Montana is famous for its abundant and diverse wildlife resource. Wildlife has been an important part of the heritage of Montanans, but until 1983, most wildlife conservation efforts were directed at endangered and game species.

Montana is nich in nongame wildlife too—with over 500 species such as the bluebird, painted turtle, pelican, pika and sturgeon chub. Since no reliable funding source has been available until now, very little is known about our nongame species.

The 1983 Legislature passed a new law allowing taxpayers to contribute \$2, \$5 or \$10 to the Nongame Wildlife Program through a checkoff on state income tax returns. The Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks, as administrator of the program, will use the tax-deductible contributions to fund education and research efforts on behalf of Montana's wildlife.
