A report of the Rules and Legislation Committee
Monday, November 3, 1986

The Rules and Legislation Committee held a hearing on October 28, 1986, to determine if it should recommend to the full Board of Supervisors the confirmation and approval of the appointment by Mayor Dianne Feinstein of Rudolf Nothenberg as Chief Administrative Officer of the City and County of San Francisco effective January 3, 1987, for a term of ten years as provided by the Charter.

Charter Section 3.200 provides "The mayor shall appoint a qualified person as chief administrative officer, subject to the confirmation and approval by the Board of Supervisors. The appointee shall have been a resident of the State of California for at least five years immediately preceding his appointment. The requisite qualifications of such appointee shall be administrative and executive ability and experience for the position to be filled."

Mr. Nothenberg, now 53 years old, came to San Francisco in 1949. After service as the Chief of Staff of the Ways and Means Committee of the Assembly of the State Legislature and as a special consultant to the California Fair Political Practices Commission, Mr. Nothenberg in 1976 became San Francisco's Deputy Mayor for Program and Fiscal Administration. In that role he was responsible for budget control and system analysis for a budget of more than \$1.5 billion involving about 23,000 employees.

In 1983 Mr. Nothenberg became General Manager of the Public Utilities Commission where he has full administrative responsibility for several diverse operations with an annual budget of about \$500 million and for a work force of about a fifth of all City employees.

Monday, November 3, 1986

Public testimony was received by the Committee reflecting strong support by every witness. The testimony indicated that Mr. Nothenberg is a tough administrator, who knows sound management practices, and who makes himself and his staff accessible to the public. He was described as having a knowledge of construction, as knowing large project administration, as selecting high quality staff members, providing administrative leadership, developing an excellent minority and local business enterprise program, and believing in open doors. His great love for the arts, and knowledge of the arts as a business important to tourism and conventions in the City, would fit the needs to properly distribute the hotel tax funds for publicity and advertising. He was repeatedly described as a man of integrity, intelligence, talent, and vision.

His former and present personnel clearly have the highest regard for him. The President of the Public Utilities Commission, for example, who has worked with every general manager of the commission since 1960, said that Mr. Nothenberg has accomplished more than all of the other general managers combined.

Testimony indicated very strong support from leaders of business, labor, the arts, the convention industry, and civic organizations. No witness opposed the appointment and no witness expressed any reservations about the appointment.

The committee members unanimously find that not only does Mr. Nothenberg meet the legal requirements for the position but we find him to be a man of great intelligence, skill, tenacity, integrity, charm, and wit, who will do a superb job as Chief Administrative Officer. He has the skill and ability to work effectively as part of a team with other members of this government and all segments of our community.

Your Rules and Legislation Committee enthusiastically recommends to you the adoption of the motion to confirm and approve the appointment of Rudolf Nothenberg as Chief Administrative Officer of the City and County of San Francisco for the term prescribed by law.

Presentation of Resolution Commending and Honoring Quentin L. Kopp

President Molinari announced that he had set this time aside so present and past Board members would have an opportunity to speak. He then recognized former Supervisors Terry A. Francois, Roger Boas, Lee Dolson, Ed Lawson and John Bardis who briefly addressed the Board concerning their recollections of Supervisor Kopp.

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The President thereupon read the following resolution which he presented to Supervisor Kopp:

Commending and Honoring Quentin L. Kopp for his Distinguished Service on the Board of Supervisors

Resolution No. 975-86

Whereas, Quentin L. Kopp has served the people of the City and County of San Francisco with intelligence, energy and devotion for almost fifteen years; and

Whereas, At the end of November Supervisor Kopp will conclude his service on the Board of Supervisors to enable him on Monday, December 1, 1986, to be sworn in as a member of the Senate of the State of California; and

Whereas, Supervisor Kopp has provided to the people of this community and to his colleagues on the Board impressive ability, keen perception and comprehensive insight; and

Whereas, Over the fifteen years Supervisor Kopp has provided superb service as President of the Board, as chair of several committees, and as an effective member of the Board and its committees, bringing exceptional skill to help resolve very complex and important issues; and

Whereas, Members of this Board, never having served on the Board without the presence of Quentin L. Kopp on the Board and always finding him of great help in deliberations, even when he disagrees with them, cannot imagine the Board without him as a member; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the members of the Board of Supervisors, on behalf of the officers, employees and citizens of this City, do hereby take public recognition of the distinguished contributions which Quentin L. Kopp has made to the welfare of this community, and do express to him their appreciation for his high quality work and their pleasure that he will be continuing to serve this City and this State as a member of the Senate; and, be it

Further Resolved, That a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution be tendered to Supervisor Quentin L. Kopp as a token of the great affection and respect in which he is held by the Board of Supervisors.

Remarks by Supervisor Kopp

Supervisor Kopp then thanked the President for the resolution commemorating his almost fifteen years of service on the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco. He thanked his colleagues, both past and present, for the sustenance that is not simply memorialized in words but by all the memories which were shared and experienced. He recalled the long-term relationships he had had with his former colleagues. He stated that these had been robust years and a big chunk of his life and that he hadn't thought that would be the case when he ran for office in 1971.

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The Supervisor noted that the years have been spectacular in terms of the scope of affairs of our community. He then recalled that when he ran for office in 1971 he had stated he believed there is no partisan cast to such matters as garbage collection, a clean reliable system of delivering water to the people who live and work in San Francisco, to effective street cleaning or to tidy and useable parks, playgrounds, ball fields and a responsible transit system. In fact, he stated he didn't think there is a partisan cast to the idea that taxpayers ought to get for their dollars what they are paying for in terms of preventing waste or slothful spending of those dollars and that everyone understands and respects that idea which has no political or partisan flavor to it.

The Supervisor further noted he was sorry all former colleagues were not able to be present, but said the Mayor had written a note stating that although she couldn't be here, having just returned after a two-week trip to the Far East, she was looking forward to working with him for our City, and also had written "Be humble!" Supervisor Kopp said he will take that advice very seriously. He went on to say that there have been cheery times in these fifteen years but there have also been sorrowful times in the Chambers that have left an indelible mark.

Supervisor Kopp remarked that he had been asked a couple of weeks ago what he would say to his children about all of these fifteen years. He said he would tell them the idea is to be known as a straight shooter, to be forthright, although this is not sometimes comfortable for everyone's personality and character, and to stand up for yourself and others. He stated he wished to repeat these words and wanted them to be a part of the recordation of today's proceedings.

He stated that it had been a sublimely human fifteen-year experience which has stamped his life permanently and that in leaving for a challenging and exciting experience and the opportunity it presents to help his community he was humble and everyone could be sure that he will try to continue the highest and best form of leadership to all the people of the City and County of San Francisco.

- 6) Does the proposal for a waste-to-energy plant proposed for Redwood City (assuming compliance with our South African resolution by the prime sponsor) involve reliance on tax exempt bond financing and can that project be eligible under the new rules?

Remarks by Outgoing Chief Administrative Officer Roger Boas

President Molinari recognized Chief Administrative Officer Roger Boas for the purpose of addressing the Board. Mr. Boas stated that he had wanted to take the opportunity of the last meeting of the year and his last chance as Chief Administrative Officer to relate how much he has enjoyed working with the Board for the last ten years. He stated he was pleased that the garbage issue has been settled but wanted to caution the Board on two matters of concern to him. He advised of the critical importance of the city's

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infrastructure and the correlation between these public assets and the economic development of the city. He stated that a study of the city's capital assets showed \$1.2 billion worth of impairment out of a total capital asset valuation of approximately \$15.4 billion. He said the damage was increasing at the rate of \$200 million per year and that if the city doesn't initiate long-term maintenance soon, the situation may become unmanageable in five years. With respect to the Bank of America situation, he stated that the financial picture in San Francisco has been changing so fast it is difficult to keep track of. He noted that in the past couple of years more than half of the major corporations headquartered in San Francisco have either merged or moved out of San Francisco, and in his view this situation would continue and that the problem needs to be addressed. Mr. Boas then thanked the Board for the help and support it had given him during the years of his tenure.

By Supervisor Walker, that a letter of inquiry be sent to the Department of Public Works to determine what plans it has to implement the Ocean Avenue Neighborhood Transportation Study, with particular emphasis towards recommendations 11 and 12, concerning the channelization of the Ocean/Phelan/Geneva intersection.

By Supervisor Silver, that a letter be sent to the Mayor and the Controller, inquiring whether a financial plan can be prepared for the contingency that Bank America Corporation Headquarters is removed from San Francisco.

By Supervisor Nelder, that the Budget Analyst be requested to prepare an investigative report on the allegations that owners of hotels incorporated into the city's homeless program were instructed to overcharge the city for rooms, later supplying the Department of Social Services employees with cash on request.

By Supervisor Nelder, that a letter be directed to the Mayor, the Department of the Navy and Triple A Shipyard, inquiring into the recent layoffs of five professional firefighters from the shipyard and their subsequent eviction from housing at the shipyard and requesting that they also address the status of firefighter protection at the shipyard and provide advice as to who will provide the service rendered by the five men who recently lost their jobs.

By Supervisor Nelder, that the Budget Analyst be requested to report on the source of funds for, and the nature of expenditures from, the Department of Social Services fund which is the subject of a recent newspaper article.

By Supervisor Nelder, that a letter of inquiry be sent to the Civil Service Commission to determine the status of vacancies in the 2472 Senior Water Quality Chemist classification within the San Francisco Water Department and to obtain information on reports received that the Department of Public Works would be funding such a position for the Water Department, beginning in January of 1987.

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By Supervisor Nelder, that the City Attorney be requested to review a list of suggested amendments to the San Francisco General Assistance Ordinance, to report on which, if any, of the proposed changes have already been drafted by her office for action by the Board and to request that those suggested amendments not currently pending be prepared in form for the Supervisor's introduction in Board.

By Supervisor Nelder, that a letter be sent to her Honor, the Mayor, inquiring why 8 of the 21 residents of the cave recently discovered under 6th Street at Folsom Street were not provided shelter under the homeless hotel program, as had been previously promised.

By Supervisor Kennedy, that a letter be sent to the Health Service System inquiring whether arrangements are available for the provision of group life insurance for employees of the City and County of San Francisco.

By Supervisor Kennedy, that a letter be sent to the Department of Real Estate, inquiring about proposals and plans for the parcel of land on the northwest corner of Polk and McAllister Streets.

By Supervisor Kennedy, that a letter be sent to the Public Health, Police, Fire and Public Works Departments, inquiring what contingency plans are in place when there is a power outage affecting the provision of emergency services to the public.

By Supervisor Kennedy, that a letter be sent to the Department of Public Works, inquiring why only two architectural firms were invited to submit proposals for the renovation of the proposed site for the Bureau of Engineering at 1680 Mission Street.

By Supervisor Kennedy, that a letter be sent to the City Planning Commission and the Department of Public Works, inquiring about the status of a building at 2832 Mission Streets, noting that the Supervisor has received complaints there are discrepancies in the application for building permits, additions, alterations and repairs submitted to the Department of Public Works.

By Supervisor Kennedy, that a letter be sent to the Public Utilities Commission, inquiring whether the BART-MUNI Discount Ticket dispensers are checked periodically.

By Supervisor Kennedy, that a letter be sent to the Purchasing Department, inquiring whether the City and County of San Francisco is using and encouraging the use of recycled products and, if so, that the department provide advice on the amount and type of recycled products used.

By Supervisor Kennedy, that a letter be sent to the Controller and the Chief of the Fire Department, inquiring whether or not it is possible for either of those departments to provide the Board of Supervisors with a complete and accurate breakdown of the substantial overtime dollars that have been allocated and expended by the Fire Department during the past fiscal year.

By Supervisor Kennedy, that a letter be sent to the City Attorney requesting her advice as to whether or not the City Charter or any other legislative mandate dictates the way in which policy affecting the management and control of the Department of Social Services is created, implemented, and enforced.

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By Supervisor Gonzalez, that a letter be sent to Rear Admiral Robert L. Toney of the United States Navy, asking him to provide the Board with a list of the Bay Area firms that have received contracts from the Navy in the last twelve months.

By Supervisor Gonzalez, that a letter be sent to the Chief Administrative Officer, inquiring as to the department's plans for streamlining the building permit process.

By Supervisor Gonzalez, that a letter of inquiry be sent to the Art Commission, requesting a progress report on the proposed opening of the Mission Cultural Center Building on 25th and Mission Streets.
