"We the students of Peace College and members of the Student Government Association propose this constitution to promote the feeling of individual and group responsibility for upholding the highest standards of college life, to encourage each member to include in her own code of ethics the highest standards of honor and integrity, to encourage full student co-operation and participation in the various phases of self-government, and to promote understanding and co-operation between students and faculty based on mutual interests and objectives." The foregoing is the Preamble of the Constitution of the Student Government Association of Peace College.

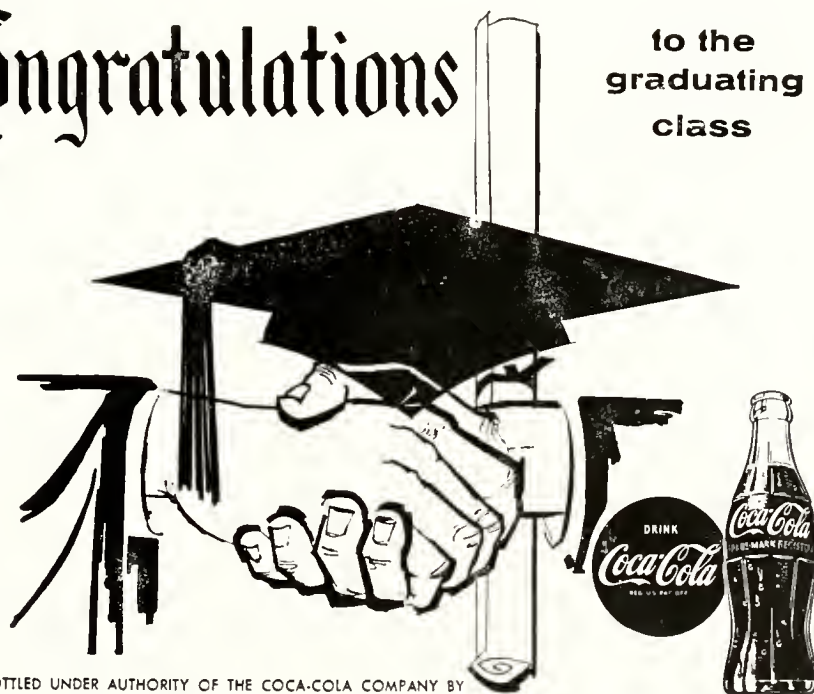

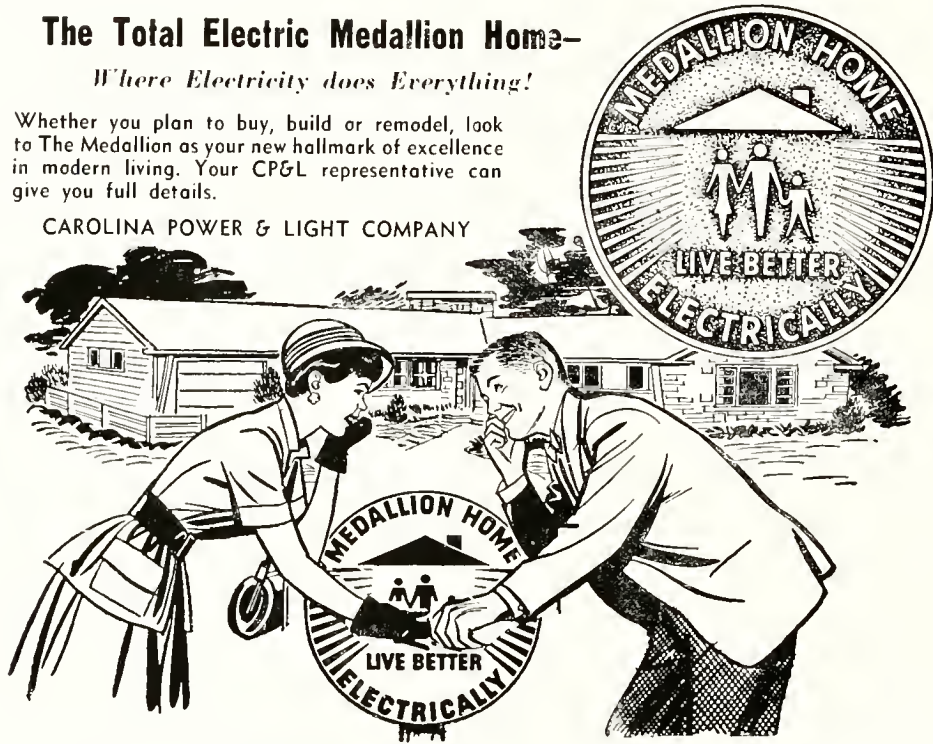

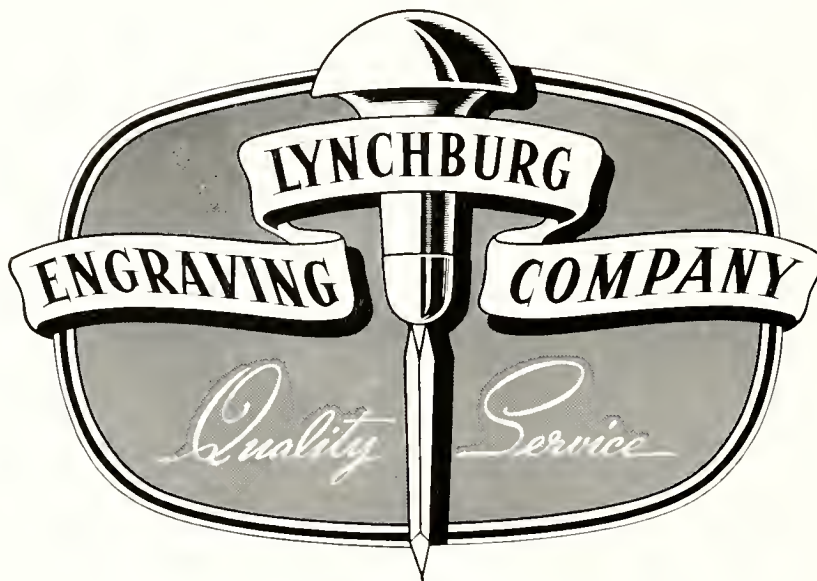
