## OUR PRINCIPAL



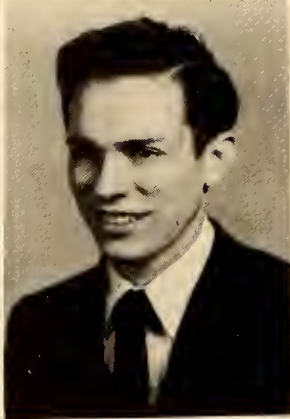
Readers will do well to remember that each annual edition of the Indian Echo is far more than merely a collection of high school photographs and a list of high school names.
