



new to be learnt by other nations ; and for all, even for those who are already accustomed to them, they are pretty difficult to write properly. If new accented letters were invented, new difficulties would be encountered, particularly with printers. For an international language to fulfil its function, it must be easily telegraphed, easily written with any typewriter in the world, easily printed, without extra cost, by any printer in the world and in any type whatever (roman, italics, black, small capitals, etc.)! So we notice that only one modern International Language scheme (Dr. Zamenhof's *Esperanto*) is bold enough to employ a series of new letters ç, š, û, etc.). All the others do without them, and rightly so. The present spread of Esperanto might have been ten times greater, had all sympathetic newspapers been able to print without trouble extracts and articles in *Esperanto*.

As to the sounds to be adopted in our language, it would be impossible to confine ourselves to those found in all national languages. If we were to eliminate *r* because it is not found in Chinese, and *z* because it is difficult for Scandinavians, and so on, the balance of available sounds would be so small as to make the language very poor and oblige us to disfigure even the most international words. On the other hand, such sounds or groups of sounds as are unfamiliar to a great number of countries are not suitable and must as far as possible be avoided. Such are, for instance, the rounded front vowels (as in French *pu*, *peu*, *peur*), which are not found in English, Italian, Spanish, Russian, etc. The essential point is to have none but easily-distinguished sounds, and not to make differences in the sense depend on ill-distinguished differences in the sounds. It would evidently be a serious mistake to have at the same time a close and an open *e* (as in F. *chanté* and *chantaïs*)<sup>1</sup> or two *a*'s (as in F. *pâte* and *patte*), or to use differently long and short vowels (as in F. *mâitre* and *mettre*). By avoiding such shades of pronunciation, we can allow a

certain amount of liberty, particularly as regards the pronunciation of the vowels: we must not give such absolute rules as to make them difficult for one nation or another, and the only thing on which we must insist is a sufficient margin between the sounds: *a* must be neither too near *o* nor too near *e*, etc.

The rule of the greatest facility necessarily brings with it the most important principle of *phonetic spelling*, i.e., the principle that a letter must never arbitrarily be given one sound in certain words and another sound in other words. From what precedes, it is clear that the following letters are unquestionably to be adopted, and their value is also obvious: *a* (as in E. *father*) *b d e* (never as in F. *que* or as in E. *me*) *f g* (as in *go*) *h i* (as in E. *machine*) *k l m n o p r s t u* (= E. *oo*) *v z* (as in E.). We still have on hand the following letters of the ordinary alphabet about which there may be doubts: *c j q x y*. On the other hand there are some very common, very easily-pronounced and almost indispensable sounds for which we must find symbols. The initial sound of E. *shah* is represented in E. by *sh*, in F. by *ch*, in D. by *sch*, in I. by *sc(i)*, etc. Since none of the remaining letters can readily be adopted for that sound (*xalo* for *shawl* would jar on everybody except, perhaps, the Portuguese, and *calo* would not be very much better), the obvious thing to do is to use the English *sh*, which is not seriously objectionable to any other nation. Thus we are led to also take *ch* for the sound found in E. *chain* (= *tsh*). For the sound of *y* in *yawl* we might hesitate between *j* as in German, Dutch, and the Scandinavian languages, and *y* as in E., F., and S.; the latter is easier for the greatest number, and leaves us free to use *j* for the voiced fricative corresponding to the voiceless *sh* (E. *s* in *measure*, F. *j* in *jetter*). And since the difference between *zh* and *j* (E. *measure*, *jet*) is rather puzzling to many nations, it is fortunate that we do not require the two distinct sounds: we can let some pronounce *zh* and others *j* while we write it *j*.

Every one is already familiar with the use of *q* pronounced like a *k* before *u*; by its adoption, we get rid of a fair number of *k*'s (an awkward letter to write), with no more danger than to give some nations a temptation to

pronounce *k* instead of *ku* or *kv*. The letter *x* may be considered a convenient, shorthand-like abbreviation. Not only is it extremely easy for all, but it has also this great advantage that it saves us the necessity of choosing between *ks* and *gz*. F. and E. pronounce *ks* in some words and *gz* in others, the two languages not always being in agreement on the same words ; German, Dutch, and the Scandinavian languages always make it *ks*, S. sometimes *ks* and sometimes the back fricative now spelt *j*. The spelling *x* will enable us to make matters easier for all by allowing each individual to pronounce either *ks* or *gz* according to his or her national habits.<sup>1</sup>

The *c* is the most doubtful point of the international alphabet, as its use varies from one language to another in a somewhat capricious fashion. If we wanted to use the *c* in such a way as to avoid any difficulty for anyone, we should have to limit its use to those cases where it is pronounced alike by all, viz., when it is placed before a, o, u, or a consonant, and pronounced *k*; but it would then be practically useless. For that reason the majority of the Delegation Committee have given it the sound *ts* as in Dr. Zamenhof's alphabet, and so we can retain a large number of words with their usual spelling as found in the best-known national languages. Such use is practically justified by the parallel between *s : c* and *sh : ch*.

It has been and will be objected against this international alphabet that it goes counter to the strict phonetic principle "one letter, one sound." But it must be borne in mind that, for our object, this purely theoretical principle must be subordinated to the fundamental principle of the "greatest facility" of which phonetic spelling is practically but a consequence. Therefore, if a small violation of the principle "one letter, one sound" gives us increased

The French sound *oi* is in the same case : Dr. Z. uses *ua* whenever Russian has adopted the word and spells it *ua* (trotuaro, tualeto, vualo), and *oi* or *oj* in all other cases (foiro, fojo, fojno).

facility, practical considerations must triumph over theoretical scruples.

One very important point remains to be mentioned in regard to the phonetics of an international language. All nations find it easy to pronounce series of sounds where vowels and simple consonants are found alternately, and nearly all nations also accept a few very easy consonant groups (like tr, sp, bl, etc.); but many nations find it extremely difficult to pronounce other and heavier groups, particularly at the end of words. The French usually lighten the more complicated groups, by the insertion of an unwritten vowel (*e.g.*, in Félix(e) Faure); Italians speaking English generally do the same for such groups as *kstr* (Greek street) or *ksp* (sixpence). And there are other nations whose phonetic habits allow of still fewer consecutive consonants than Italian. So that if we want to make things easier for all, we must not follow *Idiom Neutral* with its heavy groups of final consonants, but we must rather imitate *Esperanto* in the very ingenious way it has combined in its terminations, mostly vowels, grammatical clearness with an easy and flowing pronunciation which helps to make the language sonorous and pleasant to the ear.

### III.

Now for the *Vocabulary*. On this point, Dr. Zamenhof had already followed the principle of the greatest internationality for the majority of his roots, but the authors of *Idiom Neutral* were the first consciously to apply the principle to the whole of the language. Only they understood it in a somewhat superficial manner and counted in each case the number of languages possessing a common word. It is not so much the languages that we must count (and Latin in particular must not be placed on a par with living languages), it is the men that use them, as languages are not self-sufficient entities and independent of those who speak them. Therefore, if we are to consider the men and not the languages, we find the criterion of the international character of a word or root to be the number of men who know it from their own language. This definition of the

principle of the greatest internationality I have expounded in the Danish paper *Tilskueren* (June, 1905), and it was approved in the sittings of the Delegation Committee in October, 1907; but it is only a necessary consequence of the principle of the greatest facility for the greatest number. Everyone would naturally like to find in the International Language the greatest possible number of roots that he is already familiar with, and, to be impartial, we must attribute the same value to the natural preferences of each of the 120 million English-speaking persons as to each of the 75 million German speakers, or the 70 million Russians, or the 50 million French people or Spaniards, etc. We must even say that the languages spoken by small nations must be taken into account in proportion to the number of their population.

The choice of the words for our international language is therefore to a large extent a question of mere numbers. And yet all is not settled by the statistics of the people speaking the different languages. In the first place we find in dictionaries some words that are so scientific or so special that they are only known by a minority of the nation. Then there are cases where a word itself is not found in the language, and yet is fairly well known through one or several derivatives; 100 is hundred in E, hundert in D, hundrede in Danish, and yet the root *cent* is familiar to all through *per cent.* (*procent*), *centesimal*, *centimeter*, E *centennial*, *century*, *centenary*, D and Danish *centner*, etc.

Thirdly, even if the "same word" is found in several languages it is very often under different forms—mostly due to a divergent phonetic evolution—so that the choice of the form is often a very delicate problem. The English and French may spell *change* alike, but the sounds are very different; and as we can neither take the F nasal vowel nor the E diphthong (*ei*) as found in the most usual E pronunciation, *chanj-* seems to be the most convenient form for all. In many cases we have to find what might be termed a common denominator between the divergent forms. If E and D did not differ in the form of many words of the same etymology to such an extent that a middle form cannot be found, the Germanic quota would be predominant, on account of the great number of people speaking

those two closely-connected languages (*vf.* water, Wasser; tooth, Zahn; speak, sprechen; soap, Seife; week, Woche; enough, genug; etc.). It being so, it is the Romance element of English which weighs down the scale in most cases, since it agrees with F, I, and S, or at least with one of those three languages, and the result is that our language will necessarily be very much more Romance in appearance than might be anticipated. One very important factor is also operating in the same direction, viz., the fact (already mentioned) that a large number of Latin derivatives have passed into the Germanic languages, even when the primary word itself is not found there. Thus we have in D, absentieren, abstinenz, artist, dentist, dental, moral, populär, which make considerably easier for a German the words absenta, abstenar, arto, dento, moro, populo, although these are not found in his own language (except pöbel = populacho).

Sometimes there is a puzzling rivalry between two words. To express the idea of *arm* (part of the body), the DE and Scandinavian word "arm" seems quite obvious, until we find that this same word "arm" is still more international in the sense of "weapon" (EFIS, also found in "army" DEFR, armata I, armada ES, armieren D, etc.), and so we have to give the word "arm" (part of the body) a Romance form. In other cases, it seems that the only means to avoid troublesome homonyms is by modifying more or less arbitrarily one of the words (*e.g.*, *pordo*, door, instead of *porto*, on account of *port-*, to carry); but the greatest care must always be exercised in such alterations. It is most important to avoid disguising the words beyond recognition, a process which M. Blondel calls a "masquerade"; it was the general rule in Volapük, but Esperanto is by no means entirely free from it. As an example of a small legitimate modification I may also mention *disciple* and *discipline*—two completely international words, which may be written diciplio and disiplino, to avoid misunderstandings that might be caused by the *-ino* feminine termination, as *diciplino* means a school-girl.

One of the most effective means to simplify the vocabulary of a language is a careful system of derivation enabling every one to form with the greatest ease by

means of regular prefixes and suffixes a large number of new words which are readily understood by all those who know the rules. It often happens that several words derived more or less irregularly from the same root have been adopted by different languages and can therefore claim to be sufficiently international. Must we introduce them all bodily into our vocabulary? Idiom Neutral often does it, as in dimitar, dimision; dirigar, direktor; in other cases the regular and the irregular forms have been adopted side by side, *e.g.*, invension and inventasjion (from inventar), as well as inventor and inventator. In Esperanto there are very few similar cases (Zamenhof, however, admits redakcio, redakti, redaktoro; cf. Idiom Neutral redakcion, redaktar, redaktator); generally speaking, the process adopted has been to choose one form of a root and derive therefrom all the words required by means of the Esperanto affixes that can be applied to all words indiscriminately. There can be no doubt that this is the easiest process for everybody, as one has only to memorize once for all the form of the root, and a limited number of word-building syllables with a fixed meaning. After properly choosing the form of those roots which appear under several forms in natural languages, and selecting with due care the word-building syllables, one is surprised to find how many of those words built in a perfectly regular manner are identical with the forms to be found in existing languages. A deliberate system of derivation also saves us many a doubt as to the precise sense of some international form or other. Thus we have *photographe* in F, like *photograph* in D and *fotograf* in Danish meaning the man who takes the photo, while *photograph* in E is the picture taken, for which F and D use the word *photographie* (also meaning the art, called in E *photography*); F *géographe* is the person called in E *geographer*, but F *télégraphe* like E *telegraph* is the apparatus. It is obvious that we must once for all regularize such forms, thereby saving a vast amount of trouble to those who read or hear the language, and hesitation to those who speak or write it. M. Couturat, in this respect, has shown very clearly the way we must proceed (*Etude sur la Dérivation en Esperanto*, Paris, 1907).

## IV.

When we pass to the *grammar*, we find that the condition that must be most rigidly insisted on in case of any system aspiring to become the international language, is perfect regularity. Every exception to the rules would only complicate matters and make the use of forms difficult and uncertain for all. If we know the conjugation of one verb, we know the conjugation of all, etc. But we must also avoid other needless complications. Dr. Zamenhof adopted a most extensively-used accusative, as well as the agreement of adjectives, even in such cases where both the accusative and the agreement of the adjective are perfectly unnecessary. We can say without exaggeration that none of the three great linguistic families (Germanic, Romance, and Slavonic) is so exacting on these two points as Primitive Esperanto. Even in Russian, even in German, it is not always necessary to show the accusative of nouns as distinct from the nominative, or to show everywhere the number and case of adjectives ; and the example of English, French, Spanish, etc., shows that Esperanto could very well be simplified on these two points without any loss to the clearness of expression of thoughts. Teachers of Esperanto in many countries complain of having to spend so much time in making their pupils understand the application of these rules ; and their trouble is nearly always wasted, as, in the heat of conversation or speech, many people forget to adorn their Esperanto words with all those -n, -ajn, -ojn. Instead of "si envolvis sin en siajn densajn longajn harojn," as Dr. Zamenhof himself writes, it is much easier and, beyond the shadow of a doubt, infinitely more harmonious to say "el envolvis su en sa densa longa hari." Keep the accusative if you like, but make its use optional, and let it be kept particularly for cases where an inversion might leave a doubt as to which was the subject and which the direct object.

It would certainly be desirable for the grammatical terminations to be as international as most roots, but our languages are so different in this respect that chaos would result from any attempt at following statistics as we did for the vocabulary. What matters before all is simplicity and

regularity—very fortunate are we if we can manage to insert in a system possessing these qualities a few of the flexional elements of living languages, such as the Italian and Spanish -o for singular nouns, the Italian and Russian -i for plural nouns, the Italian and Spanish -ar for the infinitive, the -nt- and the -t- found in the active and passive participles of Romance languages and partly also in Germanic languages. A few *a priori* terminations are no great drawback in a grammar so easy that it can be learnt in half-an-hour.

We find in Dr. Zamenhof's generally *a-posteriori* language a survival of the pre-volapük period; I mean his *a-priori* table of correlative words. However ingenious such a table may seem to a highly logical mind, experience proves that all those fine forms (tiu, ciu, tiel, kial, kiam, tiom and so forth) are the terror of new Esperantists; they alone have frightened away a good many people who have seen Esperanto texts and might have been tempted to read them, and consequently to become good Esperantists, had they not been disconcerted right from the beginning by those mysterious forms. What is the use of that *a-priori* enclosure, the principles of which are in striking discordance with all the rest of the language? By replacing them by forms that may be less systematic but are certainly more similar to those known by everyone in other languages, and therefore easier to be remembered, a great step forward is made towards the *easiest language for the greatest number of people*.

This dictionary seems to me to have been very carefully elaborated in accordance with the true principles of the auxiliary language. My opinion on all points has not always been the same as its authors', but such points of disagreement have been very few, and it seems to me that there is no doubt the vocabulary chosen is greatly superior to the previous systems from which it has rightly taken its inspiration, and of which it embodies the advantages while usually avoiding their defects. If it is found necessary in the future to correct a detail here and there, it will not

alter the fact that we have here a practical and easy means of intercommunication between the nations. May it help to reduce to a minimum the "intellectual customs-duty" and thus facilitate closer intercourse between civilized nations, which can only be benefited by an ever-increasing intimacy.

## **Explanations to the Student.**

**E**VERYONE knows that all the words in the international language consist of invariable elements, each of which has a constant and well-defined meaning: roots, affixes (prefixes and suffixes), grammatical terminations. Such elements are separated in the Dictionary by hyphens. All words derived from one root have been grouped together in the same paragraph, without however the root itself being repeated; but the words formed therefrom by means of prefixes are to be found in their alphabetical place. In order to read a paragraph, each termination must be read as if it were in the place of the termination of the first word of the paragraph, *e.g.*, we find mal-bel-a, -eso, and the latter must be read mal-bel-eso, and not mal-eso. When the final includes a suffix, such suffix is repeated in every word where it figures; thus halt-ar, -igar, -igilo, must be read: haltar, haltigar, haltigilo. Consequently when a word includes two hyphens, the hyphens always enclose the root, which can be found with all its family in its alphabetical place.

We have not made a point of enumerating for each root all the words that can be formed from it by derivation and composition, not only because it would have enormously and needlessly increased the bulk of this dictionary, but chiefly because it is impossible to do it, owing to the inexhaustible fecundity of the word-building system. Such word-building being only limited by the dictates of logic and common sense, no one can foresee and enumerate all possible and useful derivatives and compounds. We have confined our enumeration to the more usual ones, or those that most required an accurate definition. We have omitted nearly all mention of the most common derivations, such as the feminine of nouns and the adverbial form of adjectives, as everyone can form them easily and correctly

when required. In the enumeration of derivatives, we have followed a constant order, placing the immediate derivations (those without affixes) first, in the following order: verb, noun, adjective, adverb; or, adjective, noun, adverb. How far each root is international is shown briefly at the end of each paragraph by the initial of those of the six principal languages to which it belongs (either directly or through derivatives). Needless to say that we are not speaking here of a theoretical or etymological, but of a practical internationality: the question is whether a man who only knows his mother-tongue can recognize such a root in the words of his own language, primitive or derived, with a meaning sufficiently near to the one it has in the international language. We shall be thankful to our readers if they will kindly call our attention to any errors or omissions they might notice. Like the language itself, these dictionaries are not perfect, but indefinitely perfectible with the help of all interested in establishing an auxiliary language.

Our sincerest thanks are due to Mr. P. D. Hugon, member of the Delegation Committee, for his most valuable co-operation in the English dictionaries, of which he has checked, corrected, and completed the matter and superintended the bringing-out with every possible care.




