## Celebrating One Hundred Years!

Contained within these pages are a brief history of Peace College as seen through the eyes of thousands of women who walked the same walk we do everyday. They came years before us and helped pave the way for women throughout the country. This book is a reflection of how far we have come and a challenge to all of us to be pioneers in the world, to lead a life filled with adventure and to leave our marks for future Peace College women.



*Dr. James Dinwiddie*

Each year the Peace College yearbook was dedicated to a faculty or staff member of the college. The first publication of the Lotus was dedicated to Dr. James Dinwiddie. In 1901 he had already been an instructor at, what was then, Peace Institute for 12 years.



In the early years of the institution, Peace held several traditional events including the annula May Day Festival pictured above.



# Peace History

A First Presbyterian elder named William Peace donated \$10,000 and 8 acres of land to create an educational institution for women. In 1857 Peace Institute was established. However, the Civil War put a halt to the original plan for Peace. In 1861 the unfinished building of Main was being used as a hospital for the Confederate States. Interestingly, after the war was over, Main was utilized by the United States government for the local Freedman's Bureau offices.

Educational practices began in 1872 when the property was leased by a father and his son, Reverend Robert Burwell and John B. Burwell. For 18 years the two developed Peace's reputation for being a leader in the education of women. During their time at Peace, they created one of the South's first departments of art and painting in 1875. Peace also began the first kindergarten in the south in 1879. The very next year, the south's first cooking school emerged out of Peace.

Ten years later in 1890, Dr. James Dinwiddie leased Peace for a term of fifteen years. During this time in 1901 the college produced and published the first annual entitled *The Lotus*. The book was dedicated to Dr. Dinwiddie. Dr. Dinwiddie directed the flourishing and expanding school until 1907, at which time he stepped down due to his health. He then helped to ensure that the Peace remained affiliated with the Presbyterian Church and maintained its original purpose as an educational institution for women.

In 1930 Peace Institute was renamed Peace, a Junior College for Women. The school provided instruction for females in kindergarten through the college level. In 1939 Peace no longer offered teaching to grades seven through ten, and in 1940 the name Peace Junior College was given. Finally in 1943 the school was given the name Peace College. By 1969, Peace was solely a junior college. A decision came in June of 1992 that Peace advance to award baccalaureate degrees as well as associate degrees. In the year of 1996 Peace College was accredited with baccalaureate status. Today Peace offers associate of arts and science degrees and baccalaureate of arts and science degrees.

## *Lotus Cover Design*

In 1901, the very first yearbook staff designed a wonderful cover for the first book. It was green and white linen, small in size, but large in purpose. When this year's staff was working to select an appropriate cover for the 100th Anniversary Edition of the Lotus, we didn't have to look very far. With that original 1901-02 book in our hands, we designed the cover of this book as a replica of the first. Al-

though the Lotus has changed significantly over the years with the introduction of more photos and less copy as well as an expansion in size, the spirit of the book remains the same. It is a book that you will pull off your bookshelf on occasion and use to look back on your years at Peace College. We hope this book is as accurate at portraying life at Peace College in 2002 as it was for the many students who

enjoyed it in 1902. Scores of Peace Girls throughout history will look back to this book for inspiration in their lives and for a glimpse of what life was like at Peace College one hundred years after the first Lotus was produced. Enjoy your time at Peace as much as your Peace Sisters did when they were here when the 1901-02 Peace College Lotus was established.

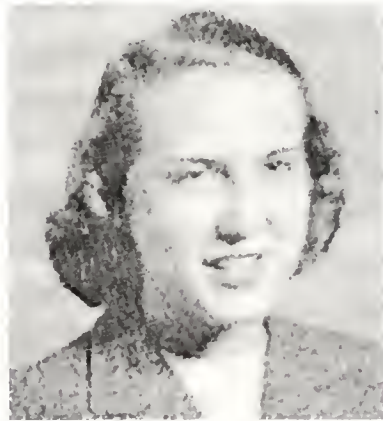

# What's Changed?

The pages of the first Lotus publications were filled with writings rather than pictures. The women used the book to publish favorite quotes, poems, concise biographies of students and faculty, and their own personal reflections on the past school year. These works show the women's intellect as well as their sense of humor. While sifting through earlier yearbooks it was amazing to see how things appear so different but are really the same.

## *Rules.*

All students who regard the following rules and regulations will have their names inscribed on the Honor Roll:

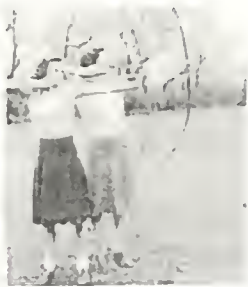
1. Students are requested to swing on the gate every afternoon between the hours of four and six and to smile at all passing boys.
2. Parents will be notified if students do not take their express from the office immediately on its arrival.
3. It is positively forbidden to mark clothing, on pain of expulsion.
4. Students are required to go shopping at least once a week without a teacher.
5. It is positively against the rules of the school for young ladies not to receive young men every Saturday night.
6. Girls are required to write to A. and M. boys.
7. Every girl is required to "hook" something from the table once a day.
8. Students are required to burn their candles three nights out of the week after light-bell.
9. In practicing, students should play only "two-steps."
10. Every boarder on time to meals must suffer the penalty of staying in on Monday.

## May Day

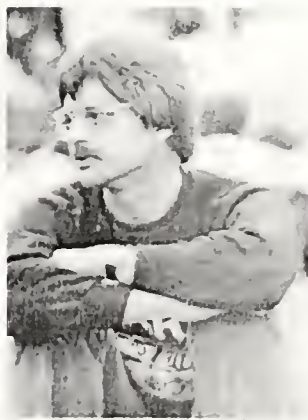

## Dedications

In earlier yearbooks, each publication of the Lotus was dedicated to a chosen member of the staff or faculty. In 1978 Mr. John Crossno was the recipient of the honor. The students said that Mr. Crossno was "the man who makes history come alive at Peace, the man who stands out among the faculty because he remembers your name and speaks to you in the hall, the man who comes early in the morning and leaves late in the afternoon, the man whose door is always open..."

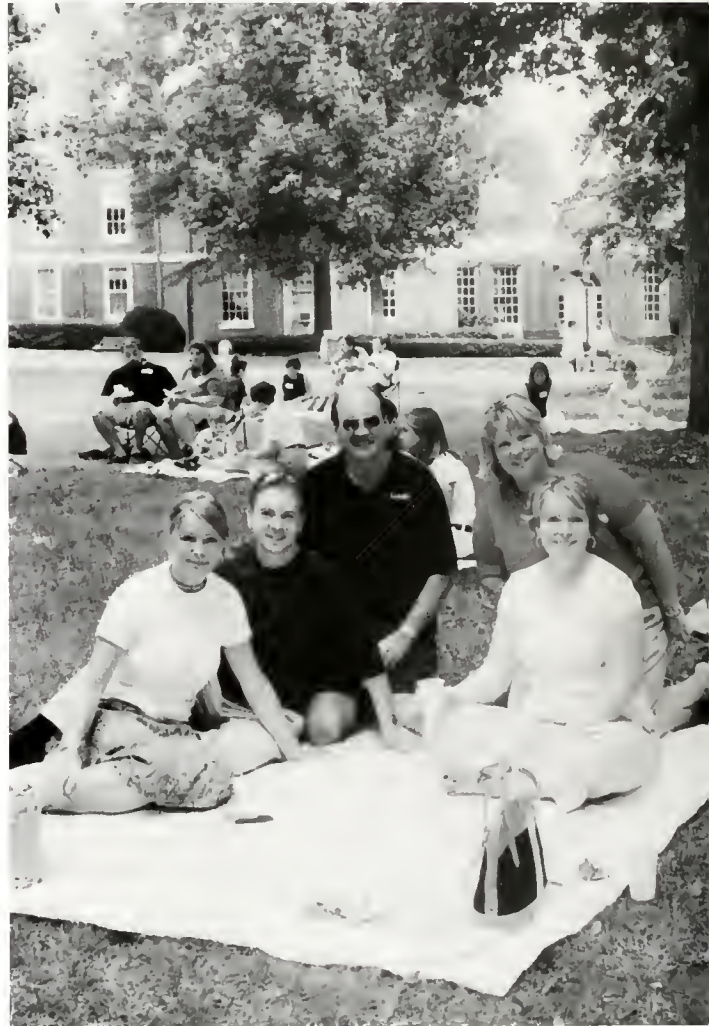

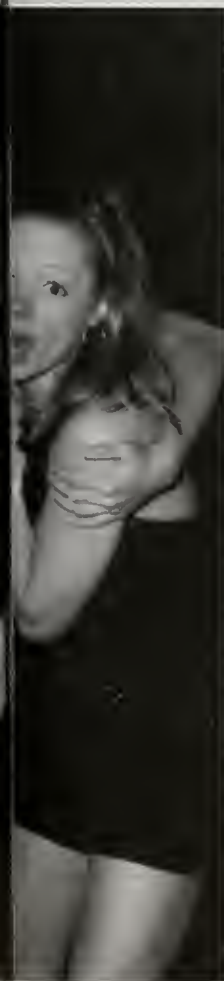

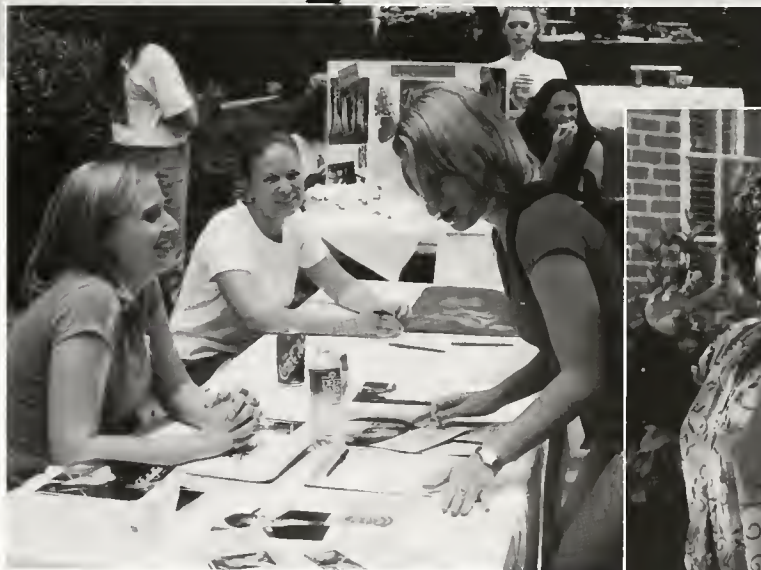

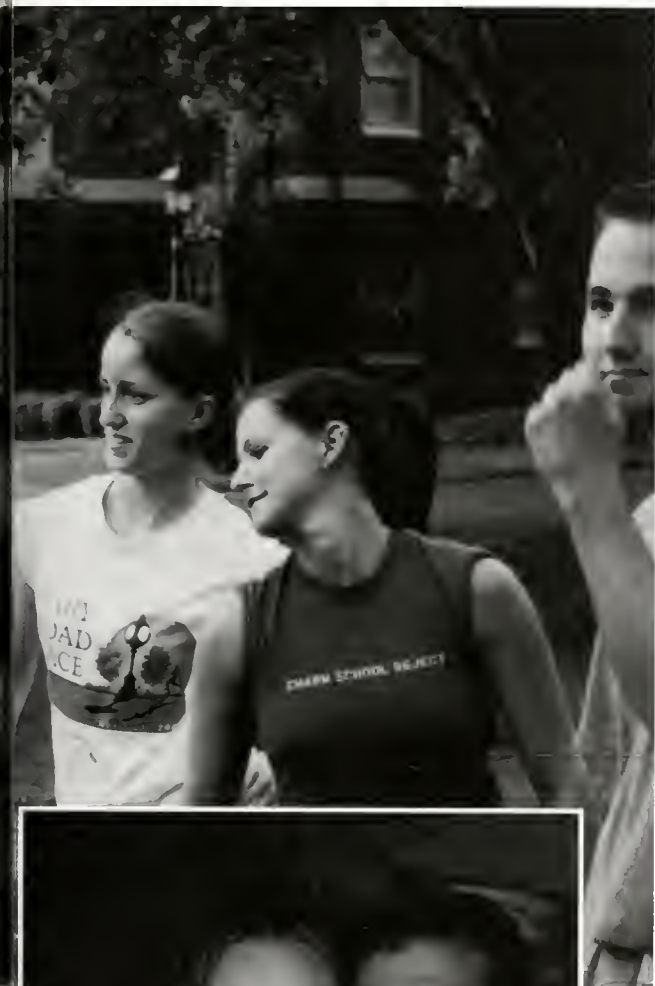

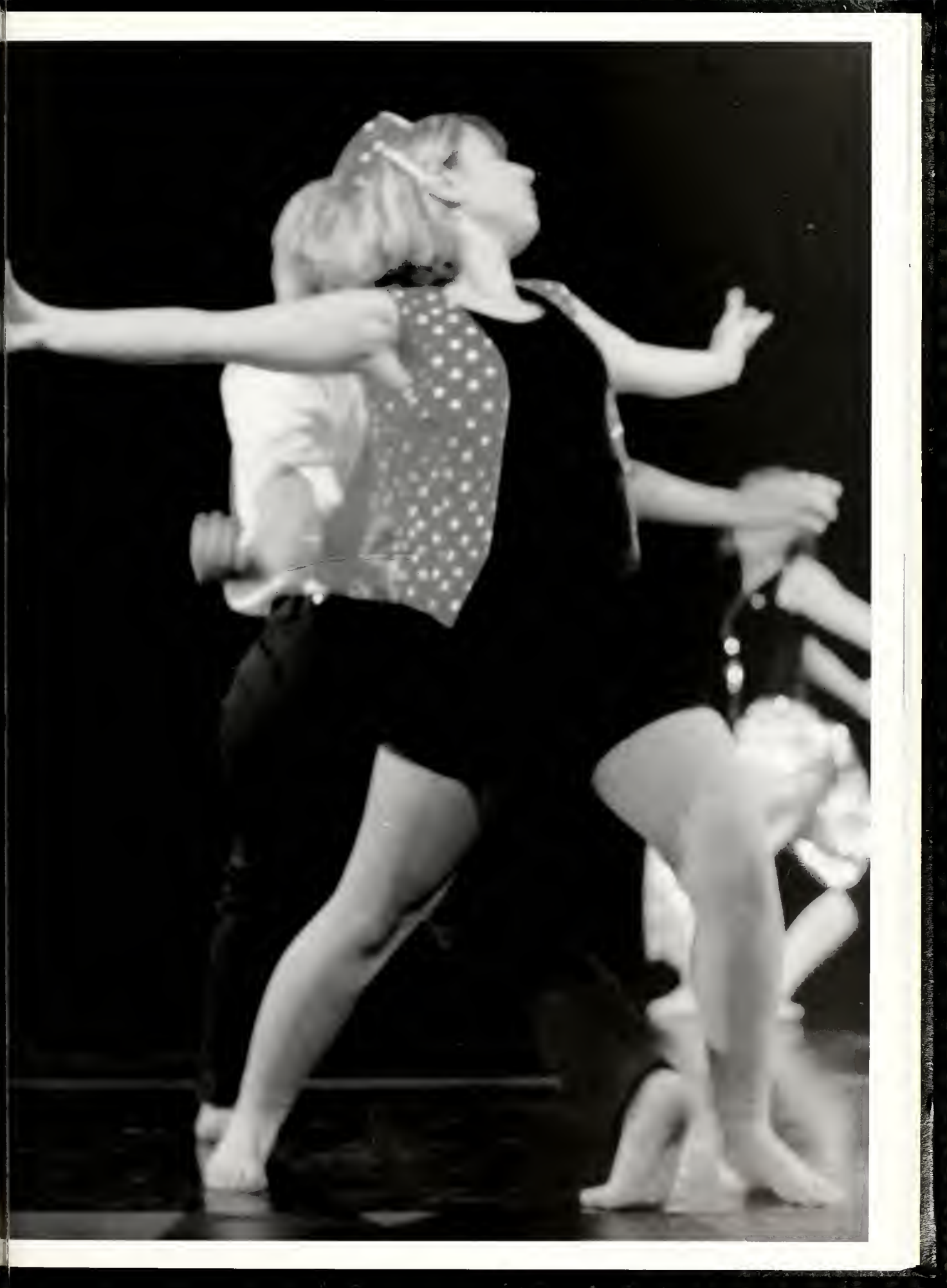
## Visual and Performing...It's Art!

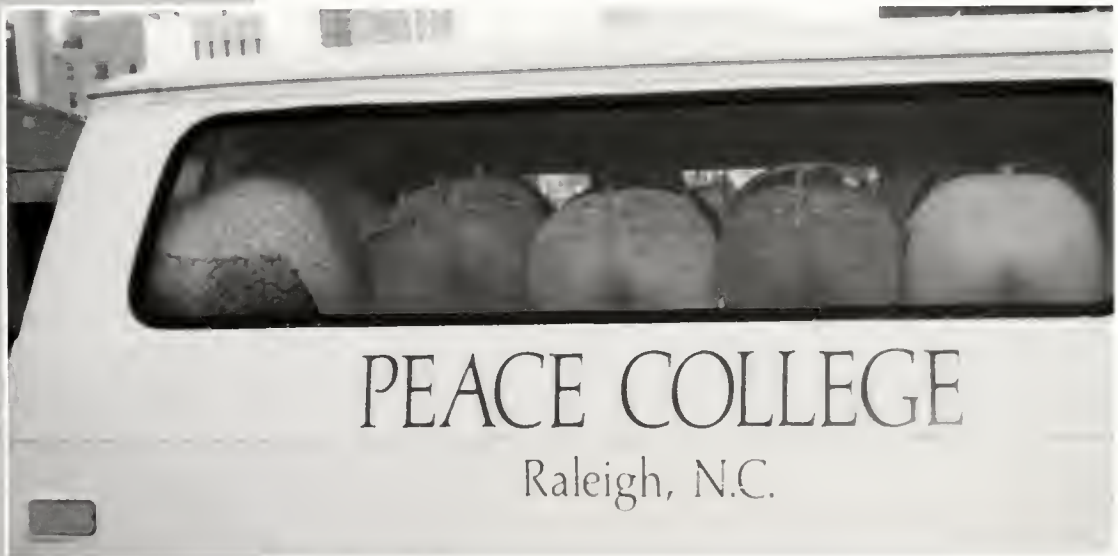

## All in the Timing

Set in the bayou of modern day Louisiana and featuring an original Cajun score by Glenn Mehrbach with David DiGiuseppe on the accordion and guitar.

Twins Sebastian and Viola are separated during a shipwreck off the coast of Illyria; each believes the other dead. Viola disguises herself as a boy named Cesario and enters the service of Duke Orsino, who thinks he is in love with the Lady Olivia. Orsino sends Viola-Cesario to plead his cause to Olivia, who promptly falls in love with the messenger. Viola, meanwhile, is in love with Orsino, and when her twin, Sebastian, is rediscovered, many comic situations of mistaken identity ensue. There is a brutal but hilarious subplot involving the members of Lady Olivia's household *Feste* the jester, Maria, Olivia's uncle Sir Toby Belch, and Sir Toby's friend Sir Andrew Aguecheek *who* scheme to undermine the high-minded, pompous Malvolio. Having been completely humiliated, Malvolio is the only solitary figure among the pairs of happy lovers. In his typically atypical fashion, Shakespeare interrupts the happy proceedings at the end of the play with Malvolio's disquieting curse.

The play pokes prickly *sometimes sinister* gender bending fun at wooing and the folly of lovers. Duke Orsino, for example, is in love with the state of being in love, and Lady Olivia's initial vow of isolation to honour her dead brother is exposed as excessive and even self-indulgent. No one can be made whole it seems until Sebastian and Viola have found each other again.

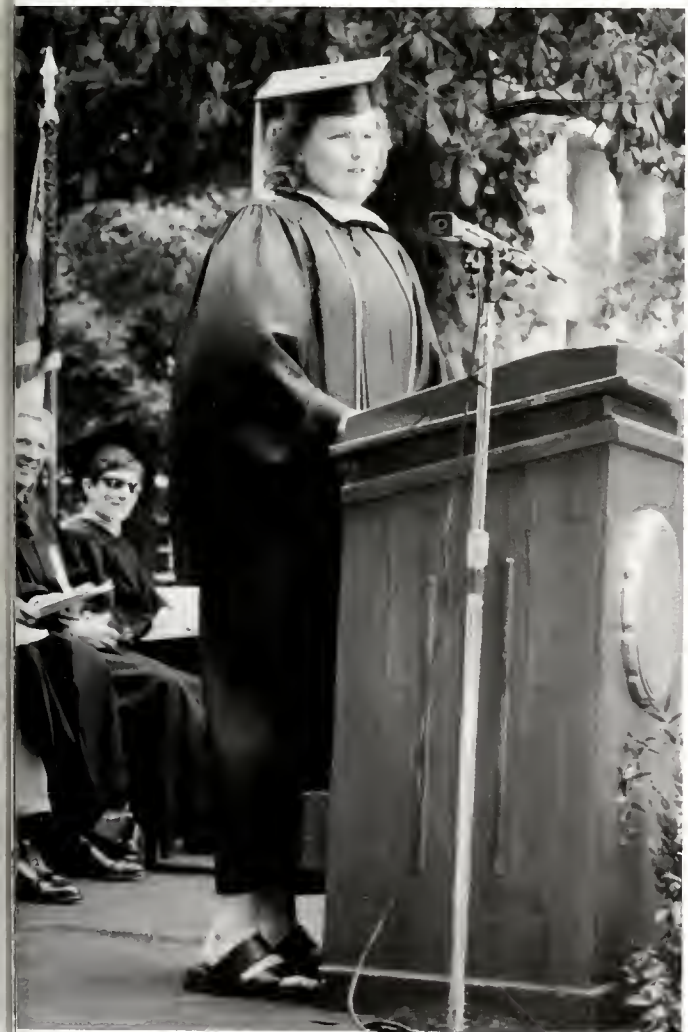
