Billy & I walked to the Coast
White Cedar Swamp at Merrick
described in a pamphlet by
Norman Taylor, Brooklyn Botanic Garden.
Fair Clear Cold Morning.

Left home at 8.10 & reached
the swamp at Bunkers pond
at 10.15, partly exploring it
until 12.45. Everything but
the stream frozen solid.

This is a most interesting place
and should in Spring, Summer &
Autumn be attractive to botanists.
Very rough & alas the trees
below Bunkers pond are being
cut down & part have been
destroyed by fire.

At the road passing Mr

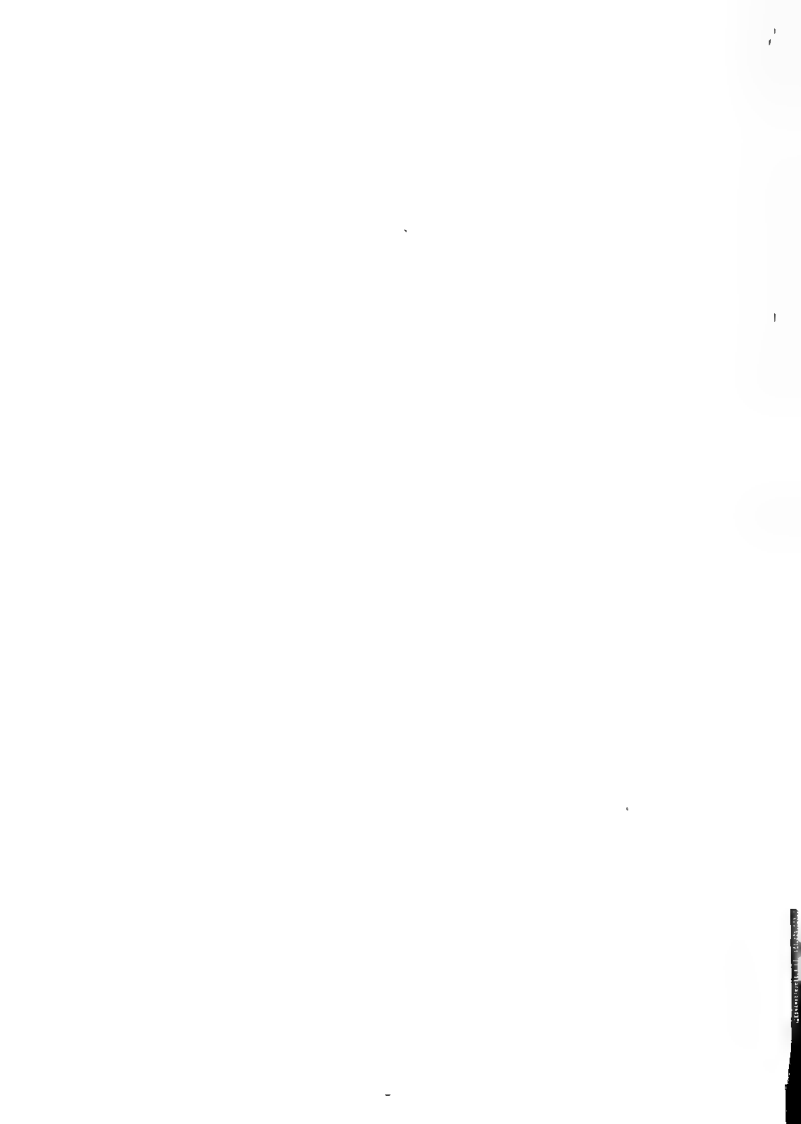
