



The cultivation of Sacaline is very simple. Seed should be procured as early as possible, and sown in boxes of very rich soil kept very wet, and protected from frost. The plants should afterward be set out three feet apart each way. The seed may also be sown where wanted, and the plants thinned out properly afterwards. By far the quickest result, however, will be obtained by procuring roots and setting these out at any time of the year three feet apart each way.

Grows in Poorest Soils.

As it accommodates itself to all kinds of soil, it must prove a valuable forage plant, especially for all parts of the West and South, and there it should be grown in immense tracts. 
