


The tradition of a commencement ceremony at Peace College is one long followed. Each student wears a formal white gown and carries thirteen red roses; although uniform in dress, each class is diverse but brought together to signify an accomplished goal.

Each graduate has certain people present at the ceremony who represent parts of her life thus far. Family and friends make her realize her roots and the reason for her strength. Administrators represent those she has followed and trusted for guidance while professors symbolize her achievements and role models.

Graduation is a rite of passage that each student undergoes in her journey through life. As she throws her rose into the fountain, she leaves a part of herself with Peace forever.

# Peace — At A Crossroads

Peace College to begin offering baccalaureate degree programs



FOR RELEASE ON 10/21/93. RALEIGH, N.C. -- Peace College, a liberal arts and sciences college for women, announced today that it plans to begin offering four-year baccalaureate degree programs in Biology, Business Management, Communications, Human Resources and Liberal Studies, effective fall 1995. The official announcement was made at the annual fall

meeting of the Peace College Board of Trustees. A celebration was then held on campus for Trustees, faculty, staff and students. Peace College, which was founded in 1857, historically has

offered two-year associate degree programs to an annual enrollment of approximately 500 women. In 1990, the College embarked upon a three-year study of its options for the future. This culminated, in 1992, in the Board of Trustee's unanimous approval to begin offering four-year baccalaureate degrees.

The five proposed baccalaureate majors were recently presented to the Board of Trustees. The College will continue to follow the guidelines for final approval that are set by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), with the first junior class to be enrolled in fall, 1995. The College will also maintain its Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, Associate of Fine Arts in Music, and Associate of Science in Business degrees.

"Studies we conducted and surveys we made of our current students, alumnae, prospective students and others convinced us several years ago that the time was right for Peace to add four-year degree programs," said Dr. Garrett Briggs, President of Peace since 1988. "This new direction allows us to retain the strengths we want to preserve, while we answer the educational and career needs of young women."

He added, "All of the majors were chosen because our

students have consistently expressed interest in these areas of study, or have gone on to pursue degrees and careers in these areas after leaving Peace. What we have kept in mind with all of our planning is that we want to attract outstanding young women who flourish best in a college where personal attention is





## At a Crossroad

In-depth essays, complicated readings, heated discussions and extensive lectures are all elements that make up the most demanding courses offered at Peace.

Academics at Peace is very demanding but not impossible. The school offers many study aids such as the Computer Center and the Writing Center. 








