Today the newer Cannas, lower growing and bearing brilliant flowers, are being used more and more by smart gardeners. ## NOT FUSSY ABOUT SOIL

Connas may be planted in almost any kind of soil but prefer a rather heavy soil where they should be planted three to four inches deep. They may be allowed to stay in the ground in the autumn as long as they continue to grow and should be left until the tops are touched by the frost. They then may be dug and stored for the winter.

## VARIETY IN ITS COLOR RANGE

MISS BLOOMINGTON
Doz. $\$ 1.15$
A fine canary-yellow with many florets open, arranged ideally along a good spike. A most decorative type of Gladiolus, particularly attractive when used to set off darker spots in the border or to contrast with the deeper-toned Gladiolus. A fine variety for cutting, one to lend brightness and cheer to your arrangement.

## PELEGRINA
