It was nineteen hundred and fifty-five. Thirty-five seniors were present for enrollment in August of 1955. Class officers for our senior year were Don Honeycutt, President; Alton Lentz, Vice President; Jahala Treece, Treasurer; Ruby Lelfer, Secretary. Our home room advisor was Mrs. Maratha Rogers.

Publication of the yearbook, The Londoner, was a project of the senior class with Alton Lentz as editor. The play "LittleWomen" was directed by Mrs. Rogers. Those taking part were Joyce Hahn, Helen Palmer, Judy Lowder, Sylvia Howard, Mary A. Smith, June Williams, Alton Lentz, Shelvia J. Turner, Joe Calloway, James Moss and Rayvon Morton.
