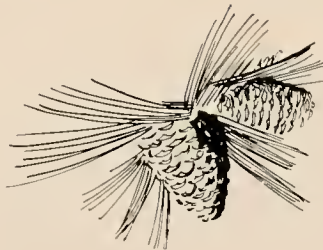
## **THE COLLEGE BAND**

## THE LIBRARY

The Pembroke State College Library has a Book Collection of 14,510 volumes. The College Library receives around 127 weekly or monthly magazines through purchase or gift and six daily or weekly newspapers. At present, the Library is about to outgrow the stack room added within the past two years. The problem now is where can the new books be placed until the library quarters in the new Administration Building are completed.

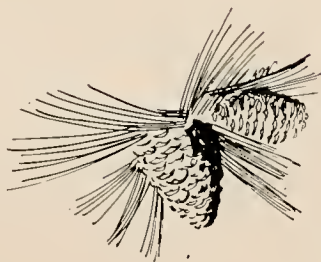

This is the first year that football has really gotten underway at P.S.C. The squad made a much better showing than the scores indicated, and the boys are to be congratulated for their fine work.

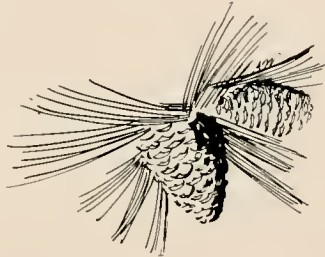

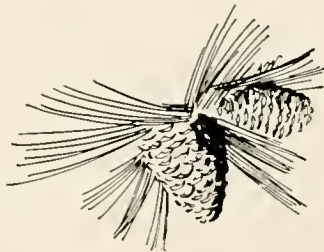

## **BASKETBALL**

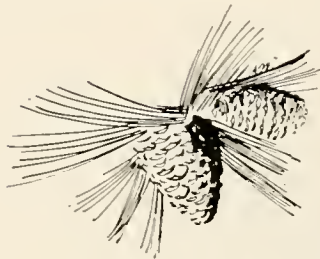

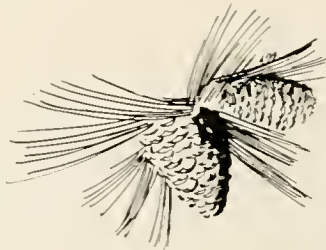

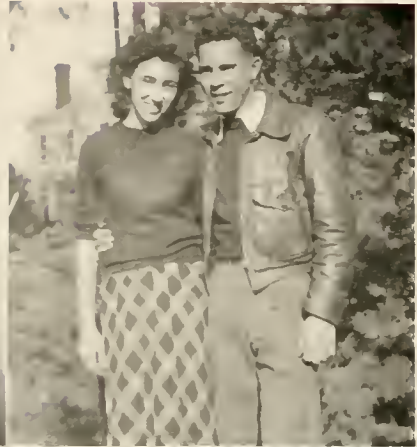
It contains dressing rooms, showers, and lockers, for men and women. All the Indian High Schools of the County hold an Annual Basketball Tournament in the Gym.

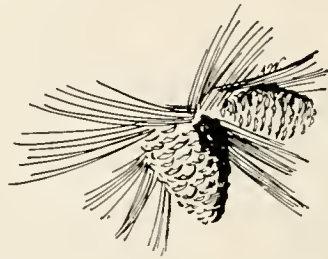

## FINE ARTS

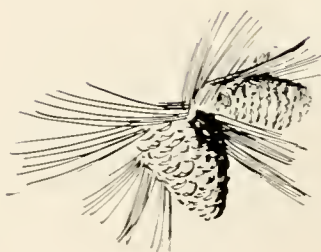

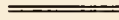
