








Wayne Community College







History

Wayne Community College was established as Goldsboro Industrial Education Center in 1957. The 1962-63 school year was the first year in which programs leading to diplomas in automotive mechanics, electronics, drafting and practical nursing were taught. The year began with 47 students and eight faculty members. In January, 1964, we became Wayne Technical Institute. By Fall 1966, enrollment had increased to 550 full-time students and more than 1500 part-time students. Before this time a science laboratory and a dental clinic were built. During the year 1966, new classroom buildings and a new wing to the main building were built, thus adding an enlarged library, two laboratories, and a large lecture room. In 1967, the community voted to change the name to Wayne Community College and the enrollment climbed to 600 full-time and 1800 part-time students. Since then, enrollment has climbed to more than 1,000 full-time students and approximately 3.000 part-time students, Before long, we will have another laboratory-classroom building and a new Student Union. Also, we hope to become an accredited institution by the Southern Association of Schools and Colleges.
























The first official Wayne Community College Basketball Team was formed for the 1969-70 season. Thirteen players were selected from a field of forty tryouts. The mighty Bisons captured the North Carolina Eastern Community Thursday, February 19, 1970 by taking a revenge 78-63 top tie disolving showdown win from previous double conquering Sandhills and Stedman. They concluded their loop state with an 11-2 record—and pushed their overall mark to 20-6. We must leave, but the memories from the first exciting victory until the wild, hysterical final moments of the Championship game—will linger forever.



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






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
