BEAR, DEER, ELK, LION

100 - North Kootenai: That portion of Lincoln County lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning where the Kootenai River meets the Idaho State Line, thence northerly along said state line to the Canadian Border, thence easterly along said border to the east shore of Lake Kooconua (Kootenai River), thence southerly along said shore to Libby Dam and the east shore of the Kootenai River, thence southerly and westerly along that shore of the Kootenai River to the Idaho State Line, the point of beginning.

101 - Eureka: Those portions of Lincoln and Flathead Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at Stryker on U. S. Highway 93, thence southerly along said highway to the Flathead National Forest Boundary at the Spring Creek Campground, thence southerly along said boundary to the divide between Sunday and Martin Creeks, thence southerly along said divide to Elk Mountain, thence westerly and northerly along the divide to Forest Service Trail 279 at Davis Mountain, thence westerly along Forest Service Trail 279 to Forest Service Trail 280, thence westerly along Forest Service Trail 280 to the Cripple Horse Creek Road, thence westerly on said road to the South Fork Cripple Horse Creek Road, thence southerly along said road to Cripple Horse Creek, thence westerly along said creek to the east shore of Lake Kooconua, thence northerly along said shore to the Canadian Border, thence easterly along said border to the divide between Weasel Creek and the North Fork of the Flathead River, thence southerly along said divide to the Ruskys Creek Road, thence westerly along said road to the Stillwater River Road, thence southerly along said road to U. S. Highway 93 at Stryker, the point of beginning.

102 - Tally Lake: Those portions of Lincoln and Flathead Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning on the Flathead National Forest Boundary at the Spring Creek Campground on U. S. Highway 93, thence in a southerly and westerly direction along said boundary to the divide between Sunday and Martin Creeks, thence in a southerly direction along said divide to Elk Mountain, Tepee Mountain, Sanders Mountain, Grubb Mountain, Pleasant Valley Mountain and Herrig Creek Road, thence southerly along said road to the Little Bitterroot Lake Road, thence southerly along said road to U. S. Highway 2, thence easterly along said road to its junction with U. S. Highway 93, thence north along U. S. Highway 93 to the Flathead National Forest Boundary at the Spring Creek Campground, the point of beginning.

103 - South Kootenai: Those portions of Lincoln and Flathead Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning where the Kootenai River meets the Idaho State Line, thence south along said state line to the Lincoln-Sanders County Line, thence easterly along said line to U. S. Highway 2, thence easterly along said highway to the Little Bitterroot Lake Road, thence northerly along said road to the Herrig Creek Road, thence northerly to Pleasant Valley Mountain, thence northerly along the divide to Grubb Mountain, Sanders Mountain, Tepee Mountain and Elk Mountain, thence westerly along the divide to Davis Mountain, thence westerly along Forest Service Trails 279 and 280 to the Cripple Horse Creek Road, thence westerly along said road to Cripple Horse Creek, thence westerly down Cripple Horse Creek to the Kootenai River (Lake Kooconua), thence southerly and westerly along said river to the Idaho State Line, the point of beginning.

110 - North Fork: Those portions of Flathead and Lincoln Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at the mouth of the North Fork of the Flathead River, thence northerly up the river to the Canadian Border, thence westerly along said border to the divide between Weasel Creek and the North Fork of the Flathead River, thence southerly along said divide to the Ruskys Creek Road, thence westerly along said road to the Stillwater River Road, thence southerly along said road to U. S. Highway 93 at Stryker, thence southerly along said highway to State Route 40, thence easterly along said highway and U. S. Highway 2 to the Flathead River, thence northerly along said river to the mouth of the North Fork of the Flathead River, the point of beginning.

120 - Blacktail: Those portions of Flathead and Lake counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning where the Thompson River County Road meets U. S. Highway 2, thence southerly along the Thompson River County Road to Shroder Creek Road and U. S. Forest Service Trail 137, thence easterly along said road and trail to Trail 132, thence southerly to Trail 290, thence along said trail to the Flathead Indian Reservation boundary, thence easterly along said boundary to Flathead Lake, thence northerly and easterly along the shore of said lake to the Somers R. Area and U. S. Highway 93, thence northerly along said highway to U. S. Highway 2, thence westerly along said highway to the Thompson River County Road, the point of beginning.

121 - West Clark Fork: That portion of Sanders County lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning where the Sanders-Mineral County line meets the Idaho border, thence easterly along said county line to Greenwood Hill, thence northerly along the divide to Penrose Peak, Cherry Peak and Eddy Mountain, thence northerly down the ridge to Clark Fork River and mouth of Thompson River, thence northerly up the Thompson River to the West Fork of the Thompson River, thence up the West Fork to Four Lakes Creek, thence westerly up said creek to the North Fork of Four Lakes Creek, thence northerly up the North Fork to Forest Road 7671 and Trail 437, thence westerly up said trail to Trail 450, thence northerly to Mt. Headley, thence northerly along the divide between Graves Creek and West Fork of Fishtrap Creek to the Vermilion River Divide, thence northerly along the Vermilion-Thompson River Divide to the Sanders-Lincoln County line, thence easterly along said county line to the Idaho border, thence south and southeasterly along said border to the Sanders-Mineral County line, the point of beginning.

122 - East Clark Fork: That portion of Sanders County lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning where the Thompson River County Road meets U. S. Highway 2, thence southerly along said road to the Shroder Creek Road and U. S. Forest Service Trail 137, thence easterly along said road and trail to Trail 132, thence southeasterly to Trail 290, thence along said trail to the Flathead Indian Reservation boundary, thence southerly along said boundary to the Sanders County line, thence westerly along said county line to the Clark Fork-Ninemile Divide, thence westerly along said divide to U. S. Forest Service Trail 242, thence northerly along said trail to the Clark Fork River, thence westerly up the Clark Fork River to the U. S. Forest Service Trail 1714, thence northerly along said trail to U. S. Forest Service Trail 404 near Patricks Knob, thence westerly along said trail to the Miller Creek Loop Road, thence west on said road to Compbes Peak, thence westerly along U. S. Forest Service Trail 404 to the Mineral-Sanders county line, thence westerly along said county line to Greenwood Hill, thence northerly along the divide to Penrose Peak, Cherry Peak and Eddy Mountain, thence northerly down ridge to Clark Fork River and mouth of Thompson River, thence northerly up the Thompson River to the West Fork of the Thompson River, thence up the West Fork to Four Lakes Creek, thence westerly up said creek to the North Fork of Four Lakes Creek, thence northerly up the North Fork to forest road 7671 and Trail 437, thence westerly up said trail to Trail 450, thence northerly on said trail to Mt. Headley, thence northerly along the divide between Graves Creek and West Fork of Fishtrap Creek to the Vermilion River Divide, thence northerly along the Vermilion-Thompson River Divide to the Sanders-Lincoln County line, thence easterly along said county line to U. S. Highway 2, thence easterly along said highway to the Thompson River County Road, the point of beginning.

130 - Swan: Those portions of Flathead, Lake and Missoula Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at the mouth of the South Fork of the Flathead River, thence up the South Fork to Frank Creek, thence up Frank Creek to Forest Service Trail 51, thence up said trail to Doris Mountain on the Swan Divide, thence southerly along said divide to the Clearwater-Swan Divide (Lolo National Forest Boundary) at Wolverine Peak, thence along said divide in a southerly direction to the Flathead Indian Reservation boundary, thence northerly and westerly along said boundary to Flathead Lake, thence northerly along the shore of said lake to the Swan River, thence easterly along the north shore of said river to the bridge on State Route 35, thence northerly along said road and State Route 206 to U. S. Highway 2, thence westerly along said highway to the Flathead River, thence easterly along said river to the South Fork of the Flathead River, the point of beginning.

140 - Lower South Fork: That portion of Flathead County lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at Inspiration Point on the Swan Divide, thence northeasterly along ridge to U. S. Forest Service Trail 218, thence in an easterly direction down George Creek to Trail 115, thence northeast along said trail to Trail 226 (Picture Peak Trail), thence up said trail to Trail 107 near Picture Peak, thence northerly along said trail and ridge to the south side of Sarah Peak, thence east down the main creek to the mouth of Mid Creek and Trail 103, thence up said trail to Trail 89 on Silvercup Creek, thence northerly on said trail to the Silvercup Cabin and Trail 83, thence northerly along said trail to Trail 43, thence northerly along said trail to Trail 237 near Gunsight Lake, thence northerly along said trail to its junction with Miner Creek Trail 81, thence northerly to the divide between the South and Middle Forks of the Flathead River, through Horseshoe Peak, Twin Peak, Prospector Mt., Mt. Baptiste, Red Sky Mtn., Unawah Mtn., Felix Peak, Mt. Comeahut, Mt. Adams, Mt. Liebig, Mt. Grant, Great Northern Mt., Nyack Mtn., Mt. Penrose, Great Bear Mtn., to the Trail 388, thence northerly to Ousel Peak and Ousel Creek Trail 311, thence down said trail to U. S. Highway #2, thence westerly along said highway to Ousel Creek, thence northerly down Ousel Creek to the Middle Fork of the Flathead River and Glacier National Park boundary, thence westerly along said boundary to the North Fork of the Flathead River, thence down the Flathead River to south fork of the Flathead River, thence up the south fork of the Flathead River to Frank Creek, thence up Frank Creek to Forest Service Trail 51, thence up said trail to Doris Mtn. in the Swan Divide, thence southerly along said divide to Inspiration Point, the point of beginning.

141 - Lower Middle Fork: That portion of Flathead County lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning on the Continental Divide at the junction of Lodgepole Creek Trail 179, thence northerly along said divide to the Glacier National Park boundary at Maras Pass, thence westerly along said boundary to Ousel Creek, thence southerly up said creek to U. S. Highway #2, thence easterly along said highway to the Ousel Creek Trail 331, thence up said creek trail past Ousel Peak and along Trail 388 to the divide between the South and Middle Forks of the Flathead River, thence southeasterly along said divide through Great Bear Mtn., Mt. Penrose, Nyack Mtn., Great Northern Mtn., Mt. Grant, Mt. Liebig, Mt. Adams, Mt. Comeahut, Felix Pk., Unawah Mtn., Red Sky Mtn., Mt. Baptiste, Prospector Mtn., Twin Pk. and Horseshoe Peak to Miner Creek Trail 81 near Whitcomb Peak, thence northerly along said trail to Trail 155 and Morrison Creek Trail 154, thence easterly along Trail 154 to its junction with the Lodgepole Creek Trail 179, thence easterly and northerly up said trail to the Continental Divide, the point of beginning.

150 - Upper South Fork: Those portions of Flathead, Lewis and Clark, Missoula and Powell counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at Inspiration Point on the Swan Divide, thence northeasterly along ridge to U. S. Forest Service Trail 218, thence in an easterly direction down George Creek to Trail 115, thence northeast along said trail to Trail 226 (Picture Peak Trail), thence up said trail to Trail 107 near Picture Peak, thence northerly along said trail and ridge to the south side of Sarah Peak, thence east down the main creek to the mouth of Mid Creek and Trail 103, thence up said trail to Trail 89 on Silvercup Creek, thence northerly on said trail to the Silvercup Cabin and Trail 83, thence northerly along said trail to Trail 43, thence northerly along said trail to the junction of Dean Creek and Dean creeks to the Elk Ridge Trail 333 at the divide between Schaefer Creek, Argosy Creek and Dean Creek, thence southeasterly along said trail to U. S. Forest Service trail connecting the Dolly Varden-Pentagon Pass to Pot Mountain, thence easterly along said trail to Trail 173, thence southeasterly from said trail junction along the divide between the Middle and South Forks of the Flathead River to the Pentagon County to Switchback Pass on the Continental Divide, thence southerly along the Continental Divide to the Lolo National Forest boundary at Triple Divide, thence westerly along said boundary to the Swan Divide at Wolverine Peak, thence northerly along said divide to Inspiration Point, the point of beginning.

151 - Upper Middle Fork: That portion of Flathead County lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning on the Continental Divide at the junction of the Lodgepole Creek Trail 179, thence southerly along said divide to Kevan Mountain and Switchback Pass, thence northerly along the divide between the Middle and South Forks of the Flathead River over Pot Mountain to U. S. Forest Service Trail 173 at the Bob Marshall Wilderness boundary, thence southerly along the U. S. Forest Service Trail toward Pot Mountain to the junction of the Elk Ridge Trail 333, thence northerly along said trail to divide between Schaefer Creek, Argosy Creek and Dean Creek, thence southerly along the divide between Dean Creek and Sebafet Creek to U. S. Forest Service Trail 43, thence northerly along said trail to Trail 237 near Gunsight Lake, thence northerly along said trail to its junction with Miner Creek Trail 81, thence northerly along said trail to Trail 155 and Morrison Creek Trail 154, thence easterly along Trail 154 to its junction with the Lodgepole Creek Trail 179, thence easterly and northerly up said trail to the Continental Divide, the point of beginning.

170 - Flathead River: That portion of Flathead County lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning where State Route 35 crosses the Swan River, thence northerly along said road to State Route 206, thence northerly along said road to U. S. Highway 2, thence westerly along said highway and State Route 40, to U. S. Highway 93, thence southerly along said highway to the Somers R. Area and north shore of Flathead Lake, thence easterly along said shore to the Swan River, thence easterly along the north shore of said river to the State Route 35 bridge, the point of beginning.

NOTE: That portion of District 170 in Flathead County lying in Sections 9, 10, 15 and 16 of Township 28N, Range 21W, within the following-described boundary shall be closed to the hunting of big game animals, unless designated otherwise by hunting regulations. Beginning at the Old Steel Bridge on the Flathead River, thence following the county road in a westerly direction to the Stillwater River, thence down the east bank of the Stillwater River to the confluence with the Flathead River, thence up the east bank of the Flathead River to the Old Steel Bridge, the point of beginning. NOTE: Stillwater Game Preserve closed to hunting. Boundary description on page 8.

200 - North St. Regis: Those portions of Mineral and Sanders Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at St. Regis, thence in a northerly direction along U. S. Highway 10, thence between the Middle Montana-Idaho Border, thence northerly along said border to the Mineral-Sanders County Line, thence in an east and southerly direction along said county line to U. S. Forest Service Trail 404 near Compbes Peak, thence east on said trail to the Miller Creek Loop Forest Service Road, thence east along said road to its junction with U. S. Forest Service Trail 415, thence south and east on said trail to its junction with U. S. Forest Service Trail 1714, thence south on said trail to the Clark Fork River, thence upstream to U. S. Highway 10 bridge at St Regis, the point of beginning.

201 - Ninemile-North Superior: Those portions of Mineral, Missoula and Sanders Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at Evaro, thence south along U. S. Highway 93 to its junction with U. S. Highway 10 (U. S. Interstate Highway 90), thence northerly along said highway to St. Regis, thence downstream along the Clark Fork River to Cascade Campground, thence south along Forest Service Trail 242 to the Ninemile-Seigel Creek Divide, thence easterly along said divide to the Flathead-Clark Fork Divide, thence southeasterly along said divide to Evaro, the point of beginning.

202 - South Superior: Those portions of Missoula and Mineral Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at Superior, thence southeast on U. S. Highway 10 (Interstate 90) to the Fish Creek Road, thence south on the Fish Creek Road to the East Fork of Fish Creek, thence up the East Fork of Fish Creek Road to the Lolo Creek-Fish Creek Divide, thence south on Forest Road 3430 to U. S. Highway 12, thence west along Highway 12 to the Montana-Idaho Divide, thence northwest along said divide to Lookout Pass, thence east on U. S. Highway 10 to Superior, the point of beginning.

203 - Grave Creek Range: Those portions of Missoula, Mineral and Ravalli Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at Lolo, thence south along U. S. Highway 93 to the Carlton Lake road, thence westerly along said road to Carlton Lake, thence westerly to Lolo Peak, thence southerly along the divide between the South Fork of Lolo Creek and the Bitterroot River-South Fork Lolo Creek divide, thence westerly along said border to Lolo Pass, thence easterly along U. S. Highway 12 to Forest Road 343 (Fish Creek Road), thence north along said road to Interstate Highway 90, thence east along said highway to the second Interstate 90 bridge east of Alberton, thence easterly up the Clark Fork River to the Harper's Bridge and County Route 30 (Big Flat Road), thence southerly along said road to its junction with U. S. Highway 93, thence south on said highway to Lolo, the point of beginning.

204 - North Sapphire: Those portions of Granite, Missoula and Ravalli Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at Missoula, thence east along Interstate Highway 90 to the Rock Creek Interchange, thence south along the Rock Creek River to the Rock Creek Cable Crossing, thence west along Forest Trail No. 215 to the Bitterroot Divide, thence northerly along said divide to the Cut-off Gulch Trail (Forest Trail No. 146), thence southwest down said trail to the Burnt Fork Road, thence northwest along said road to the Eastside Highway, thence north along said highway to the Eightmile Creek Road, thence north along said road and the Montana Power Co. "B" Power Line to the south end of the K. O. Ranch Road, thence northerly along said road to the Miller Creek Road, thence northerly along said road to U. S. Highway 93, thence north along said highway through Missoula to Interstate 90, the point of beginning.

210 - John Long Range: Those portions of Missoula and Granite Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at Drummond, thence southerly along U. S. Highway 10A to the junction with State Route 38 near Porter's Corner, thence westerly along said road to the main Rock Creek Road, thence north along said road to State Route 348, thence northerly along said road to the Slide Rock-Upper Willow Creek Road, thence northerly and westerly along said road to the Miller Creek Road, thence northerly along said road to Interstate Highway 90, thence easterly along said highway to Drummond, the point of beginning.

211 - Upper Rock Creek: That portion of Granite County lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at Skalkaho Pass, thence east along State Route 38 to its junction with the East Fork of Rock Creek Road, thence south along the East Fork Road to its junction with the East Fork of Rock Creek Trail, thence easterly along the East Fork Reservoir, thence southerly along the East Fork Trail to its junction with the Page Creek Trail, thence easterly up the Page Creek Trail to its junction with the Continental Divide near Mt. Tiney, thence along the Continental Divide in a southerly direction to the Bitterroot River-Rock Creek Divide, thence along said divide in a northerly direction to State Route 38, the point of beginning.

212 - North Flint Range: Those portions of Granite and Powell Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at Drummond, thence in a southeasterly direction along Interstate Highway 90 to the Race Track Creek Bridge, thence up Race Track Creek in a westerly direction to Race Track Lake and the trail to Red Lion Road, thence southerly down the Red Lion Road to its junction with U. S. Highway 10A at Georgetown Lake, thence in a northerly direction to U. S. Highway 10A to Drummond, the point of beginning.

NOTE: A portion of the State Prison Ranch property west of Deer Lodge, as posted, shall be closed to all big game hunting. Great Kohrs Ranch near Deer Lodge closed to hunt.

213 - South Flint Range: Those portions of Granite, Powell and Deer Lodge Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at the junction of the Red Lion Road and U. S. Highway 10A at Georgetown Lake, thence in a northerly direction along Red Lion Road and Trail to Race Track Lake, thence in an easterly direction along Race Track Creek to the bridge on Interstate Highway 90, thence along Interstate Highway 90 in a southerly direction to its junction with U. S. Highway 10A, thence along U. S. Highway 10A in a westerly direction to its junction with the Red Lion Road, the point of beginning.

214 - Mill Creek-Georgetown Lake: Those portions of Deer Lodge and Granite Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at the junction of U. S. Highway 10A and State Route 274 (Mill Creek Road), thence in a southerly direction along said road to the Continental Divide, thence in a westerly direction along said divide to the Page Creek Trail, thence northerly down said trail to its junction with the East Fork of Rock Creek Trail, thence northerly along said trail to the Rock Creek Reservoir, thence north and north along the East Fork Road to its junction with State Route 38, thence north along said road to its junction with U. S. Highway 10A at Porter's Corner, thence east along U. S. Highway 10A to its junction with State Route 274, the point of beginning.

215 - East Deer Lodge: Those portions of Deer Lodge and Powell counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at Garrison Junction, thence in an easterly direction along U. S. Highway 12 to the Continental Divide at MacDonald Pass, thence in a southerly direction along said divide to the Silver Bow County Line, thence in a southerly direction along said county line to its junction with Interstate Highway 90, thence north along said highway to the Garrison Junction, the point of beginning.

216 - West Rock Creek-Quigg Peak: Those portions of Granite and Missoula Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at Skalkaho Pass, thence northerly along the Bitterroot-Rock Creek Divide to Trail No. 215, thence easterly along said trail to the Rock Creek Road at Eagle Creek-Cable Crossing, thence north along said road to the Slide Rock-Upper Willow Creek Road at Brewster Creek, thence southerly along said road to its junction with the Rock Creek-Philipsburg Road, thence westerly along said road to the main Rock Creek Road, thence south along said road to its junction with State Route 38, thence westerly along said road to Skalkaho Pass, the point of beginning.

240 - West Bitterroot: Those portions of Missoula and Ravalli Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at Florence, thence south on U. S. Highway 93 to its junction with County Road 62 near the river bridge north of Hamilton, thence along said road to its junction with County Road 68, thence along State Route 269 (Eastside Highway) along the East Fork Road to its junction with U. S. Highway 93, thence south along U. S. Highway 93 to Tin Cup Creek, thence west along said creek to the Idaho-Idaho State Line, thence northward along said divide to the Bitterroot River-South Fork Lolo Creek divide, thence northeast along said divide to Lolo Peak, thence east to Carlton Lake, thence easterly along the Carlton Lake road to U. S. Highway 93, thence south along said highway to Florence, the point of beginning.

250 - West Fork Bitterroot: That portion of Ravalli County lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at the junction of Tin Cup Creek and U. S. Highway 93, thence in a southerly direction along U. S. Highway 93 to the Montana-Idaho Border, thence in a southerly and northerly direction along the Montana-Idaho Border to Tin Cup Creek headwaters, thence in an easterly direction down Tin Cup Creek to its junction with U. S. Highway 93, the point of beginning.

260 - Bitterroot-Clark Fork Archery District: Those portions of Missoula and Ravalli Counties lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at Lolo, thence north on U. S. Highway 93 to the Big Flat Road (Missoula County Route 30), thence northerly along said road to Harper's Bridge across the Clark Fork River, thence westerly down said river to the first Interstate 90 bridge west of the Ninemile Interchange, thence easterly along Interstate 90 to its intersection with Highway 93 at Missoula, thence southerly along said highway to the Skalkaho Road (State Highway 38), thence northerly along said road to the K. O. Ranch Road, thence south on said road to its end, thence south along the eastside Montana Power Company "B" Power Line to the Eightmile Creek Road, thence south along said road to its junction with the eastside Highway (State Routes 203, 268, and 269), thence south on said highway to its junction with U. S. Highway 93 at Hamilton, thence south on Highway 93 to its junction with State Route 38, thence south along said road to its junction with State Route 501, thence south along said road to its junction with County Road 87, thence south along said road to its junction with U. S. Highway 93 at Como, thence north along Highway 93 to its junction with the Roaring Lion Road, thence west along said road to its junction with County Road 68, thence north along said road to its junction with County Road 62, thence north along said road to its junction with U. S. Highway 93 at Riverside Bridge, thence north along Highway 93 to Lolo, the point of beginning.

261 - East Bitterroot: That portion of Ravalli County lying within the following-described boundary: Beginning at Skalkaho Pass, thence west along State Highway 38 to U. S. Gallatin Closed Area: Those portions of Gallatin and Madison Counties lying within the following described boundary: Beginning at Daly Pass on the Yellowstone National Park boundary, thence in a northwesterly direction following the horse trail to the headwaters of the South Fork of Buffalo Horn Creek...

Gates of the Mountains Game Preserve: Beginning in section 2, township 12 north, range 3 west at the southeast corner of upper Holter Lake and proceeding westerly along the northern shoreline of said upper Holter Lake...

GRANT KOHRS RANCH NEAR DEER LODGE closed to hunting.

Green Meadow Game Preserve: Beginning at a point in the southeast quarter of section 13 where the Silver Road runs north, thence following said road through section 13 and continuing through section 14 to a point in the northeast portion where the Scratch Gravel Road runs east-west...

Lincoln Archery District: Refer to legal description of deer- elk district 284.

Lincoln Closed Area: Section 24, T14N, R9W, shall be closed to big game hunting. This comprises the area around the town of Lincoln.

Lone Pine Game Preserve: Beginning at the northeast corner of section 19, township 28 north, range 21 west, following the north boundary of section 19 in a westerly direction 1 mile; thence continuing in a northerly and westerly direction following the Kalspell-Foy's Lake highway...

Manhattan Game Preserve: Beginning at the intersection of the west bank of the West Gallatin River and the south line of the right of way of the main line of the Northern Pacific Railway Company as the same extends between Belgrade and Manhattan, Montana, running thence west along the south boundary line of said railroad right of way to a point near the road which leads to the ranch entrance of the R. A. Young Ranch...

Medicine Lake National Wildlife Refuge: Portions open to antelope hunting. See antelope district 641.

Milk River Game Management Area: Hunting by shotgun or bow and arrow only as posted and as described under current regulations.

McLean Game Preserve: SW1/4, NE1/4, S1/4, NW1/4, SW1/4 of section 5, township 28 north, range 3 west; lots 4, 5, 6, 7, SE1/4, SW1/4, NE1/4, NW1/4, E1/2, NE1/4, SE1/4, NW1/4, E1/2, SW1/4 section 6, township 28, range 3 west; NW1/4, NE1/4, NW1/4 lot 1, section 7 township 28, range 3 west; NW1/4, NW1/4, section 8 township 28, range 3 west; lots 1, 2, 3, and 4, section 1, township 28, range 4 west; S1/2, NW1/4 section 1, township 28, range 4 west; S1/2, SE1/4 section 35, township 29, range 4 west; Pondera County, Montana.

Old Steel Bridge: That portion of District 170 in Flathead County lying in Sections 9, 10, 15, and 16 of Township 28N, Range 21W, within the following-described boundary: Beginning at the Old Steel Bridge on the Flathead River, thence following the course of said road in a westerly direction to the Stillwater River, thence down the east bank of the Stillwater River to its confluence with the Flathead River, thence up the west bank of the Flathead River to the Old Steel Bridge, the point of beginning.

M., thence north following section line to the northwest corner of section 20, the same township and range; thence east following section line to the northeast corner of section 22, same township and range; thence south along section line to the southeast corner of section 34, same township and range; thence east along township line to the northeast corner of said section 3, township 16 north, range 15 west; thence south along section line to the southeast corner of said section 3, thence west along section line to the southwest corner of section 5, same township and range; thence north along section line to the northwest corner of said section 5; thence west along township line to the southwest corner of section 32, township 17 north, range 15 west, the place of beginning, all of which is in Missoula County, Montana.

Skalkaho Game Preserve: Beginning at Eagle Point, thence south along the Bitterroot-Rock Creek Divide to Skalkaho Pass, thence westerly along state route 38 to U.S. Forest Service trail 108, thence northwesterly along said trail to the Gird-Skalkaho Divide road near Gird Point, thence northerly along said road to Skalkaho Mountain, thence northerly along the old trail to Fool Hen (Willow) Lake, thence north down the old trail following a line of Willow Creek to the Willow Creek-Burnt Fork Lake Trail (Forest Trail 300), thence easterly along said trail to Burnt Fork Lake, thence northerly along Trail 321 (Burnt Fork Trail), to Trail 147 thence easterly along Trail 147 to Eagle Point, the point of beginning.

Sun River Game Preserve: Beginning at a point on the Continental Divide of the Rocky Mountains, due south of the head or source of the south fork of the north fork of Sun River, in what will be, when surveyed, section 8, township 18 north of range 10 west, Montana meridian, thence due north from the crest of the Continental Divide to the head of the south fork of the north fork of Sun River, thence northerly along and down the course of the south fork of the north fork of Sun River as it winds and turns to its confluence with the north fork of the north fork of Sun River; thence northerly along the course of the north fork of the north fork of Sun River as it winds and turns to its head or source; thence due north to the crest of the Continental Divide of the Rocky Mountains; thence along the crest of the Continental Divide of the Rocky Mountains southwesterly and southerly to the place of beginning, intending hereby to include in said game preserve all that territory lying between the south fork of the north fork and the north fork of the north fork of Sun River on the east and the Continental Divide of the Rocky Mountains on the west.

Teton-Spring Creek Bird Preserve - Special Archery Season: For the better protection and propagation of birds, the following described area in Teton County, State of Montana, is hereby set aside and established as a state bird preserve, to be known as the Teton-Spring Creek Bird Preserve: All of Sections 2, 3, 4, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, and 15 in township 24 north, range 5 west.

The department may open all or part of the Teton-Spring Creek Bird Preserve for a special archery season in accordance with 87-1-304 and 87-2-708.

Warm Springs Game Preserve: All of sections 13, 14, 23, and 24, except such portions of these sections that lie south of the Anaconda-Warm Springs highway or east of the Butte-Oer Lodge highway, all in township 5 north, range 10 west.



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
