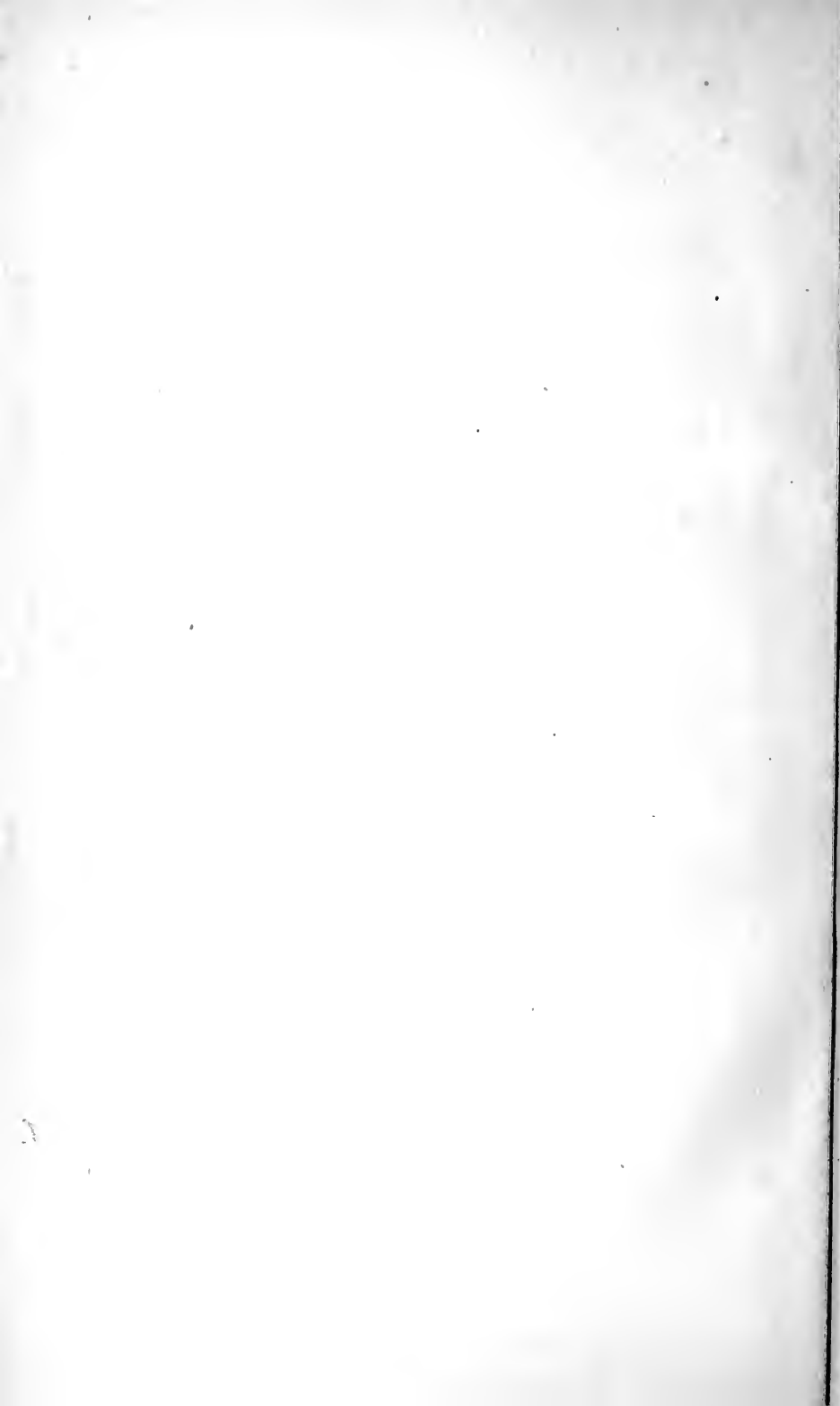

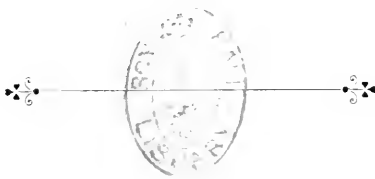

- ANDERSON, Musgrave Wroughton, 1848-52. Brother of F. L. M. Anderson (above), *b.* 1836. Governor of the Goldfields, Australia, *d.* 1870.

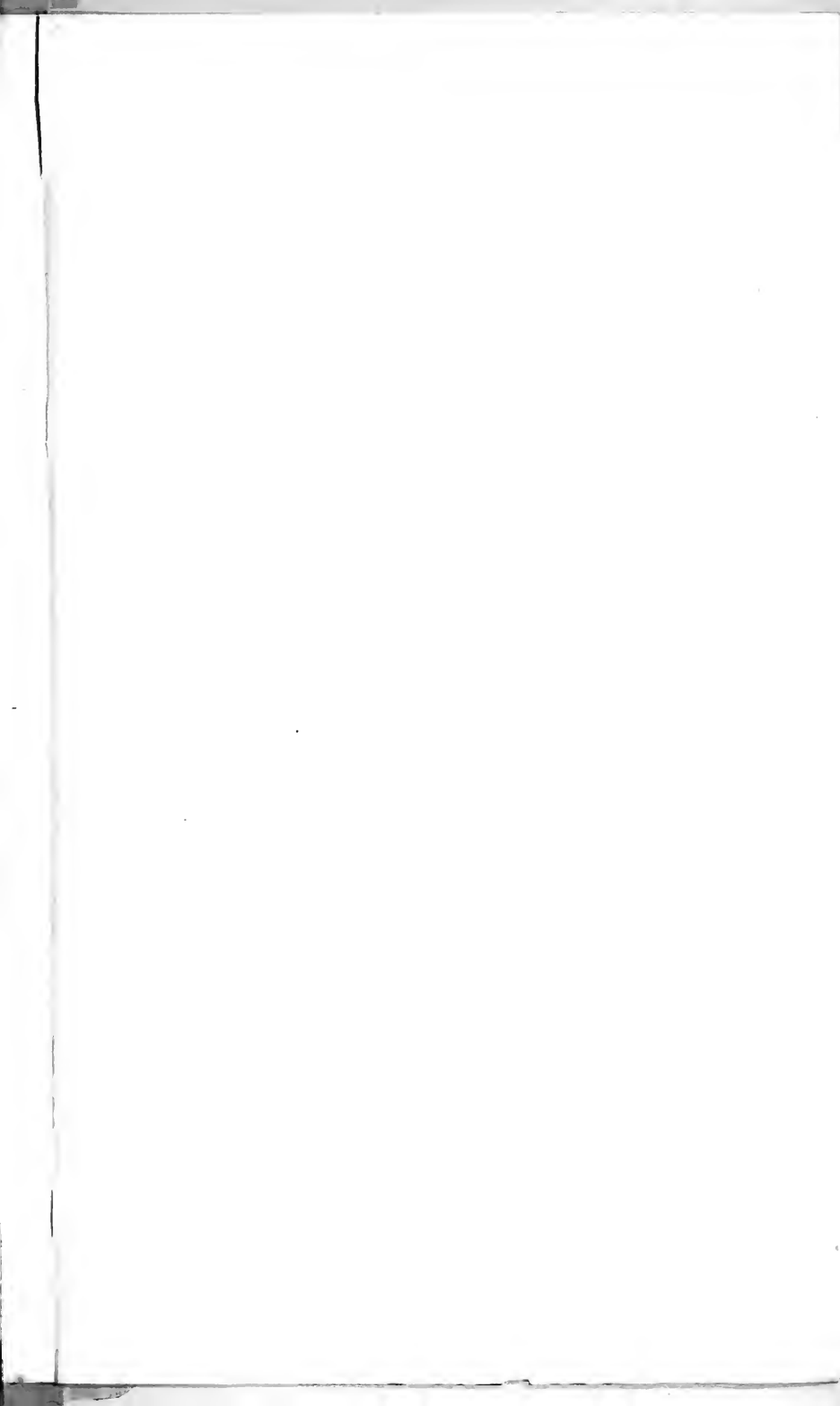

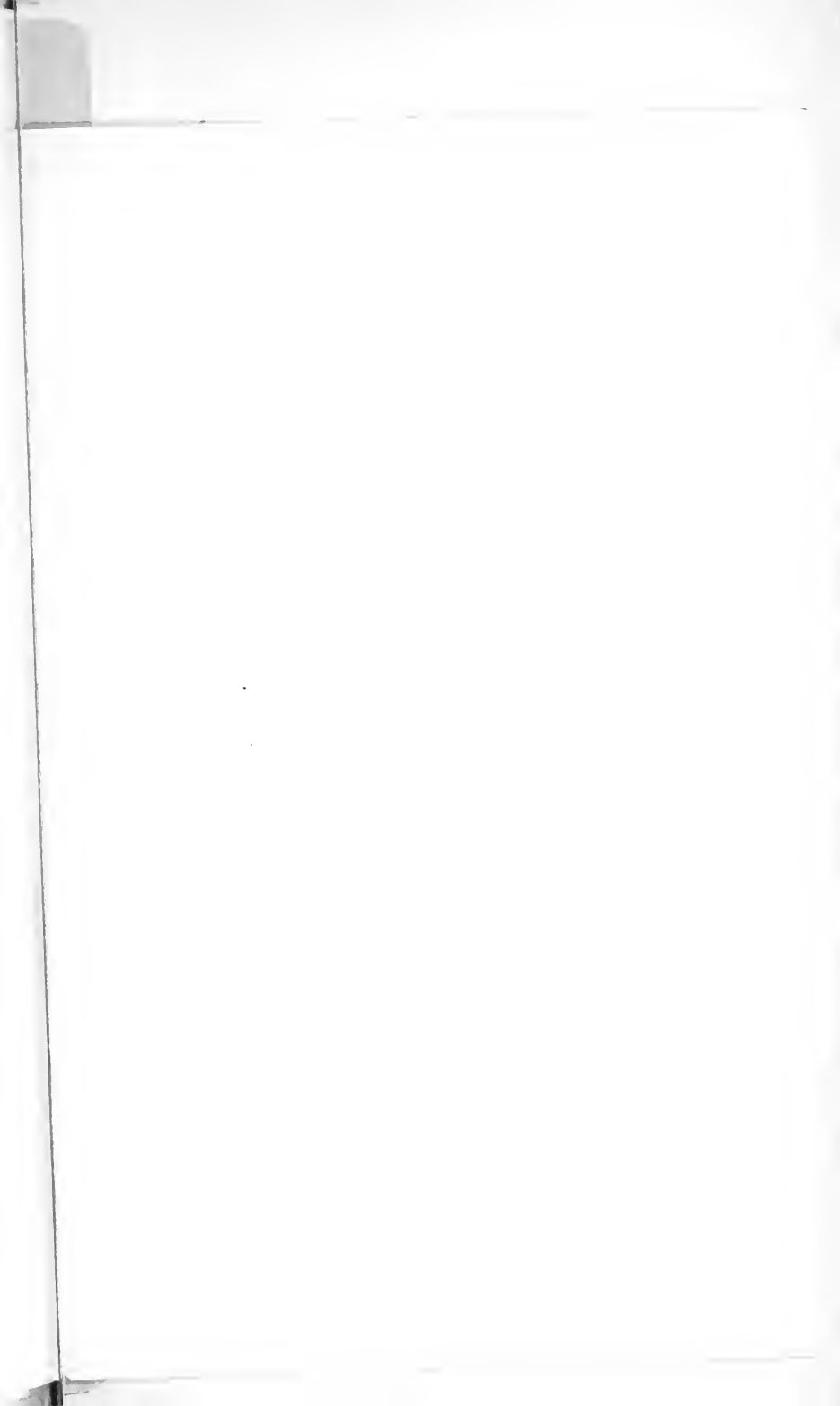
