DISTRICT 502 — HELLROARING: Those portions of Carbon, Park and Stillwater Counties lying within the fotlowing described boundary: Beginning at Beliry, thence southerly along the Bridger-Beliry Road to the Wyoming State Line, thence westerly along said line to the Broadwater River, thence northerly along said river to Iceberg Peak and Grasshopper Glacier, thence northeasterly along West Rosebud Creek to its junction with the Roscoe-Dean Road, thence easterly to Roscoe, thence along Route 307 to U.S. Highway 212, thence south along said road to Red Lodge, thence easterly along the Red Lodge-Belfry Road to Belfry, the point of beginning.

DISTRICT 760 — BLUE MOUNTAINS: Those portions of Custer and Prairle Counlies lying within the following described boundary: Beginning at the junction of U.S. Highway 12 and U.S. Interstate Highway 4 at Miles City, thence northeast along U.S. Interstate 4 to the Powder River, thence south up the Powder River to the Ekalaka Cut-off Road at Mizpah, thence west along the Ekalaka Cut-off Road to U.S. Highway 12, thence west along U.S. Highway 12 to U.S. Interstate 34, the point of beginning.
