




FOUNTAIN AND ENTRANCE TO MAIN BUILDING


ORIGINAL BUILDING Erected in 1802




THE NEW ALTAR Scene From Patriotic Pageant








MAIN AND MEMORIAL BUILDINGS






To do efficient work, a trained mind, controlled by a quickened soul, needs a well developed healty body. Outdoor sports and games are encouraged, and out-door exercise is required.




EARTH'S TASK—TO RELIGHT THE TORCH Scene from Patriotic Pageant

Each student is examined by the College Physician, and exercise calculated to develop is given. The purpose is to keep the girl well, and a skilled physician and trained nurse are at thy service.




ATHLETIC CLUB No. 1

Training in Swedish gymnastics under the direction of the Physical Director is required of each girl, unless excused by the College Physician, and a fee of \$3.00 is charged for this.




Ribbon Dance Scene from Patriotic Pageant
