



of spring semester, Peace College students begin to look forward to the traditions of Father-Daughter Day and Little-Sister Weekend.





The play chronicles the life of Jane Eyre, a young woman who comes to age in Victorian England. While still a young girl, her parents die, leaving her to work as a servant for the strict Mrs. Reed and her mischievous son. Jane, longing to see the far away tropics with trees sagging with oranges, contains an energy inside her. She tries desperately to be liked, but is met with harshness and cruelty. Eventually she is sent to a boarding school where she learns to teach, yet retains her innate desire for more. Jane later receives a position from the burly Mr. Rochester to be the governess for his bright young ward, Adele. As

she works in this strange yet beautiful manor, she falls in love with Rochester and intends to marry him. Her wedding day comes to an abrupt end however, when an impromptu visitor resurfaces from Rochester's past. She is taken in at the River's home and remains there to serve as the local schoolteacher until St. John Rivers proposes marriage. Jane is now forced to choose between two men: the missionary St. John and the gruff Rochester. She is drawn by the true love in her soul to Rochester, but upon returning to him, finds him blind, living among the ruins of his home. She embraces him and his past, finding a way to mesh her Victorian lifestyle with her deep-rooted passion.




