

Peace College is lucky to have Kenny G. Gannon. Ditto local theater audiences. As the Theatre Studies head for the past seven years, Gannon has quietly built an innovative, intriguing and entertaining body of work. Whether it be all-female casts in Shakespeare, recent English and American works, or original student dramas, Gannon's offerings always have professional polish, strong viewpoints and physical vitality. These qualities are evident with his current production of Henrik Ibsen's "Little Eyolf." It is one of the famed Norwegian playwright's least known and produced works, but like his classics, "A Doll's House" and "The Wild Duck," it deals with disintegrating human relationships and passionate secrets.

Eyolf is the crippled son of Alfred and Rita Allmers. The boy is the focus of the pair's marital problems, stemming from Alfred's decision to renounce his work and spend more time with Eyolf. Rita is jealous because Alfred pays more attention to him than to her. She also resents the special bond between Alfred and his sister Asta, who has been Eyolf's teacher. As the darker nature of the brother-sister relationship and the truth concerning Eyolf's injury are revealed, a tragedy occurs and changes all the relationships forever.

Even before the play begins, the foreboding set suggests turmoil and pain. Designer Sonya Leigh Drum's three interlocking platforms seem to float over a whirlpool of angry waters, suggested by concentric bands of red, orange and umber. Lighting designer Paul B. Marsland focuses the attention dramatically through searing shafts of intense white, relieved only by occasional mottled shadows for the play's few relaxed moments. Gannon has given great energy and thrust to

the play by creating a script pared down to the essentials. At 75 minutes with no intermission, the production moves at a fevered pace, keeping the emotions at a boil and the tensions ever ready to snap. He stages the action starkly in the purposely tight playing space, literally giving the characters nowhere to escape. Sound plays a major role, from shouting crowds to rushing water to gnawing vermin, completing the intense world that Gannon conjures.

As in all Ibsen, there are layers of meaning, symbolism and character. For his two adult male characters, Gannon has strong area actors who invest their roles with all three. Jay O'Berski gives Alfred hints of madness and amorous recklessness, balancing the character's conflicting elements. Roman Pearah brings cocky assurance to Borgheim, the civil engineer who doggedly courts Asta.

The main female roles are tall orders for any actresses. First-year students Gina Kelly (Rita) and Meredith Wood (Asta) enact their parts with dignity and precision, if not a full measure of depth and subtlety. Kelly is best in her quietly haunted moments, achieving wonderfully dark moods. Wood shows flickers of the underlying fear and passion that disturb Asta, but they are not sustained enough to give the character full life. (Heather Mercer plays Asta on alternating nights.)

Experienced senior Megan Brown lustily enlivens her cameo as the Rat Wife, a witchlike creature whose vermin control method incites the main tragedy. Cole Leiter gives Eyolf nice dimension in his brief appearance.

There are distractions — weak projection from the female leads, sound effects at too high a volume, footsteps magnified into stomps by the set's platforms. But they do not blemish the production's impact.
















