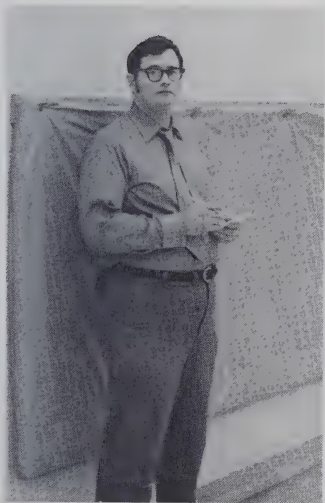
Athletic Director
