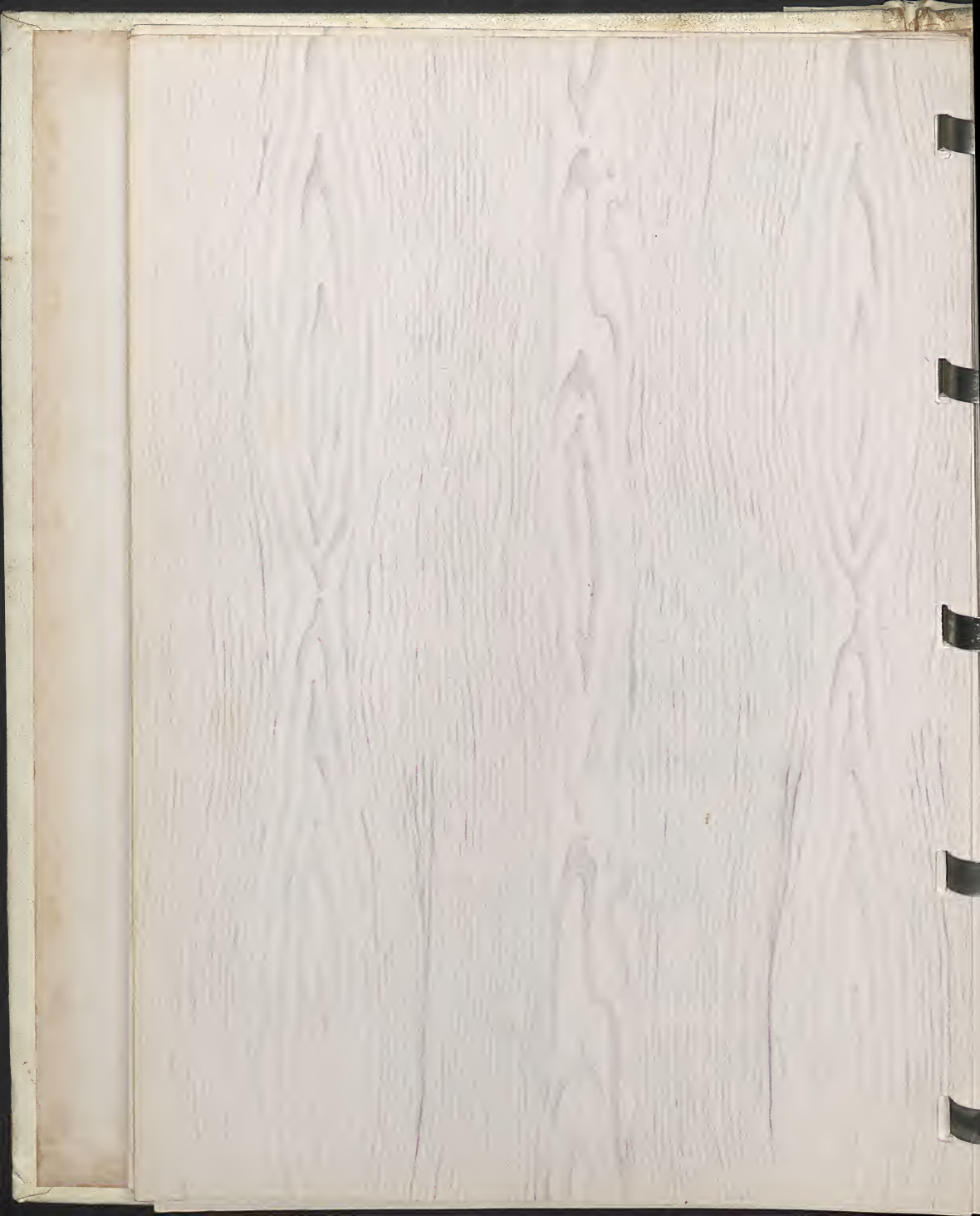

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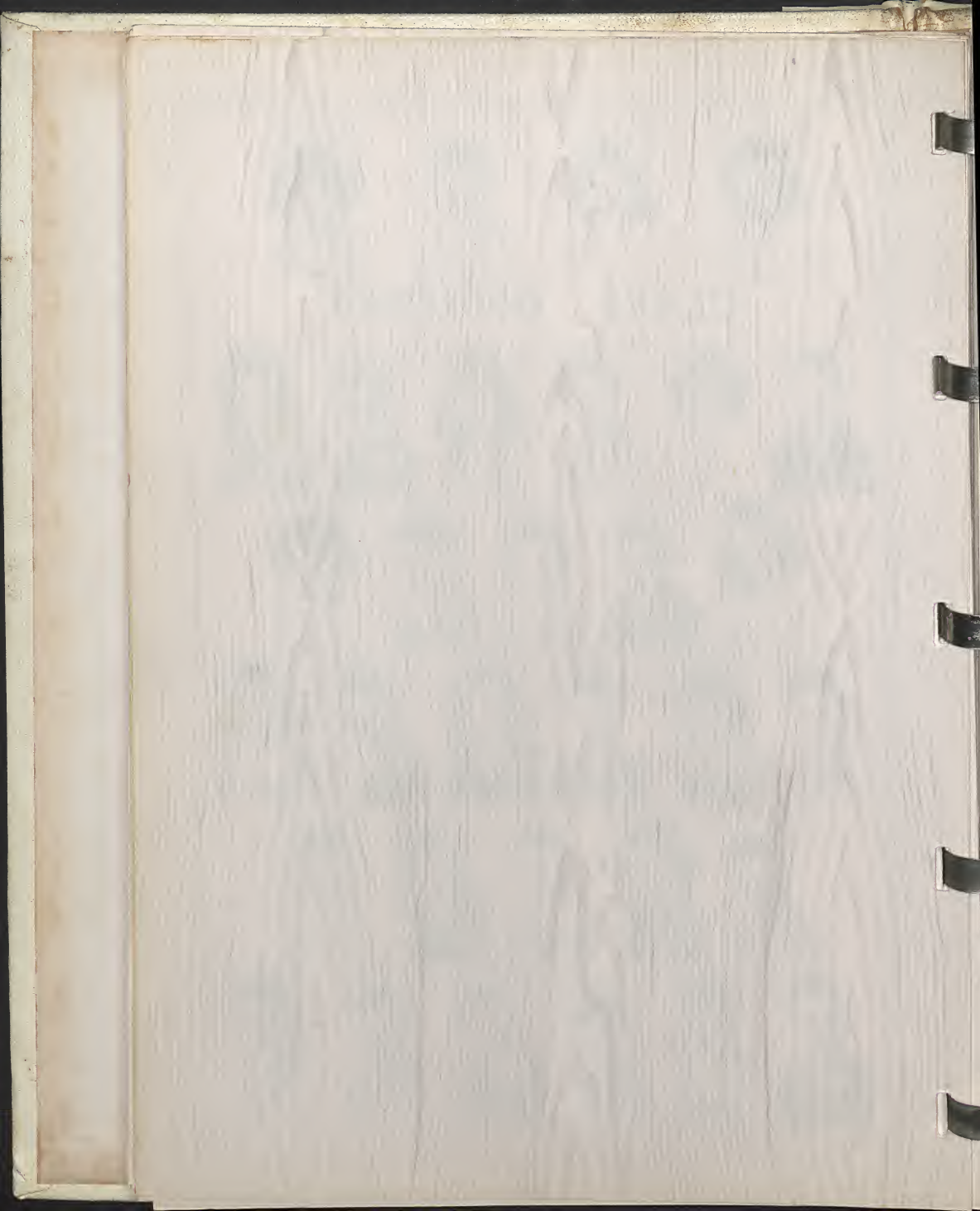

We had very much trouble selecting our Grademother, but finally settled on Mrs. J.L. May.

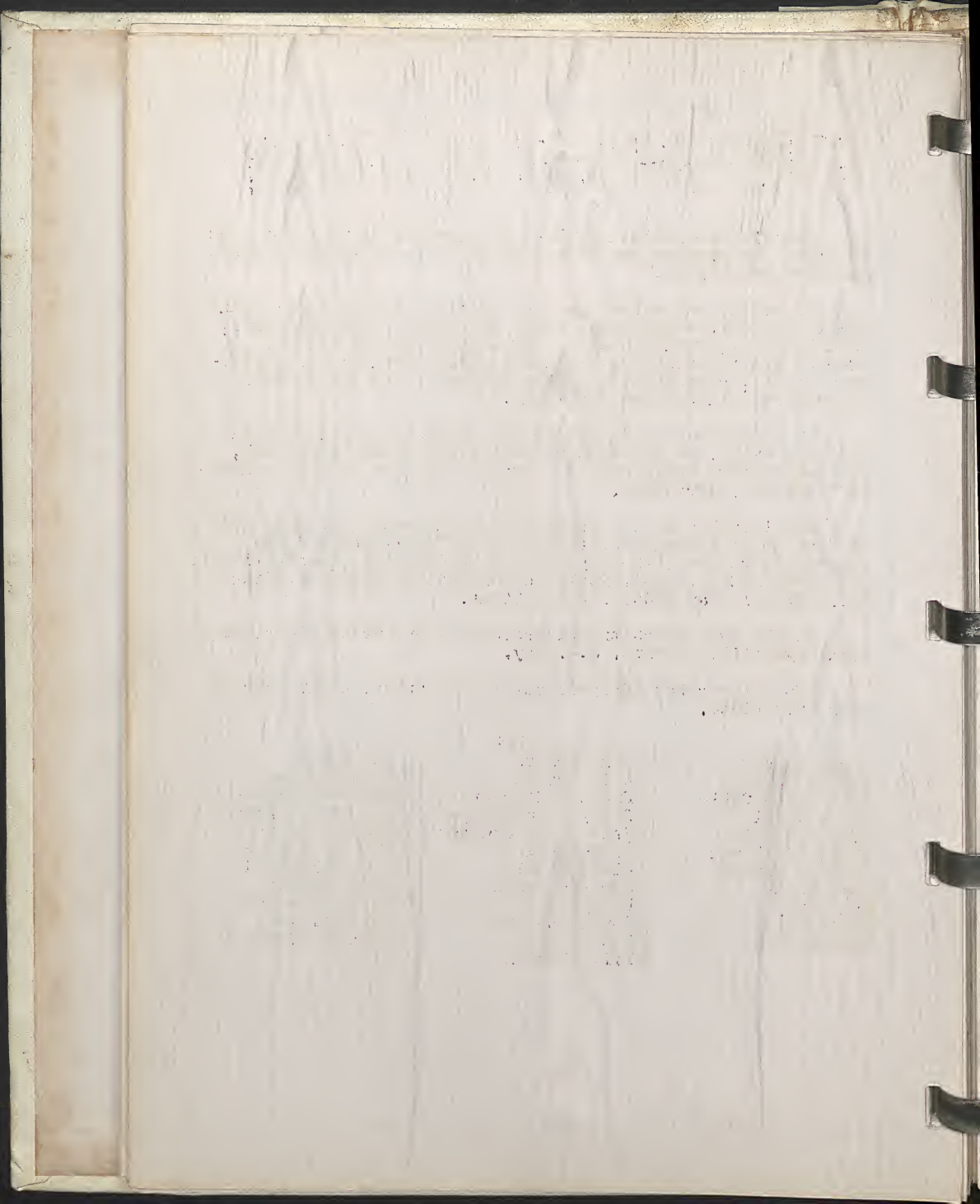

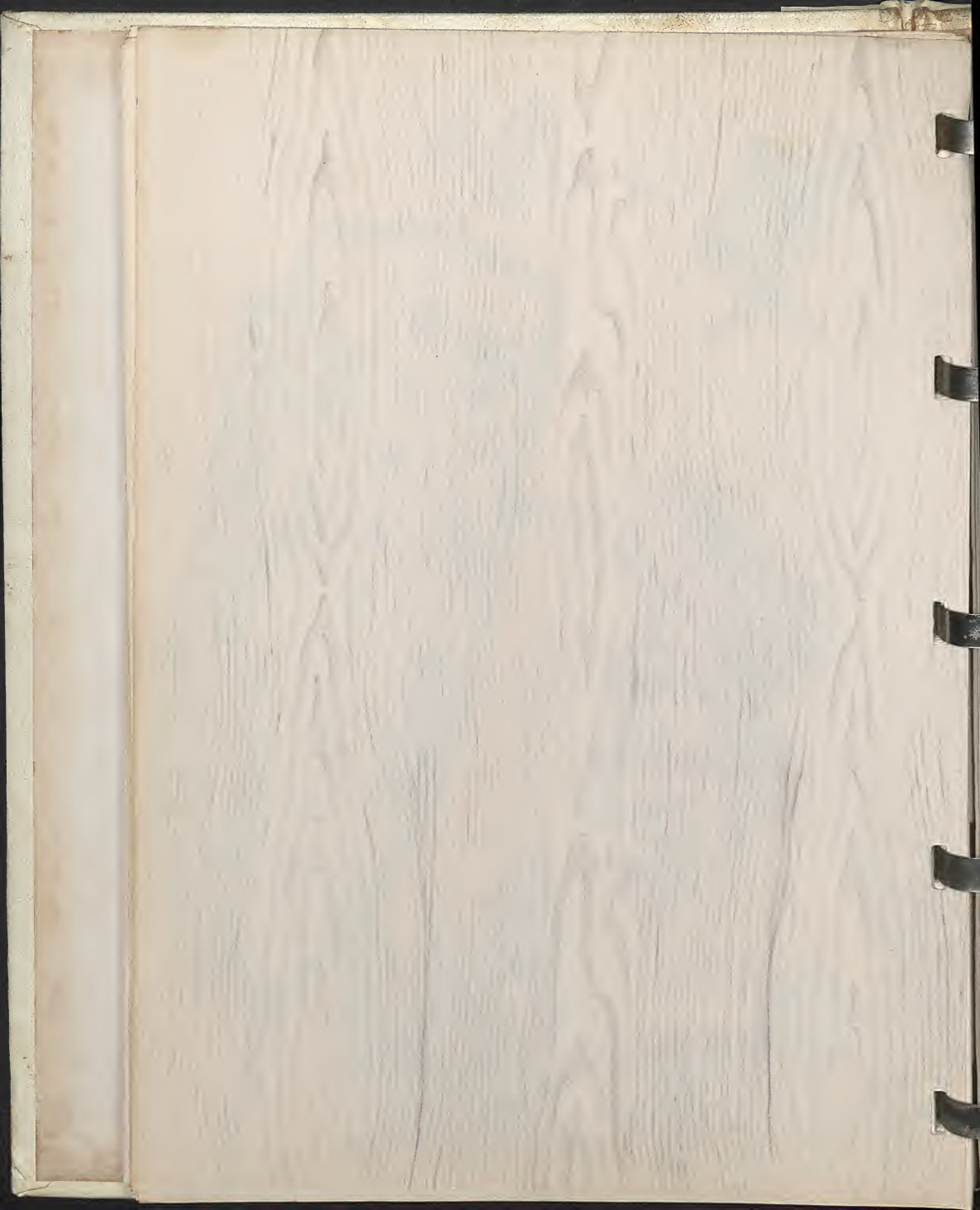

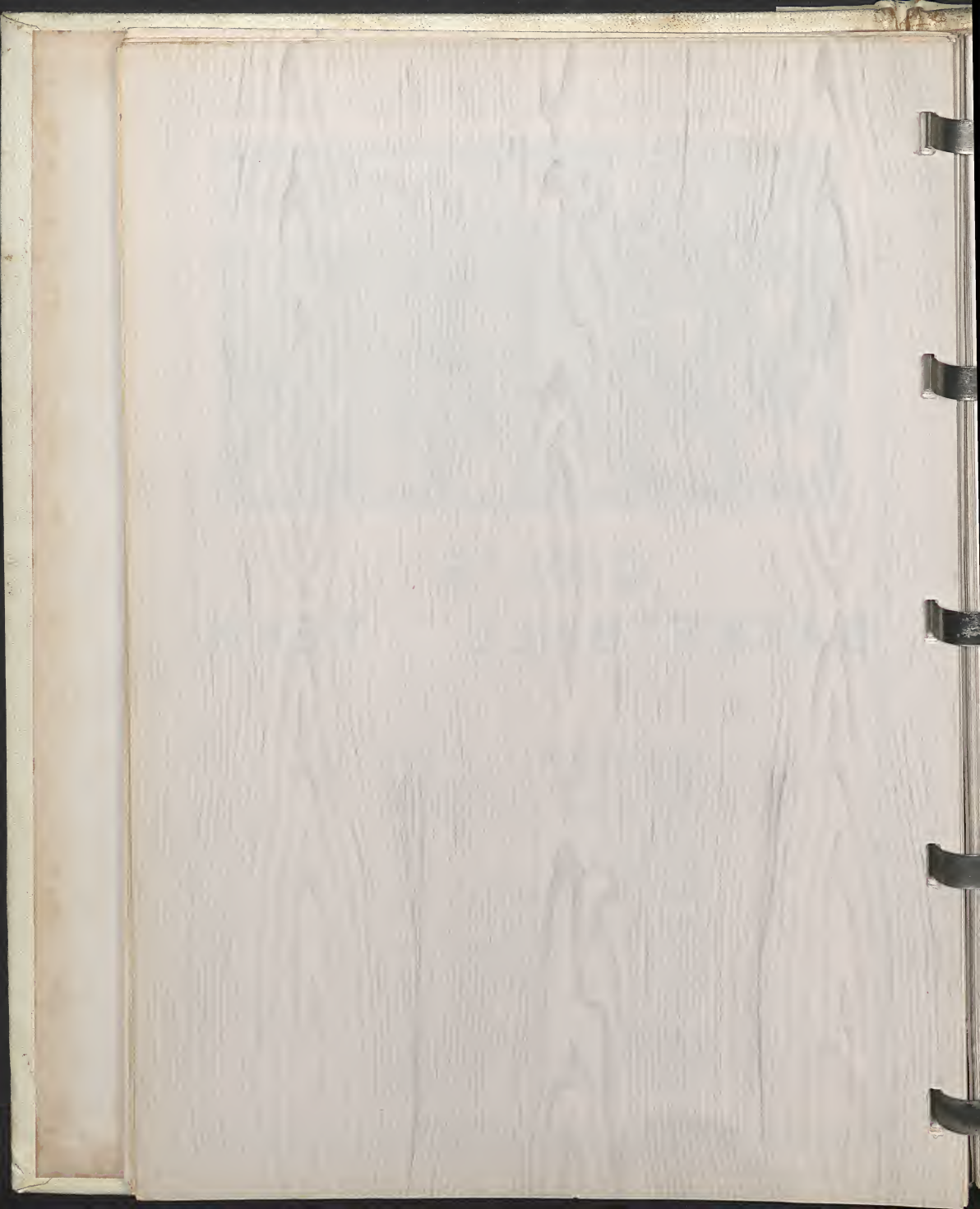

GIRL'S BASKETBALL

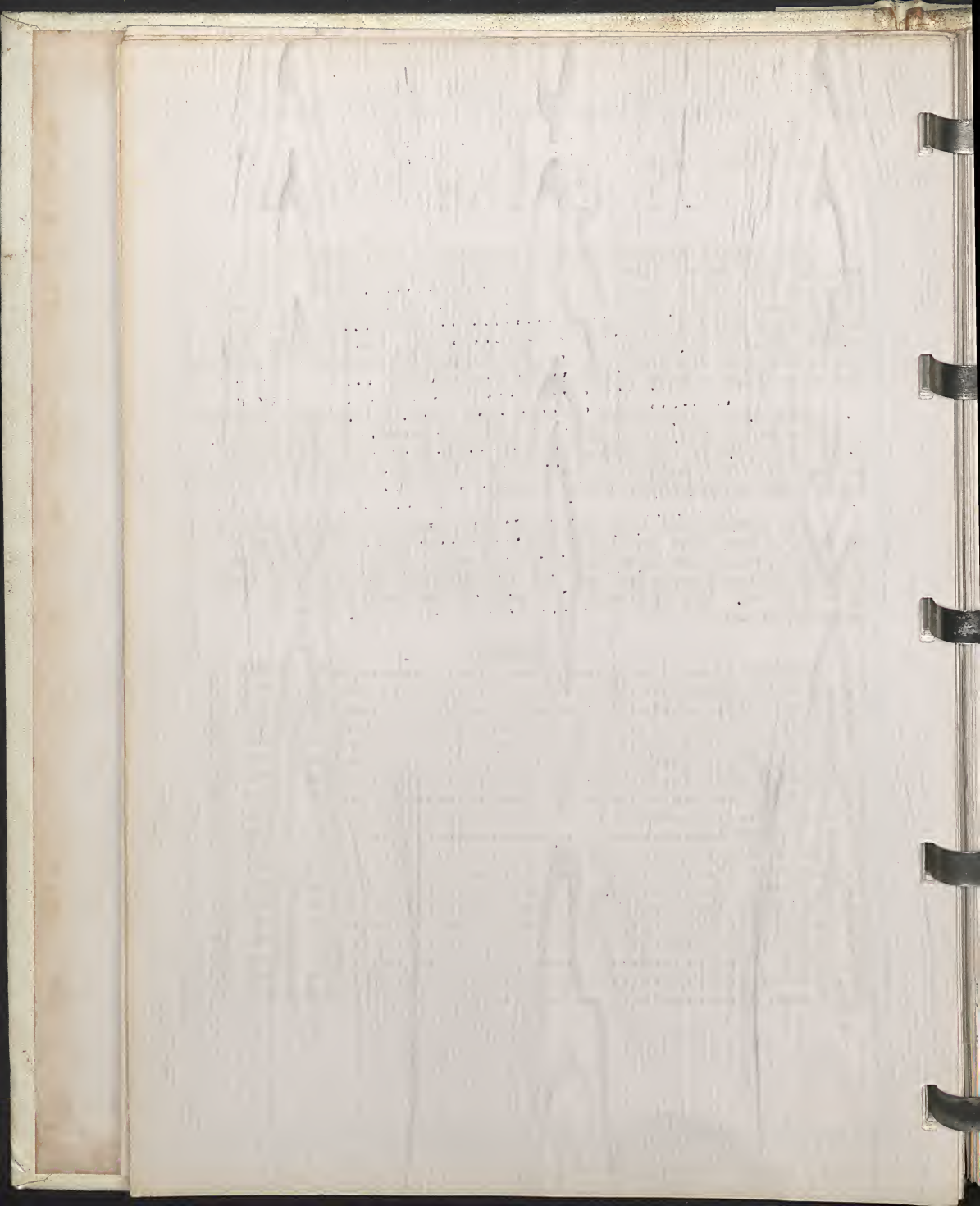
