Dear Dr. Wetmore:
Under the provisions of your letter of authorization No. 292-Bi, dated December 13, 1919, you will go from Washington, D. C., to Annapolis, Maryland, on March 17 , or as soon thereafter as practicable. At Annapolis you will find a launch belonging to the Biological Survey, and will proceed in this boat down Chesapeake Bay to the mouth of the Potomac, and from there to Washington.

This journey will be made for the purpose of ascertaining what ducts, geese, and other waterfowl, are on these waters at this season, and Fou are directed to make an estimate of the approximate number of these birds seen. In addition, you will keep careful watch for stragglers of water birds of other groups. as it is possible that there may be opportunities to secure interesting records ow other data of value.

If the weather continues favorable, the trip should require about five days, although it is possible that you may be delayed by storms.
