A KILOWATT HOUR?

That's Easy!

A kilowatt hour is really not difficult to understand. Electricity is measured in units of pressure (volts) and in units of current flow (amperes). Multiply these two together and you have a unit of power, the watt. The watt is a relatively small unit and it is customary to use 1,000 watts, or a kilowatt as a practical base of measurement of electricity. A KILOWATT HOUR represents the use of one kilowatt (1,000 watts) for one hour. It represents energy equivalent to one and one third horsepower. It is the unit of measurement used in your electric bill, and the residential customers of the Carolina Power & Light Company pay an average of two and seven-tenths cents for each kilowatt hour of electricity used.

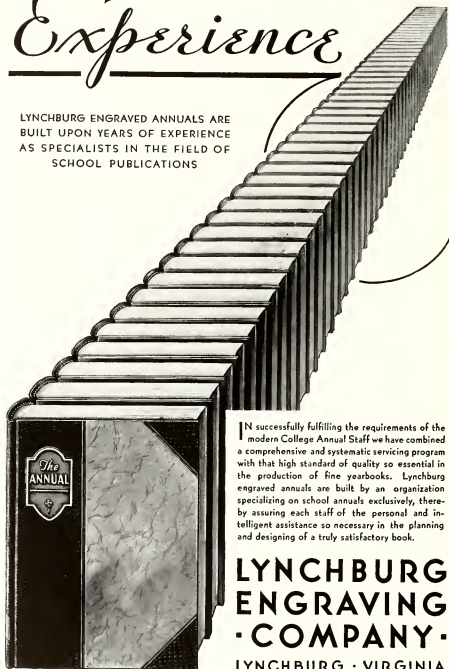
