Publication of the yearbook, The Londoner, was a project of the senior class with Alton Lentz as editor. The play "LittleWomen" was directed by Mrs. Rogers. Section 11. To you, Mrs. Rogers, each member of the Senior Class leaves his sincere appreciation for your friendship and understanding throughout our high school years.


