


MARSTON COAT OF ARMS

OF THE YORKSHIRE CO. FAMILY.

PRELUDE: — In the manuscript of David Jeffries was found a drawing of the arms and crest, and below it, in his hand writing, was this inscription: "Marston of Hemmedhemstead, in the County of Hertford, Anno 1639"; also the Blazon of the arms; "Azure, a chevron embattled, or, between three lion's heads, erased, crowned, or. (Mantled): Crest; a lion's head, erased, per chevron azure, and or, crowned, and langued, gules."



The above engraving was found with Admiral John Marston, of Philadelphia; also with Mr. Sanford K. Marston, of Onarga, Ill., having been brought from England a few years ago.

Arms described: A blue *shield*, with a *chevron* of gold, embrasured as battlements, and situated between three golden, crowned lion's heads, *broken* off. Crest: a lion's head, same as the others, placed above the escutcheon, open month, and protruding red tongue. Mantled; embellished with scroll work, foliage and flowers on both sides of the escutcheon.



THE YORKSHIRE ESCUTCHEON ANALYZED AND EXPLAINED.

This Escutcheon was one of the most honorable, most magnificent and costly in the whole domain of English Heraldry. Every one of its charges are characteristic of Royalty, and wrought of gold. The lion is an emblem of Sovereignty, and only those who are in some manner connected with the Royal family are permitted to bear it for a charge on their shields; hence this family must have married with Royal blood at some early date. crowned lion's head broken off signified that a Royal crowned head had fallen, — a royal line was broken by force of arms, referring to the overthrow and death of King Harold, at the battle of Hastings, Oct. 14, 1066, by William the Conqueror, and his allies, of whom was a Marston, titled, and commanding an army corps. chevron embattled also suggests war and battles. blue shield represents the British Kingdom, and the yellow golden charges point to the Prince of Orange, who had seized the throne. The mantle is of the most beautiful and elaborate scroll-work, surmounted by roses. Doubtless this part was added since the war of the "Roses," when Henry VII of Lancaster, married Elizabeth of York, daughter of Edward IV, in 1485, and thus united the two Houses. We presume, on the sinister side, is the Rose gules, for Lancaster; on the dexter is Rose argent, for York.

Note. The right and left sides of a shield are the reverse of that of the beholder. In heraldry the rose has no stalk.

York is the most ancient of British cities, and long before the Roman invasion, was its chief town. It was the seat of the Roman government during their rule in Britain. There Constantine Chlovus died, and his son, Constantine the Great, is supposed to have been born. It did not surrender to William I, till 1070, after much bloodshed. Near by it was fought the last great battle of the "Roses"; as also Cromwell's last great battle, which decided the fate of Charles I.

PREFACE.

DEAR FRIENDS:-

Perhaps you are desirous to know what motive induced me to compile this genealogy; therefore, as custom and etiquette require me to write a few lines of preface to introduce the subject, I will lay before you the circumstances that led me to begin this work. Till I was past fifty years of age, I knew comparatively nothing relative to my father's kindred, he having strayed off "down east" from N. H., and was lost, practically, to all his relatives, as the facilities for communication at that early day were very limited. At length I was seized with an irrepressible desire to learn something definite about my paternal kindred and ancestors, and feeling ashamed of my ignorance in this matter, I then resolved to institute a diligent search for them forthwith, and you may see the results thereof in this genealogy. My researches revealed

to me the fact that many of our name, like myself, had been born far away from their ancestral home, and sat under the same dark cloud that so long overshadowed me, and it was for their sake, and our name in general, that I so persistently continued this tedious search for seven long years, so that I might throw some light on their future pathway, and light a beacon for coming generations which shall be their genealogical polar star for the next hundred years. This work is wholly a labor of love. For means and time expended in collecting material and writing this work I have no other compensation than your good wishes, and kindly remembrance of me.



WITH THE NEW YORK BRANCH.




Blazon.—Gules; a fess, ermine, between three crescents, argent; quartering lascelles.

Crest; a dagger supporting a crescent. Motto, "Spero."

The Phillipse-Marston arms are the same as the above, excepting "Mullet for difference." Motto, "Decus virtute sole."

INTRODUCTION.

As an introduction to this work, I will first give the etymology and origin of our name. Marston is the English of Marsius (Lat.); Marson (Germ.), and signifies warrior, being derived from Mars, the mythological god of war. In ancient times the term was applied only to a body of people, as "Campus Martius," and the "Marsii," a fierce, warlike tribe, which dwelt in Italy, and were allies of the Romans when they first subdued the petty tribes which surrounded them. They were such brave and fierce fighters that they were called the "Marsii" (warriors). It was a proverbial saying among these tribes, that the Romans achieved no victory over the Marsii, nor any victory without the Marsii.

This title was first applied to a personal character about the ninth century, in Germany, and in this way: the King was being hard pressed on all sides by the petty sovereigns contiguous to his kingdom, but was finally relieved by the skill and valor of the Prince, or Duke, who had command of his army, for which good service the King conferred on him this martial title, Marsius. At this date people had but one name, and were distinguished one from another by their titles or vocations, which titles and vocations after a while were adopted as their sur-names. So in process of time this title became the sur-name of that

family, one of whom and of noble descent, the commander of an army corps, came over to England with William the Conqueror, in 1066; and for his military services in the capture of England he was granted large estates in Yorkshire county, wherein is situated "Marston's Moor," made famous by the memorable battle between the Royalists, commanded by Prince Rupert; and the Parliament troops under Lord Fairfax and Cromwell, July 2, 1644.

We learn from an English lady that the estates at Marston's Moor are yet in the possession of the descendants of this family, who are said to be very aristocratic.

After many years this family became quite numerous and settled in other counties, where they married into the families of the nobility and founded new branches of the Marston family. There was the Yorkshire, the Worcestershire, the Staffordshire, and the Leicestershire families, with different, though similar coat-of-arms. Yorkshire county bordering on Scotland, some of the family went into that country and married with the Scotch, hence arose the idea that our ancestors were of Scotch descent. Possibly the mother, or grandmother of William, senior, was a Scotch lassie.

In the 17th century the Marstons held county conventions, or visitations, as they called them, and entered their coat-of-arms and pedigrees for record; first in Leicestershire, in 1619; in Shropshire, in 1673; in Worcestershire, in 1684. The Worcestershire family is now extinct. They were of "Hall-Peen," Yardley, but at the death of Job Marston, in 1701, aged sixty-five years, unmarried, his estates passed to a distant female relative. The said Job

was the son of Walter and Susannah Marston. She was a daughter and co-heiress of Job Durham, of Hampton, Warwick county. [Exit Worcester.]

My opportunities to consult English records are very limited. The earliest record that I am able to obtain in England, is a mention of Edward de Marston, and of John de Marston, of Yorkshire, in the 13th century.

(N. B. The name was then in the "tadpole" state.)

In 1477, when Sir William Frost was Mayor of York, Thomas Hassle and William Marston were his two sheriffs.

John Marston (1575 to 1634), in the reign of King James 1st, was a famous dramatic writer, and was imprisoned by the King for satirizing the Scotch people in one of his plays. (See Br. Enc'p.)

William Marston, of Slauston, in Leicestershire, by his second marriage had two sons; 1, William, who died in the 36th year of the reign of Queen Elizabeth; 2, Thomas of whom nothing is known.

William Marston,² son of William of S., had two sons; 1, William,³ born about 1792-3, and 2, John, born about 1794-5.

William³ (grandson of William), had three sons living in 1619, all small children. (Rec. Brit. Museum, Lond. Vis. held 1619.)

Whether the above William³ was the same person as William, Sr., of Hampton, our first cis-Atlantic ancestor who left England in 1634 with three sons and a daughter, I am unable to determine.

The original characteristic traits of the Hampton branch were firmness and faithfulness, piety and perseverance;

but these virtues have become somewhat adulterated by intermarriages during two hundred and fifty years; yet they are the ruling principle with the majority of the family to this day. Persons of intemperate, profane or immoral habits are rare cases in this family, while men of high reputation and great professional attainments are found in many of the States. Let every one of our name strive to maintain our high standard of morality.

CHAPTER FIRST.

ROBERT MARSTON, was born in England, not far from 1583, and came to Salem, Mass., probably with William, Sr. (who is supposed to be his brother), in 1634, and went with the said William, Sr. to Newbury about 1637, thence in October, 1638, to Winnicumet with William, Sr., his three sons and twelve others from Newbury, and thirty-eight from Salem and that vicinity, who made the first organized settlement there; and this community was afterwards incorporated as the town of Hampton, in the old county of Norfolk (now obsolete), and when said county was divided to settle the boundary dispute, New Hampshire took all that part east of the Merrimack river, which included the town of Hampton. Robert Marston died in 1643, leaving a small estate, consisting of a house and lot of seven acres lying on Robert Page; also fifteen acres of upland in the North-Field (now North Hampton), and thirty acres of upland granted Mr. Rushwood by the town; also five acres of salt-marsh on the other side of the landing place, and ten acres of salt-marsh in the Little Ox-common, which was granted Mr. Rushwood by the town, with two shares in the Ox-common and three shares in the Cow-common. His age was about sixty years.

It is evident from the action of the Probate Court that he left children in England, else the Marstons in America were not his near relatives. See order of the Court.

ORDER OF THE COURT, 23D DAY, 10th Mo., 1643.

The Court at Salem doeth appoint John Marston and Thomas Marston as administrators unto Robert Marston, of his estate until the true heirs unto the estate, who are in England, shall either come or send to take order therein. And that ye administrators shall in the mean-tyme bind themselves, each for the other to this Court for the well managing, as also the improvement of the said estate; and that there shall be joined with them, for the better directing of them, as also improving of the said estate, John Saunders and Thomas Macey, both of Salisbury. The administrators are bound in ye bond of an hundred pounds, for the performing of the promises. And that ye bring in at the next Court at Ipswich, upon oath, a true inventory of the estate of the said Robert Marston, deceased.

WILLIAM MARSTON, Sr., patriarch of the Hampton, N. H., branch, was born in England (tradition says in Yorkshire county), about A. D. 1592, and came to Salem, Mass., in 1634 with his family (and probably two brothers, Robert and John), and resided there about three years, receiving a grant of land in 1636 from the General Court of Massachusetts, but soon after went to Newbury

for a short time; thence, in October, 1638, to Winnecumet, where he with fifty-five others settled on lands granted them by the General Court of Massachusetts, and they called the place Hampton (Norfolk county), after the English home of a part of the settlers, and by this name it was incorporated. It is quite probable that his first wife lived till about 1660. Then about 1662, when about seventy years old, he married second, Sabrina Page, aged eighteen or twenty years, a daughter of Robert and Lucia Page, of Ormesby (Yarmouth), Norfolk county, England, by whom he had one daughter, Tryphena. He was a kind hearted, benevolent, and godly man, and was a member of the Quaker or Friends, church, and suffered persecutions for his religious tenets. He often harbored and aided his distressed and persecuted brethren, for which Christian deeds he was robbed by exorbitant fines by the zealous and bigoted courts. In Felt's Annals of New England I find this record:

"Oct. 14, 1657, William Marston petitioned the court at Hampton, that the fine of £15 may be remitted that had been imposed on him for keeping a paper and two books which inculcated Quaker doctrines."

He died in Hampton, June 30, 1672, aged about eighty years. See his will. He had five children by the records.

Recorded in the old Norfolk County books, and now deposited at the Registry of Deeds office, in Salem, Essex county, Mass.:

"The Last Will and Testament of William Marston, Sr., of Hampton, N. H.—Being through the mercy of God of perfit & sound memory & vnderstanding as followeth: I bequeath my soule to Him that gave it, & my boddie to the earth,-I give to my eldest son Thomas Marston, five shillings, and to my son William Marston, five shillings, and to my son John Marston, five shillings, & to my daughter Prudence Coxes, five shillings, to be paid within a twelefmonth after my decease. All the rest of my estate, goods, chattelles, debtes, moveables, & what else is in any manner appertaining, or belonging vnto me, I give vnto my daughter Trifana; & I doue make my beloved wife Sabina my sole excetketer vnto this my Last Will & Testament, and for the confirmation hereof I have herevnto sett my hand & seall, the 25th of Juen one thousand six hundred seventy & two.

THOMAS MARSTON, eldest son of William, Sr., was born in England (probably Yorkshire county), about May or June, 1617, and came to Salem, Mass., with his father in 1634, and went with him to Newbury about 1637; thence to Hampton, N. H., in October, 1638, where he married Mary Estow about 1647, a daughter of Wm. Estow, Esq. Being past twenty-one years of age, it is very probable that he had a grant of land from the General Court, as did the other pioneers; then he bought land of John Sanborn, May 25, 1645, and leased a house and lot from Robert Knight, which formerly belonged to Robert Marston, Oct. 5, 1653 (see deeds.) The provincial records show that he was a capable and highly esteemed citizen, and was prominent in the town's business affairs, and in all matters appertaining to the interests of the community. He died testate, in Hampton, Sept. 28, 1690, aged seventy-three years and about seven months, (See He had nine children. his will.)

"The Court grants that petitioners, Mr. Steven Bachiler, Christo. Hussy, Mary Hussy, Thomas Cromwell, Samuel Skullard, John Crosse, John Osgood, Samuel Greenfield, John Molton, Thomas Molton, Wm. Estow, Wm. Palmer, Wm. Sargent, Rich^d Swayne, Wm. Sanders, Robert Tucke, Thomas Marston, and divers others, shall have liberty to begin a plantation at Winnacumnet, and Mr. Bradstreet, Mr. Winthrop, Jr., and Mr. Rawson, or some two of them, are to assist in setting out the place of the Towne, and apportioning a separate quantity of land to each man, so as nothing shall be done therein without allowance from them, or two of them."

DEPOSITION OF THOMAS MARSTON.

9. Thomas Marston, of Hampton, aged about 52 years, and Wm. Fifield, deposeth, that about 1654, when Seth Fletcher lived in Hampton, we were appointed to treat with Capt. Bryan Pendleton, and John Pickering in the behalf of the town of Portsmouth concerning the settling of the bounds between Hampton and Portsmouth, by the

sea-side; and we, the said deponents, met the men above-said, and showed them the power that we had to act by, and they showed us their power, which was full and ample for the ends abovesaid; but the said Capt. Pendleton and Pickering did question the power given us by the town of Hampton, not to be sufficient for the attaining of the ends intended; whereupon the said Pendleton and Pickering stayed in Hampton until we obtained a meeting of the selectmen, and had full power to act in behalf of the town of Hampton; and then we, the said Marston and Fifield, did treat with the said Pendleton and Pickering, and after a treaty, we did agree and conclude,—that Hampton should begin to measure ten rods to the northward of the causeway that goeth over to the beach; and from there, 5 miles northward near the seaside.

Dated, Mar. 9th, 1669.

Note.—The above mentioned line was run in May, 1655, and it terminated at Jocelyn's neck, on the north side and next to it, northward of Long Stony Beach. (Records.)

WILL OF THOMAS MARSTON, SON OF WILLIAM, SR.
(The Preambles of Wills are not copied, except two for samples.)

- 1st. My will is that all my just and honest debts, and funeral expenses be paid.
- 2d. I give and bequeath unto Mary, my loving wife, all my stock of cattle, of all sorts whatsoever, with all my household goods and movables, all to be at her disposing, only, my will is that she dispose of them amongst some of my children, as wisdom shall direct her.
 - 3d. I give unto Mary, my loving wife, my dwelling

house, with the lot at home, with barn, out-houses, and my orchard, and half my piece of fresh meadow near John Clifford's, with half my piece of upland there. All during her natural life, and after her decease it is all, the said house and land, to be and remain to the sole and proper use of my son Ephraim, and his heirs forever, provided he, or they shall pay such legacies as I shall order him, in this my last will; as also he or they shall take special care to be helpful to his mother, that she be maintained comfortably and honorably, with what I shall leave her, and ordered to be paid her. My will also is that Ephraim shall divide the meadow and upland by John Clifford's, and then my son John Marston to choose which part he will have.

4th. I give and bequeath unto my eldest son, Isaac Marston, all lands, meadow and marsh, for the which he hath a deed of gift, although it be not acknowledged, I do confirm the said gift by this, my last will and testament; he, the said Isaac, or his heirs, performing what they are engaged to his mother by a bill under his hand and seal.

5th. I give and bequeath unto my son John Marston, all the land, meadow and marsh ground, for the which he hath a deed under my hand and seal, though it be not acknowledged, I here confirm the said deed by this my last will, he or his heirs performing what he is engaged, by a bill under his hand and seal. I also give him half my piece of upland ground joining to my meadow by John Clifford's.

6th. I give and bequeath unto my son Ephraim Marston all the land, meadow and marsh ground, for which he

hath a deed, under my hand and seal, though it be not acknowledged, I here confirm the said gift by this my last will, he or his heirs performing what he is engaged under his hand and seal.

7th. I give and bequeath unto my son James Marston, one-quarter part of my lot of upland, being over North-hill brook, and one-quarter part of my fresh meadow, lying toward the brook, as also one-half of a share of the Cow-common of Hampton, besides what I have formerly given him.

8th. I give and bequeath unto my daughter, Sarah Low, wife of Simon Low, the sum of ten pounds to be paid to her by my son Ephraim Marston within one year after my wife's decease, in such pay as he is to pay her other bequests, and if it please God my dau. Sarah die before the time of payment, then the ten pounds shall be paid to those of her children that then shall be living.

9th. I give unto my two grand-children, John Sanborn & Mary Sanborn, five pounds apiece, to be paid to them by my son Ephraim Marston within two years after my wife's decease, in good merchantable pay, at a price following that which is worth 40s. in money, to go at three pounds, and so portionable, in case they be then 18 years of age; if not, then to be paid when 18 years old.

10th. I do make, constitute, and appoint Mary, my loving wife, to be my sole executrix to this my last will and testament, and in confirmation thereof, I the said Thomas Marston, have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, this 17th day of January, in the year of our Lord sixteen

hundred and eighty-six, and in the 2nd year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord, James the Second, by the grace of God, King of England, Scotland, Ireland, and France.

22nd February, 1692, Henry Dow, Esq., Joseph Moulton, planter, & Seth Fogg, planter. all of Hampton, make oath that they did see Thomas Marston sign and seal, and publish the aforesaid will as his last will and testament, and that these several names subscribed as witnesses, is of their own proper hand writing. Signed, Henry Dow, Joseph Moulton, & Seth Fogg. Entered and recorded Mar. 2d, 1692.—Jurat coram me, Wm. Davis.

I, Thomas Marston, of Hampton, in the province of New Hampshire, in New England, farmer: being weak in body, but of sound and perfect memory, thanks be given to God for the same, and knowing the uncertainty of this life on earth, and being desirous to set all things in order, do make this my Last Will and Testament; in manner and form following, that is to say, first and principally I commend my soul to God, and my body to the earth, from whence it was taken, to be buried in such decent and Christian manner as my executor, hereafter named shall deem proper and convenient; and as touching such worldly estates as the Lord in mercy hath lent me, my will and meaning is the same shall be bestowed and employed as hereafter expressed by this will. And first, I do revoke, renounce, and make void all wills by me formerly made, and hold and appoint this my Last Will and Testament.

My will is that all my just and honest debts, and funeral expenses be paid. I give and bequeath unto Lydia, my loving wife all my estate until my two sons, Nathan and Nathaniel, come of age; and when they become of age, all my lands, and marsh, and buildings are to be divided equally between them, except that at my father's; Nathan to divide, and Nathaniel to choose which part he will have:—and my wife to have the improvements of one-half of each of these parts so long as she shall remain a widow. And I give and bequeath unto Lydia, my loving wife all my stock of cattle of all kinds whatsoever, and movables to be disposed of by her to my three children, as wisdom shall direct her in her widowhood.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Abigail the buildings and land on both sides of the way at my father's and mother's door, and also my two sons are to pay unto my daughter Abigail, fifty pounds apiece, within six years after they become of age.

I do make, constitute, and appoint Capt. Joshua Pearce of Portsmouth, and Simon Marston of Hampton to be my sole executors to this my Last Will and Testament; and in confirmation of the abovesaid, I, Thomas Marston, have hereunto, put my hand and affixed my seal, this thirty-first day of January, in the year of our Lord seventeen hundred and twenty-eight, in the first year of the reign of our sovereign lord, George the 2d, by the grace of God king of England, Scotland, France, and Ireland.

The second and *last* will of Thomas Marston, (now of Greenland), was made August 9, 1745, and proved June 28, 1753. It was the same in form as the first, with only slight changes in its substance to accord with the change in legatees. His sons, Nathan and Nathaniel were now his executors, and William French, Thomas Wiggin and John Weeks, witnesses.

The legatees are: 1, Nathan Marston, his son; 2, Nathaniel Marston, his son; 3, Abigail French, his daughter; 4, Abigail French, his granddaughter; 5, Abigail Murdough, granddaughter; 6, Eliza Murdough, granddaughter; 7, Nathan Murdough, grandson; 8, Nathan Marston, grandson (son of Nathaniel.)

WILL OF NATHAN MARSTON, OF GREENLAND, SON OF THOMAS.

The preamble is the same as in Thomas' will, and we need not repeat it. The will reads as follows:

- 1st. I give and bequeath to my daughter Abigail Dearborn, 20s, lawful money, I having given her, already, whatelse I, designed for her portion.—the 20s to be paid within one year.
- 2d. I give and bequeath to my daughter Eleanor Johnson, 20s, in lawful money, to be paid within one year after my decease, I having given her whatelse I designed for her portion.
- 3d. I give and bequeath to my, daughter Mary Marston, 15 pounds in lawful money, to be paid within one year after my decease.
- 4th. To daughter Elizabeth Marston, the same, to be paid within two years.
- 5th. To daughter Johannah Marston, the same, to be paid in three years, or at time of marriage, if sooner.
- 6th. To daughter Lucy Marston, the same, to be paid within three years, or at time of marriage, if sooner.
- 7th. I give to my four daughters, Mary, Elizabeth, Johannah, and Lucy Marston all my household furniture, —my wearing clothes excepted,—to be divided equally among them.
- 8th. I give and devise to my two sons, Thomas and Nathaniel Marston, all my land in Greenland, and in Epsom, with all my buildings, stock of cattle, horses, sheep, and swine; with all my husbandry tools, wearing apparel, and all debts due to me at my decease; to be equally divided between, them, or their heirs, after my just debts, and funeral charges, and legacies before bequeathed are paid.

9th. I do hereby constitute, and appoint my son Thomas Marston my sole executor of this my Last Will and Testament; and I do hereby revoke all former wills by me made, ratifying this my Last Will and Testament;

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this 4th, day of July, one thousand seven hundred and sixty-eight. Signed, sealed, and published by Nathan Marston, to be his Last Will and Testament, in the presence of us who subscribed as witnesses, in the presence of the testator.







EXTRACTS FROM THE ADJ.-GEN.'S REPORT (BATTLE OF GETTYSBURGH, 1863, JULY 1st, TO 4th.)

* * At this time (1st day), Col. Tilden's horse was shot from under him, and Capt. Waldron, Co. I, received a bullet in his breast. A charge was ordered, and the 16th, with their accustomed battle-shout, moved on a run across the open space between them and the enemy, driving hundreds of them into the line of the 13th Mass. Reg. on the right.

When the 1st corps began to fall back, the 16th was ordered to a position on the right, and to hold the Chambersburgh turnpike, until not a man was left alive. Two regiments had already been driven from this position. Col. Tilden saw the danger, but obeyed the order almost literally, for when at length the regiment gained Cemetery Hill, only five officers and thirty-five men remained.

On the 3d, this remnant of the 16th, Capt. Marston, commanding, was ordered to support the 2d corps, and while moving by flank a single shell bursting killed and wounded two officers and seven men.

At the close of the 4th, all that remained for duty, of 248 officers and men, who entered the engagement on the 1st inst., were two officers and fifteen men. A truly fearful record.





WILL OF SIMON MARSTON.

In the name of God, Amen. This 26th, day of April, 1735,. I. Simon, Marston, of Hampton, in the Province of N. H. in New England, being now weak in body, but of sound and perfect memory, praise be given to God for the same, and knowing the uncertainty of this life on earth, and being desirous to set things in order, do make this my Last Will and Testament, in manner and form following, that is to say; First and principally, I commend my soul to Almighty God my creator, assuredly believing that I shall receive full pardon and free remis-

sion of all my sins, and be saved by the precious death and merits of my blessed Saviour and Redeemer, Christ Jesus; and my body to the earth from whence it was taken;—to be buried in such decent and Christian manner as my executor, here in after named shall think meet and convenient;—and as touching such worldly estates as the Lord in mercy hath lent me, my will and meaning is that the same shall be employed and bestowed as hereafter by this my will is expressed; and first, I do revoke, renounce, and make void all wills by me formerly made, and declare and appoint this my Last Will and Testament.

Imprimis. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Hannah, the east end of my dwelling-house, so long as she shall live, and the movables in my house, I give to my said wife, to do with them as she pleases; also 100wt of good pork, and 100wt of good beef, and ten bushels of Indian corn, and two bushels of wheat, or wheat and barley, and two bushels of malt, and two cows, to be kept for her, summer and winter, so long as she shall live; and five pounds of cotton wool, and five pounds of sheeps wool, and twelve cords of good wood, and one barrel of cyder; all the particulars abovementioned, I give to my said wife yearly, and every year, so long as she shall live. And I order my sons, viz, Jonathan Marston, and Daniel Marston, equally between them to find their said mother everything above-named, yearly, and every year so long as she shall live; and my said sons are to carry their mother to meeting when she is able to go. And whereas my said sons were to find their mother with five pounds of sheeps wool, yearly, I order them, in lieu of that, to

find their mother with four sheeps, summer and winter, so long as she shall live.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Jonathan Marston the west end of my house where he now dwells, and the east end he is to have at his mothers death; and all the land where the house is, and the farm.

Item. I give unto my two sons, viz, Jonathan, and Daniel Marston, all my land, and meadow ground, and salt marsh, and thatch ground, according to quantity and quality, to be equally divided between them; and my stock of cattle, and sheep, and horses, and swine, and husbandry tools, to be equally divided between them.

Item. I give unto my daughter Sarah Dearborn, twelve pounds in specie, at money price, to be paid to her by my son Jonathan Marston, at his mothers decease.

Item. I give unto my daughter Deborah Nudd, twelve pounds in specie, at money price, to be paid to her by my son Daniel Marston, at his mothers decease.

Lastly. My will and meaning is that what debts and dues are from me, I order my two sons, Jonathan and Daniel Marston, to pay them equally between them; and what are due to me, they are to receive and have equally between them.

And I do appoint my above named wife, Hannah, and my two sons Jonathan and Daniel Marston, to be executors of this my last will and testament; and in confirmation hereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal, the day and year abovementioned, in the eighth year of King George the 2nd. His reign over Great Britain,



Ist. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Sarah Marston the improvement of one third part of all my estate during her natural life, and all my household-stuff, I give to her, to be at her disposal, excepting my wearing clothes, and trooping furniture. (Uniform, Sword, & horses trappings.)

2nd. I give and bequeath unto my three sons, Daniel, Samuel, and Robey Marston all my lands in the township of Nottingham, to be divided equally among them, or their heirs;—Samuel to have his part on the easterly side, Daniel to have his part in the middle, and Robey to have his third part on the westerly side of said land. And I also give to each of my said sons one third part of all my right in a saw-mill in Nottingham;—when they arrive at the age of 21 yrs.

3d. I give and bequeath unto my son Theodore Marston all my lands in the township of Bow, and also all my

right of land in a place called Buck-street, and to his heirs forever.

4th. I give to my daughter Anna Marston, 300 pounds, old tenor, to be paid when she is 18, or at the time of her marriage.

5th. I give unto my daughter Meriam Marston, 300 pound old tenor, to be paid when she is 18, or at the time of her marriage.

6th. I give unto my daughter Sarah Marston, 300 pounds old tenor, to be paid when she is 18, or at the time of her marriage.

7th. I give unto my son David Marston, 300 pounds old tenor, to be paid to him at the age of 21 yrs. All the above legacies to be paid by my executors hereafter named.

Sth. I give unto my beloved wife, Sarah, and my three daughters above mentioned, the improvement of one half of my dwelling-house from the cellar to the garret, (the East End.) To my daughters so long as they remain unmarried,—and to my wife during her natural life.

9th. I also give my five sons, Daniel, Samuel, Robey, Theodore, and David, all my clothes, my trooping clothes excepted, to be equally divided among them.

10th. All the rest and residue of my estate, both real and personal, wherever it may be found, I give and bequeath unto my son Simon Marston, and his heirs forever, with all my debts due to me at my decease,—he paying all my just debts, and funeral expenses, and all the above-mentioned legacies.

Lastly. I do hereby constitute and appoint my well beloved wife, Sarah Marston and my son Simon Marston to be my executors to this my last will and testament; and I do hereby revoke and disannul all former wills heretofore made by me, comprising this only as my last will and testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set hand and seal, this 9th, day of Nov. Anno Domini seventeen hundred and fifty-seven,—and in the 31st, year of the reign of George the 2nd. By the grace of God King of England; signed, sealed, and delivered to be the last will and testament of the testator.





I, Jeremiah Marston, do give unto my beloved wife, Mary Marston the improvement of all my estate, both real and personal, until my oldest son, Jeremiah Marston come to the age of 21 years, but if Providence take him away by death before he come to the age of 21 years, then my said wife is to improve a third part of all my real and personal estate during her natural life, or widowhood; but if she shall see cause to marry, then my said wife is to quit the improvement of my said estate, and have £50 paid to her in passable bills of credit by my son Jeremiah Marston, within one year after she marries. I also give unto my wife Mary, all my movables in my house, to dispose of them as she may see cause among my children; and I order my wife to sell my negro, and lay out the money towards bringing up my son Simon Marston to learning.

2d. I give and devise unto my son Jeremiah Marston, all my real estate that I have in Hampton, particularly all my upland meadow-ground, woodland, salt-marsh, and thatch-ground, as it lies in Hampton. I also give unto

my said son all my stock of cattle, horses, sheep, and swine; and all my husbandry-tools. He is to have 2 third parts of what I have here given to him when he comes to 21 years of age; the other third part of said estate, he is to have when his said mother marries, or at her decease. I also give my said son my part, or right in the upper saw-mill.

- 3. I give and devise unto my son Simon Marston, all my land that I have in Kingston, divided and undivided. Elisha Smith, and my brother, Ephraim Marston to be executors to this my Last Will and Testamens;—and in confirmation hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, the day and

She was registered as the servant of John Moulton, of Ormesby, aged eighteen years. He was a carpenter by trade, and at one time a member of the Quaker church, and fined for not complying with the rules of the established church. He united with the first church in Salem, June 9, 1640, and

was made freeman, June 2, 1641. He had granted to him, by the town of Salem, a lot of land near Royal-side, April 20, 1646, also another grant, Aug. 31, 1649, of two little spots of marsh, lying near Mr. Scruggs, by "Goodie" King's land. His will was made Dec. 18, 1681, and he died the next day. His grave-stone in Charter st. Cemetery has this inscription: "Here lyeth ye body of John Marston, sen or, aged 66 years, deceased December 19, 1681." He had ten children, baptized in First church.





SECOND GENERATION.

BPHRAIM MARSTON, second son of John of Ormesby, Eng. (then of Salem), was born in Salem, Mass., Oct. 30, 1643; md. Elizabeth, about 1672, and resided in Salem till about 1678; then settled in Manchester, where he died prior to July 18, 1698, when guardianship of his son Samuel, aged about fifteen years, was granted to Manasseh Marston, blacksmith, of Salem, his uncle. Said Ephraim was a mill-wright. He was not conspicuous in the early history of his father's family, for his name is found but twice in the public records, and was not mentioned in his father's will. There is barely enough trace of the next two generations to follow the line. Only three children on record.

It is quite evident that he married, and settled in Manchester or Topsfield, and had some children, one of whom was Samuel, born not far from 1708.

This was eight years before Samuel 4 was married to Hannah Gould, hence it is evident he was married, and also was a member of the church in Topsfield.

FOURTH GENERATION.

SAMUEL MARSTON, supposed son of Samuel, Ephraim, John, was born, probably, in Topsfield, Mass., about 1708; md. Hannah Gould, July 9, 1732, of Boxford, daughter of John and Hannah Gould, and settled in Topsfield. It appears by the town record, that he enlisted during the old French war, in Capt. Britton's Co., June 6, 1745, and served in the army in 1745, '46, and '47; then in 1750, '51 and '52, and again in 1755, '56 and '57, and, by the church records, died in war in 1757, aged about 48 years. He was not taxed while in the army,

and the tax assessed in the interim, was remitted. Ephraim Towne* was appointed guardian of his son Dudley (past 14 years of age), Nov. 23, 1761. Six of these eight children are recorded as his, and we know of no father for Samuel⁵ and Ephraim,⁵ beside him. For further proofs see notes. His children born about as follows:

SECOND GENERATION.

CAPT. MANASSEH MARSTON,² was the third son of John and Alice, and was baptized in the 1st church, Salem, Mass., Sept. 7, 1646; md. Mercy Pearce, Aug. 23, 1667, and settled in Salem proper. He was a blacksmith, an anchorsmith, and a merchant, and also served his town as its deputy to General Court, in May, 1691-4, and in 1700; and as Selectman, and Commissioner for Rates. He was one of the leading and influential citizens of that famous old town. Died in Jan. or Feb., 1703, aged 57 years.

MARSTON,³ son of Manasseh,² John,¹ was born in Salem, Mass, late in 1679, or early in 1680; md. Mary Henfield, April 10, 1701, and settled in Salem. He had learned his father's trade, and succeeded him in that business, blacksmithing. He died not far from 1720, aged about 40 years. He had one daughter, Hannah, baptized March 3, 1727, at adult age. Exeunt Manassehs.

BENJAMIN MARSTON,² the fourth and youngest son of John and Alice was born in Salem, Mass., Jan. 9, 1650-1; md. 1st, Abigail Veren, Sept. 25, 1678, daughter of Hilliard and Mary (Conant) Veren, of Salem; 2d,

Patience Rogers, April 15, 1696, daughter of Rev. John and Elizabeth (Denison)Rogers, of Ipswich, and settled in Salem, where for many years he was an enterprising and successful merchant, and accumulated a large amount of real estate, for those days (see his deeds). In 1696, he was chosen deputy to represent the town at General Court, and was one of the selectmen, as also a deacon of the 1st church, and one of the principal men of the town. In 1700, he built a brick house on the corner of Essex and Crombie streets, the first built in Salem, and at that day considered an elegant residence. At this date he owned two large warehouses, and the wharves whereon they stood, and much other real estate, both in and out However, after 1708, his early success of the town. deserted him, and his fortunes began to wane. Losses at sea by pirates, and the wild elements of nature, and other reverses on shore compelled him to mortgage his real estate, from time to time, and finally, in 1719, he was obliged to mortgage his beautiful homestead mansion to Col. Samuel Brown. At this date, partly for a relief from the care of business, which was undermining his health, he, with his son Benjamin, took passage in one of his own vessels, the brigantine Essex, Robert Peat, master, bound to Falmouth, Me., to load for Cork, Ireland. After much delay, and a long passage, they arrived at Cork, where they discharged, then proceeded to Dublin, where Mr. Marston was taken sick with the small-pox, and died about Sept. 17, 1719, aged above 69 years. He made his will May 1, 1719, before leaving home. He had five children.

WILL OF BENJAMIN MARSTON.

In the name of God, Amen.—I, Benj. Marston of Salem, in ye county of Essex, in New-England, being in health of body & of perfect mind & memory, thanks be to God, being bound a voyage to sea, & not knowing how it may please God to deale with mee in my voyage, do make & ordaine this to be my Last Will & Testament, hereby revoking all forrmer wills, &c. committing my soule to God that gave itt, and my body to the earth after my decease; and for my worldly estate that God hath given me, I give and dispose thereoff as followeth. Impr. I appoint and order that all my just debts be satisfied, & paid & discharged. 2ly. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Patience Marston one third parte of all my reale estate during her naterall life, and if she sees convenient, give her liberty to sell any or every part of her third of my reale estate, she giving the refusal of the same to my son. 3ly. I give and bequeath unto my darter Abigail's two children, viz. Marston Cabot, and Abigail Cabot, my large silver tankard, and 40 shillings in money to each of them; the reason* why I give these children noe more is well known to myself, and may be to a grate many more. 4ly. I give and bequeath to my

son Benjamin Marston ten pounds in money, and after my just debts are payed, and my wife's thirds are deducted, I give unto my said son two thirds of all the remaining parts of my estate, both reale and personall forever, and I also appoint and order that my son sees cause, or desires That he shall have his sister's parte of the land, he it. paying her for the same according to apprizall, in money, or moneys worth, and that he inherit and possess my lands. 5ly. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Marston five pounds in money. . . And the other third parte, &c. 6ly. In case my son Benj. Marston should die without lawful issue, . . . then my whole estate shall be divided equally between my wife and dau. Elizabeth. 7ly. I give unto Mary Marston,† who has longe dwelt in my house, the sum of five pounds in money, or money worth.

Con. £43. Apr. 9th, 1701.

Benjamin Marston, Salem, merch., from Jonaⁿ. Corwin, son & admr. of Geo. Corwin; the two islands in Salem harbor, called the Great and Little Misery islands; which were granted to Capt. George Corwin in 1677.

[The said Benjamin sold these islands, June 18th, 1718.]—Records.

Benjamin Marston, Salem, and 2d wife Patience, to Daniel Davison of Newbury, one fourth of a saw-mill, in Salisbury. Con. 12000 ft. of good merchantable white oak, 2 in. plank.

Patience Marston, widow of Benjamin, Salem, Benjamin, Esq., her son, and Elizabeth, her daughter, convey to Timothy Orne, mariner, a wharf, with the warehouse thereon, &c. The same which John Ruck sold to Benj. Marston, deceased, Jan. 17, 1686. Con. £97.

Patience Marston, widow, &c., with her son & daughter (as above) conveyed to Capt. Timothy Orne, for £600, a dwelling-house, out-houses, and 92 poles of land in Salem.

Benjamin, the son bought back this property three days after, viz., Apr. 5th, 1728.



THIRD GENERATION.

COL. BENJAMIN MARSTON, son of Benjamin, John, was born in Salem Mass Rob 24 1607, md John, was born in Salem, Mass., Feb. 24, 1697; md. 1st, Mehitable Gibbs, in 1725, a daughter of Rev. Henry Gibbs, of Watertown, born Jan. 8, 1706; 2d, Elizabeth Winslow, Nov. 20, 1729, a daughter of Hon. Isaac and Sarah (Wensley) Winslow, of Marshfield, born Dec. 13, 1707. He entered Harvard College in 1711, and graduated in 1715. In 1719, he accompanied his father on his voyage in the Essex to Ireland; which proved fatal to the father, and nearly so to the son, both from the small-pox and the terrible gales encountered on his return in the same vessel, the next spring. He said "the brig was an able sea-boat, and a half of ye vessels of Salem would have perished, if they had been there." Being the only surviving son, his father devised to him his whole estate, and by skillful enterprise, he succeeded in establishing his business on a firm basis, and became a wealthy and honorable merchant, redeeming much of the property that his father had mortgaged. It appears that he retired from active mercantile business after some twenty years, for he moved to Marblehead for a while; thence, about 1745, to Manchester, and settled on a farm, which he

enlarged by purchases from time to time, until it became a place of much note, called "Marston's Farm." He was a man of good education, and endowed with great natural abilities. He represented Salem in the General Court in 1727 and 1728. In 1737 he was high sheriff of Essex county; was colonel of state militia; as also justice of the court of common pleas, and of the general sessions. He died May 22, 1754, aged 57 years 3 months, and was buried in Manchester. His will was made April 23, 1754, and proved July 11, 1754. He had nine children, all by second wife.

Benjamin Marston, Esq., Marblehead, from John White, one cow's commonage. April 30, 1739.

Benjamin Marston and wife Elizabeth, of Marblehead, for 2650 ozs. of coined silver, to Edward Hutchinson and other merchants of Boston, my two islands, Great and Little Misery; also 60 acres of land, being the south part of my farm in Manchester, which I bought from John Knowlton, Nov. 15, 1726, for £600. Aug. 2d, 1740.

His last deed was dated in Manchester, Jan. 11, 1753.



ABSTRACTS FROM COL. BENJ. MARSTON'S WILL. Preamble Omitted.

1st. I give unto my beloved wife Elizabeth one sixth part of the rents, or income of the island called Misery during her life, and the third part of ye income of the farm at Manchester, and of ye stock and utensils thereon, during the time she lives thereon, or improves it. I also give her the service of my negro man Isaac during her life. And after her death, I give him to that child of mine he shall chose to live with, such child paying his brethren & sisters each a share equal to his, or her own of what the said negro shall then be thought worth.

- 2d. I give to my son Benjamin ten pounds lawful money.
 - 3d. I give to each of my other children, namely, Eliza-

beth, Patience, Sarah, John, Lucy, & Winslow,—five pounds lawful money to be paid by my executors in convenient time after my decease.

4th. I will that after ye death of my said wife the said sixth part of ye profits & rents of ye said island shall be vested in the committee for Indian affairs for the propagating the Gospel among the Indians, by them to improved & applied to that purpose, and no other forever.

5th. All the remainder of my estate, both real, personal, & mixt, I give to my children to be divided among them according to ye laws of this province for ye distribution of ye estates of intestates, in ye following manner. vidt. To my son Benjamin a double share, or one fourth part thereof. To Eliz—th, Patience, Sarah, John, Lucy, & Winslow, each one eighth part thereof, to hold to them their heirs & assigns forever. * * * * *

His wife Elizabeth, & son Benjamin were appointed executors.

Signed, & sealed as his last will—Apr. 23d A. D. 1754.

FOURTH GENERATION.

BENJAMIN MARSTON, son of Benjamin, Benjamin, John, was born in Salem, Mass., Sept. 30, 1730; md. Sarah Swett, Nov. 13, 1755, a daughter of Joseph and (2d w.) Hannah Swett, of Marblehead, where he settled, and engaged in mercantile pursuits in company with Robert Hooper and Jeremiah Lee, who md. daughters of Joseph Swett also. He was a wealthy merchant, beside owning much real estate in Manchester and Salem. He

graduated at Harvard College, in 1749, and was qualified for all public business; was chosen moderator fourteen times in eight years, 1766 to 1774; was selectman and overseer of poor, thirteen times in fifteen years; and filled many other positions of public trust, being a popular leader in all matters pertaining to the public welfare. He led a pure life of unostentations piety, his integrity of character commanding the highest respect and esteem of his fellow townsmen. In his private life he was kind, social and hospitable. In 1776, when the colonies revolted, he sided with the Royalists, and quietly withdrew to the provinces, leaving his estate with his wife, who died not long afterward; then Marston Watson, nephew, was chosen agent for his estate, July 28, 1778. He lived in Shelburne and in Halifax, N. S., and in St. John, N. B., for a while, engaging in his former vocation; but during one of his voyages, he was taken prisoner by the Americans and sent to Boston, and retained till exchanged, when he returned to Halifax. It appears that he lost all of his property during the war, and was ever after dependent upon his personal efforts for his subsistence. In 1787, he made a last visit to his friends and kindred in Boston and Plymouth; then embarked for London, where he was reduced to lowly circumstances for a while. In 1792, a company was organized in England to make a settlement on the island of Bulama, twenty miles from Sierra Leone, on the west coast of Africa, and Benjamin Marston was engaged to accompany them as surveyor. But this expedition proved very unfortunate, and failed to establish the proposed colony; for shortly after they were located, the African fever seized them, and of the original company of two hundred and seventy-five souls,

only a few escaped alive from this mortal disease, and those abandoned the enterprise, and returned home. Among those deceased was Mr. Marston, Aug. 10, 1792, whose loss was severely felt by the company, for they esteemed him very highly. He had no children. Exit.

Note. In this branch of John's family the three Benjamins were all of the males who lived to adult age; and as the last died without issue, this branch terminates here.

EXTRACTS FROM LETTERS OF BENJAMIN MARSTON, JR., TO HIS MOTHER.

FALMOUTH IN CASCO BAY, On board Brig Essex, June 11, 1719, 9, P. M.

HONORED MOTHER.

Just now arrived here a Marblehead sloop, homeward bound, tomorrow morning early; so yt I have time to give you but a slender acct. of our affairs; . . that time 24 hours we weighed anchor, we came to [anchor] again at Casco, being favored with a prosperous gale. We had no sooner arrived but were ready to be devoured by musketoes;—were obliged, all hands, to walk to and fro the deck the whole night. . . . We hauled on shore our vessel, cleansed her, threw ye ballast out, and yesterday began to load. Our men work very briskly, and I hope we shall be loaden in a short time. I am sorry you should sitt so long on ye house for no advantage, but perhaps to the prejudice of your health. . . . Your dutiful son,

BENJ. MARSTON, JR.

[Mrs. Marston remained on the house, or porch roof, as long as the vessel was in sight, when they sailed from Salem.]

CORK, IN IRELAND, Sept. 9th, 1719.

HONORED MADAM.

These come to acquaint you that on the 7th day of this instant, we safly arrived in the harbour of Kingsale. We

met with abundance of extream bad weather, but it has pleased God to preserve us. I was not at all sick on our passage. My father and I are in very good health. We design to proceed to Dublin with our vessel ye first wind, where we are in couraged that we shall come to a good market. . . . We met two dreadful storms on ye coast just before we arrived. So bad they were, that half ye vessels in Salem would have perished if they had been in our stead, but ye vessel's proving a wonderful good sea boat was ye means of our preservation, under God. Ye inhabitants of Cork & Kingsale lookt upon us as men raised from ye dead, such was ye violence of ye weather. . . .

HONORED MADAM.

This comes with unwelcome news of the death of my father, who was taken with ye smal-pox and died in about ten days after our arrival. The night he died I was taken ill of the same distemper, and was dangerously sick, but by God's providence recovered, and am in good health, through mercy. Our cargo amounts to about £300 sterling. I have a prospect of passengers, and hope to be at home in May next. I am not disfigured nor much markt with the smal-pox. . . &c., &c.

BENJ. MARSTON JR.

Note. This letter did not reach Salem until the last of April, 1720. However, a ship from London brought the sad intelligence to Mrs. Marston, Dec. 10, 1719. The Essex sailed from Salem on or near the 5th of June, 1719, and returning, left Dublin June 16th, 1720, arriving at Salem Aug. 22d, 1720, after a stormy passage of sixty-seven days.

The daughters of Benjamin and Elizabeth Marston were quite famous in the history of the family, and merit a special notice in this work.

- 1. Elizabeth was born Nov. 4, 1731, married in 1756, William Watson, son of John and Priscilla (Thomas) Watson of Plymouth, Mass., and resided there. Mr. Watson was born in Plymouth, May 6th, 1730, graduated at Harvard College in 1751, and died April 22, 1815, aged 84 years. He was the first postmaster of Plymouth, being elected to said office in 1775. He was a zealous patriot, and in 1789 was appointed Coll. of Plymouth by General Washington, and held that office till 1803. They had four children, 1st, William; 2d, Eliza, who married Hon. Nathaniel Niles; 3d, Benjamin; 4th, Ellen, who married Hon. John Davis, Judge of U. S. Dist. Court of Mass.
- 2. Patience was born Jan. 2, 1733, married Elkanah Watson, brother to William, Oct. 7, 1754, and died April 20, 1767. Her husband was born in Plymouth, Feb. 2, 1732; merchant. He moved to Freetown, and lived on a farm during the Revolution, but subsequently returned to Plymouth, where he died Aug. 11, 1804. They had five children: Marston, born May 27, 1756, died in Boston, August 7, 1800; Elkanah, born Jan. 22, 1758, died Dec. 5, 1842; Priscilla, born Sept. 30, 1760, died Oct. 28, 1859; Martha, born October, 1762, died Aug. 22, 1840; Lucia, born Nov. 11, 1765, died March 20, 1791.
- 3. Lucia, born Feb., 1748, md. in 1769, John Watson, a son of John and Elizabeth (Reynold) Watson. Mr. Watson was born in Plymouth in 1747; died in Feb., 1826. Graduated at Harvard College in 1766. He was one of the founders of the old Colony Club, in 1769, and

was its last surviving member. He was also vice-president of the Pilgrim Society; and after the death of Judge Thomas, was elected its president, and served till his decease. They had ten children,—John, George, Sarah, Benjamin, Lucia (died), Lucia, William (died), William, Winslow, and Brooke. Mr. J. Watson md. 2d Mrs. Eunice (Marston) Goodwin, who was a daughter of Col. John Marston of Boston, and sister to the late John Marston, Esq. (The said J. Marston, Esq., was the father of the late Admiral John Marston, U. S. N.) Three children by this union were Edward Winslow, Eliza Ann and Albert Mortimer. Her children by 1st marriage were John Marston and Harriet La Barron Goodwin.

He gave to his son Thomas, his dwelling-house, and lot belonging to it; a silver tankard of 30 ozs.; 2 silver spoons of 4 ozs.; a looking-glass, 18 in. sqr.; and mine own gun, in value $\pounds 4$.

To dau. Elizabeth, 110 poles of land; 2d best featherbed, and furniture; 2 silver spoons, 4 ozs.; and a lookingglass 12 in. sqr.; and when all debts are paid, the residue of money and goods, about £60, to be divided between said son and daughter.

To sister Hannah, £20; to sister Deliverance, £10; to my wife Elizabeth, all my movables not yet disposed of; and have a choice of any one room in my house. In case she should have another heir, it shall share equally with son Thomas, or daughter Elizabeth (as to sex); to Manasseh Marston, my cousin, £6; and appointed him for executor. [But Manasseh died about the same time, and his wife declining to adminster, Philip English was appointed in her stead].—Records.

JOHN AND JAMES.

FIRST GENERATION.

Besides John and William of Ormesby, there was another Marston in Salem at an early date, whose name was John, and his vocation a master-mariner. The only individual record we find of him is the following: "John Marston, plaintiff, vs. Capt. Thomas Clarke, in an action of the case for non-payment of £6 for frayght of six pieces of wine, containing three tunn, from Barbadoes to Boston, according to bill of loading, with due damages according to attachment. The jury finde for the plaintiff £6 5s. damages. 30. 9, 1658."—Co. Ct. Rec.

This branch being chiefly mariners, fishermen and such like vocations, resided near the seaboard, at Salem harbor and Marblehead. They were not wealthy, nor owners of much real estate, therefore we can learn but little of them from the Co. Ct. records; and the only other resource is the town and church records, and these are incomplete

and obscure, so that it is impossible to class some of these early families with much certainty at this late day. The best that we now can do is to approximate them by dates of births and marriages, and put the doubtful names in italics.

There were two other Marstons in the vicinity of Sa lem, contemporary with John, the mariner, and perhaps his brothers. Comvirt, or Converse, who resided in Manchester, and paid church rates, 2s. 6d. in 1674, and Samuel who lived in Andover, and was selectman in 1685. There is no other record of those two, nor anything to show that they left issue, but John or some other, has a numerous posterity. As to the head of this branch I can only conjecture, that John, a brother of Robert and William, Sr., of Hampton, N. H., came with them as far as Salem, and these were his sons.



FIRST GENERATION.

JOHN MARSTON, the master-mariner, whoever's son he may be, was probably born in England, about 1628 to 1632, and brought to Salem by his parents prior to 1637, probably 1634, for I learn that it is recorded in the Gen. Reg. that the first John had a son James, who married Elizabeth, &c. (See James²). And as there were some others about his age, we may reasonably suppose them to be his brothers and sister. Therefore we reckon as John the mariner's children.

I apprehend that John was then dead, as the children were accredited to the mother. Probably he was a mariner, as he had no real estate recorded. The children were born about as follows, supposing Christopher to be his also.

It appears that he lived to a great age, as his children and grand-children disposed of a small lot of land

in Salem, which they were heirs to, Feb. 24, 1762. We learn that his wife's name was Elizabeth; had ten children. Probably the twins were named for their grandfathers.

Mary Marston, widow, in behalf of her children, signed a deed with the brothers and sisters of said Nathaniel, Feb. 26, 1762, and is supposed to be his widow. Perhaps the following may be his children referred to by widow Mary.

He was a mariner and resided in Salem in 1762, when he signed the Q. C. deed with eleven of his relatives. He is supposed to be the James who was in Col. Moses' Reg. in the Louisburg expedition, Nov. 20, 1745. One William Marston was in this regiment. Exit James.

MARSTON,⁴ son of James,³ James,² John,¹ the mariner, was born in Salem, Mass., Feb. 8, 1730; md Terriah He was a cooper by trade, but followed the sea when young. He settled in Boston subsequently to 1762, and worked at his trade. Died in Nov., 1791, aged 61 years 10 months. His will was made Nov. 4, 1791, and proved Nov. 15, 1791. He left three sons.

JOHN MARSTON,⁴ son of John,³ James,² John,¹ the mariner, was born in Salem, Mass., about A. D. 1728; md. Anna Girdler, Aug. 6, 1752, at Marblehead, and settled there; voc., shoreman, probably a boat fisherman, the term then not signifying what it now does. He died in August, 1769, aged about 41 years. He died in May, 1818, aged about 67 yrs. His will was made April 26, 1818; proved first Tuesday in June, 1818. ATHANIEL MARSTON,² supposed to be the third son of John,¹ the mariner, was born in Salem, Mass., about A. D. 1675 to 1678; md. Mercy, in 1702, probably a daughter of Capt. Manasseh Marston, Salem. He lived in his native town until after all his children were born, but it appears that the family subsequently moved to Boston. His death, and also that of his mother, occurred in 1729. He had seven children baptized in First Church, Salem (deaths and marriages, from family record).

TOHN MARSTON, son of Nathaniel, John, the mariner, was baptized in Salem, Feb. 26, 1715, but settled in Boston, where he kept a famous public house for many years. In 1740 he married, 1st, Hannah Welland, by whom he had three daughters. In 1745 he was commissioned 1st lieut. in the 3d Mass. Reg., with Col. Jere'h Moulton, for the expedition to Louisburg, C. B., Nova Scotia, Oct. 27, 1745. In 1751, he married, 2d, Mrs. Elizabeth Blake, a sister to his first wife. She soon died without issue. Married his 3d wife, Elizabeth Greenwood, in 1755. She was a great granddaughter of Miles Greenwood, a lieutenant and chaplain in Oliver Cromwell's army. Sept. 29, 1758, he was appointed to administer on the estate of his daughter Hannah, deceased, aged above 14 years. He died about the last of August, 1786, aged 71 years 6 months. His will was made Aug. 22, 1786, and proved Sept. 12, 1786. Had twelve children.

I give to my daughter Eunice Goodwin,—acct, of furniture, 450 3-4 galls. rum.

All my estate after the marriage, or decease of my wife, I give and bequeath among my 7 children, viz. John, Eunice, Nathaniel, Elizabeth, Benjamin, William, & Martha.

There was a queer dispute about the above three qts., or three-quarters of a gallon of rum. See Suffolk Co. Ct. records.

Eunice Marston, daughter of John,³ md. 1st, Lara Goodwin, of Plymouth, and had two children, viz. John Marston and Harriet LaBarron Goodwin; md. 2d, John Watson of Plymouth, and had Edward Winslow, Eliza Ann, and Albert Mortimer Watson; died Sept. 14, 1838, aged 78. Elizabeth and Martha Washington never md.

FOURTH GENERATION.

Col., John, Marston, son of John, Nathaniel, John, the mariner, was born in Boston, Mass., March 27, 1756; md. Anna Randall, Aug. 4, 1784, of Newport, R. I., and settled in Boston, where he engaged in mercantile business, and became a wealthy and highly respected merchant. When the colonies threw off the English yoke, he espoused their cause, and served in the American army, but in what official capacity the writer cannot say, but subsequently attained to the rank of colonel. He died in Taunton, Mass., Dec. 13, 1846, aged 90 yrs. 8 mos. He had seventeen children (premium). (From Admrl. J. Marston, and obit. notices).

S. army, and stationed at Charleston, S. C., where he married Lydia Brown, in Sept., 1790, of that city, and died there, Nov. 11, 1792, aged 31 years 7 months. Exit.

BENJAMIN MARSTON,⁴ a brother of the above, named captain, died in Charleston, S. C., Oct. 26, 1822, aged 53 years 7 months. Not reported married. His brother William also died there in 1800, aged above 27 years. Exeunt.

HENRY MARSTON,⁵ son of John,⁴ John,³ Nathaniel,² John,¹ the mariner, was born in Boston, Mass., Sept. 1,1794, and went to Louisiana in his eighteenth year. At first he stayed two years in New Orleans, then removed to Feliciana, La., where he resided seventy years, a prominent and highly respected citizen. His obituary in the

local papers speaks of him, in all the relations of life, as an honorable and upright man, kind and courteous to all. I learn via New Orleans that he was a wealthy banker. He married Abby F. Johnson, in 1828, of South Carolina, and died at his residence as above, Oct. 15, 1883, aged 90 yrs. 1 month. Had six children.

↑ DMIRAL JOHN MARSTON, 5 son of John, 4 John, 3 A Nathaniel,² John,¹ the mariner, was born in Boston, Mass., Feb. 26, 1796, and entered the naval service as midshipman, April 15, 1813; promoted to lieutenant, July 13, 1825; to commander, Sept. 8, 1841; to captain, Sept. 14, 1855; to commodore, July 16, 1862; and in 1866 was made rear-admiral. He was placed on the retired list Dec. 21, 1861. He served successively on board the frigates President, Washington, Java, brig Prometheus, frigates Constellation, Constitution, Congress, and the Brandywine, when she took General Lafayette home to France. He was a very prominent and efficient officer in our navy during the most critical period of the late civil war, and to him the nation is more indebted than to any one man for the final triumph of its arms over the rebellious south. At the beginning of the civil war, he was in command of the Cumberland, which was sunk by the

Merrimac, and at that time he was in command of the Union squadron, the Roanoke being his flag-ship. The Merrimac was now ready for active hostilities, and had made a dash at our wooden navy in Hampton Roads, and crushed it at one blow, which sent consternation to the national heart; but, during the night the Monitor arrived, and the Admiral was ordered to send her to Washington to protect the Capitol. Just then the Merrimac hove in sight; he realized the critical situation, and sent for Capt. Worden, to whom he said: "I have been ordered to send you to Washington, but I shall disobey my instructions, and order you to attack the Merrimac." The result of this engagement is too familiar to every American to need being repeated here. It was a desperate chance, but wisdom and valor steered it safely unto victory. After the war he was appointed inspector of light-houses in Boston district, and of the Portsmouth and Philadelphia navy yards. He was a man of superior physical powers, and preserved the vigor of youth and all his mental faculties unimpaired till past four score years. He was kind and affable in all his relations in life, to which the writer can bear witness. He married Mrs. Elizabeth Wilcox, about 1830, and soon after settled in Philadelphia, where he died April 9, 1885, aged 89 years 42 days. He had five children.

FIRST GENERATION.

NATHANIEL MARSTON, the patriarch of the New York branch bearing this name, was born in England about 1600, and was of the Leicestershire family. He went out to Providence Island, one of the Bahamas, in 1628, in some official capacity for the Crown, as is attested by the records. In 1639, he removed to Long Island, N. Y., and settled at Flushing. He had a brother John, who also settled there, and had a grant of land there from the government in 1645. This is all the record we find of John. Nathaniel's wife's name was Mary, and they had a son named John, born about 1630 to 1635, and probably several others.

Fraas Jansen Bloetgoet, who came to New Amsterdam (New York), in 1659, and settled at Flushing, L. I. [Riker's History of Harlem, or N. Y.]

NATHANIEL MARSTON,³ son of John,² Nathaniel,¹ was born in Flushing, or New York, about A. D. 1665; md. Margaret Hardenbroek, about 1700, a daughter of Abel and America Hardenbroek, and settled in New York; gentleman. He was among the most prominent citizens of that day, and was one of the original vestrymen of Trinity Church, serving from 1697 to 1731. He also helped to build the first church at New Rochelle. He died in 1737, aged about 72 years. Had six children.

- 3, Nathaniel Philipse graduated at King's College (now Columbia College), N. Y., in 1773, and entered the Royal army as ensign, of the 17th Reg. He was wounded in the battle of Princeton, and again at Germantown, and died in Philadelphia, Oct. 6, 1777, aged about 22 years. [History of Westchester Co.]

Mary Philipse, a daughter of Hon. Frederic Philipse, and a sister of Philip, was born about 1727, at Philipse Manor, Westchester county, N. Y., and married Col. Morris. This was the lady for whom Gen. Washington formed so strong an attachment, and would have made his bride if she had accepted him. But her social position was too far above "George" at that date. In 1750 the families of Philipse and Lispenard held the same rank relatively, in wealth and aristocratic society, that the Vanderbilts and Astors do at this time (1887).

In 1703 Monsieur Philipse (father of Hon. Frederic), proprietor of the Philipse Manor, was reputed to be the wealthiest person in the American colonies; amount, \$150,000.

All that we know of Simon is what Francis mentions in his will, as above written.

John died testate in 1832; his will was made May 9, 1831, and proved April 16, 1832. He bequeathed all of his estate to his beloved wife, Margaret Marston.

Margaret, wife of John, died in 1841; her will was made Nov. 7, 1841, and proved Jan. 4, 1842. She bequeathed all of her estates to the children of her brothers and sisters, \$200 excepted. It appears by the wills that Francis was the first, and John the last, of this family to die. The Surrogate says these are all the Marstons recorded in his office. Possibly this family were the brothers and sisters of Lawrence Marston.


GEORGE W. MARSTON,² son of William,¹ was born in Sandwich, Mass., May 23, 1840, and subsequently moved to Portland, Me., where he yet resides, at 81 Free street. He is a professional music teacher, and highly spoken of, both as to his professional abilities, and his moral and social character. Unmarried at date.

WESTLAND MARSTON, LL.D., a descendant of John Marston, the famous dramatic writer, was born in London, Eng., in 1820; studied law, but left it for literature, and was for a time editor of the "National Magazine," but his principal labors were devoted to dramatic literature. Of his numerous plays we may mention the "Patrician's Daughter," a tragedy (1841); "The Heart and the World" (1847); "Ann Blake" (1852); "Favorite of Fortune," a comedy (1866); and many others of much local reputation. He had three children: Cicely, who died suddenly of apoplexy, July 28, 1878; Eleanor, who md. Arthur O'Shaughnessy; and Philip Bourke Marston.

PHILIP BOURKE MARSTON, son of Westland, was born in London in 1850, where he died Feb. 14, 1887, aged about 37 years. When three years of age, while at play, he received a blow in his eye, previously weakened by scarlet fever, which caused inflammation to set in; it soon extended to the other eye, and in a short time he

became totally blind. He received a good education through his father and sister Cicely, and became quite famous as a poet and novelist, though so young. His works were not so remarkable for their intellectual strength, as for their tender and resigned expression of feelings, indicating a gentle, loving, and trusting spirit.
