were directed at endangered and game specles.
Montana is rich in nongame wildlife too-with over 500 species such as the bluebird, painted turtle, pelican, pika and sturgeon chub. Since no reliable funding source has been available unt now, very little is known about our nongame species The 1983 Legislature passed a new law allowing taxpayers to
