Published in 1796, Letters Written During a Short Residence in Sweden, Norway, and Denmark is a personal travel narrative by the eighteenth-century British feminist writer **Mary Wollstonecraft** (1759 - 1797). The twenty-five letters cover a wide range of topics, from sociological reflections on Scandinavia and its peoples to philosophical questions regarding identity. Published by Wollstonecraft's career-long publisher, Joseph Johnson, it was the last work issued during her lifetime. This collection of letters was Wollstonecraft's most popular book in the 1790s—it sold well and was reviewed favorably by most critics.
