SUMMARY

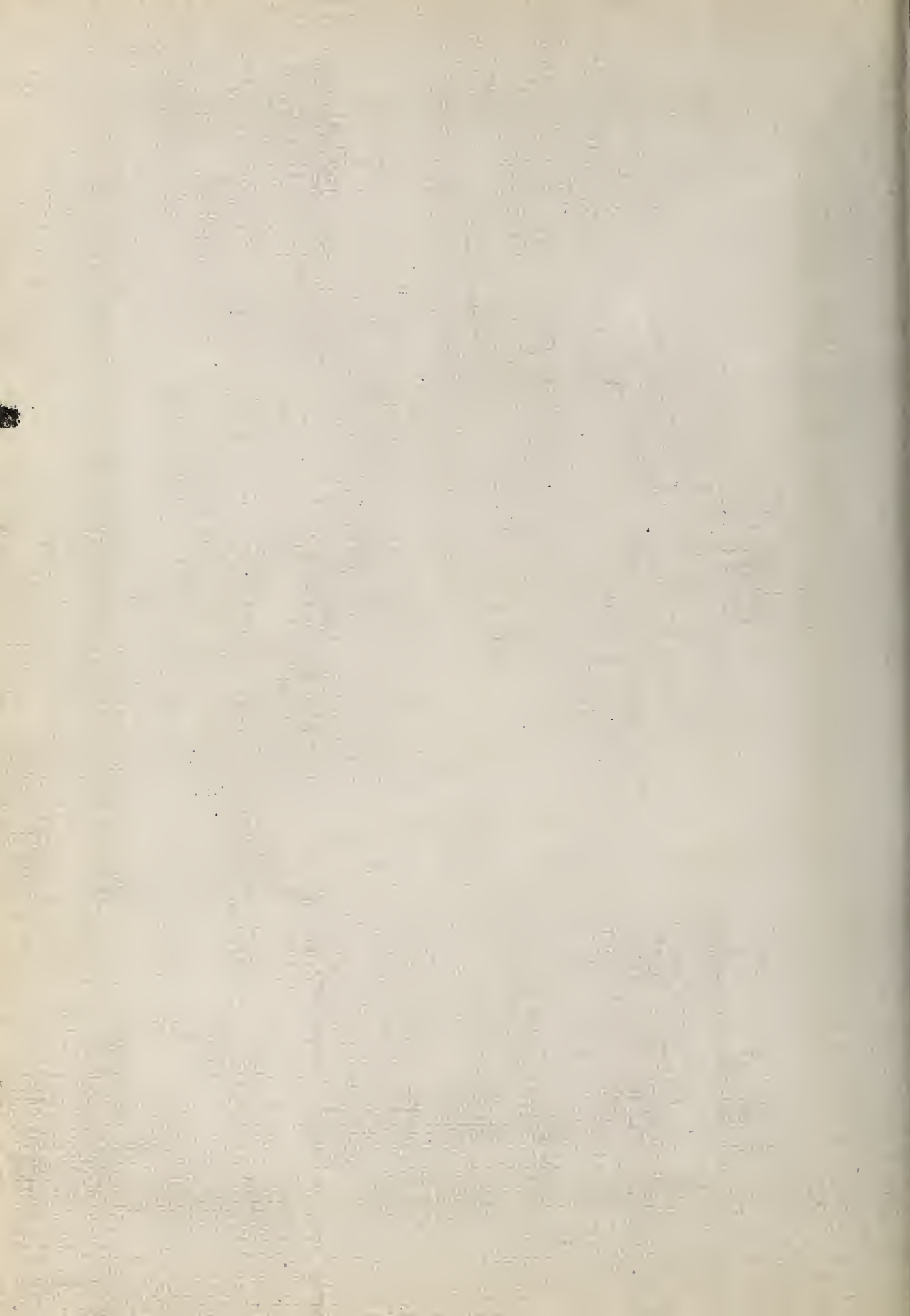
