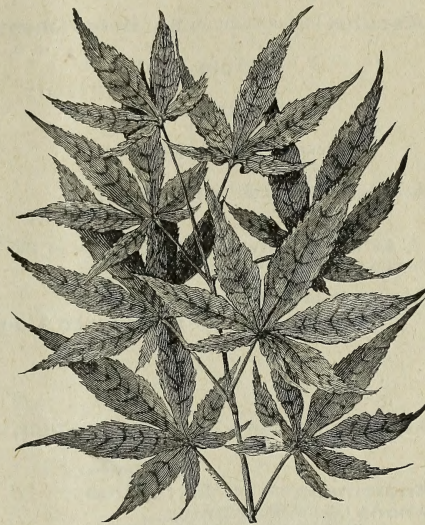

The Colchicum Maple is one of the best of those of medium size, it makes a somewhat round, spreading head, similar to a Norway Maple, and in fact does not look unlike that sort. The young leaves on the ends of the shoots have a reddish-purple color. If cut to the ground when planted it makes a large bushy tree from the ground, with several trunks, and in this manner on a lawn it gives a very pretty appearance. It is not hardy in the extreme north. A very valuable tree for park or cemetery use.

JAPAN MAPLES.

We call special attention to our stock of *Japanese Maples*, believing that it is larger than any in the United States, and it is all of our own growing. Of the Purple leaved sort, (see cut) we count our plants by the thousands. This sort we grow on its own roots, and being a strong grower it thrives better, and the leaves have a darker and richer color than when grafted. The other sorts, being of a somewhat lighter growth, are best when grafted on a strong growing stock, and we propagate them in that way, training up the central shoot in order to have a leader. It will be noticed that several of the sorts are in pots. This will be found of great assistance in transplanting them. These plants are much finer and more healthy than imported stock, and should not be compared with it.



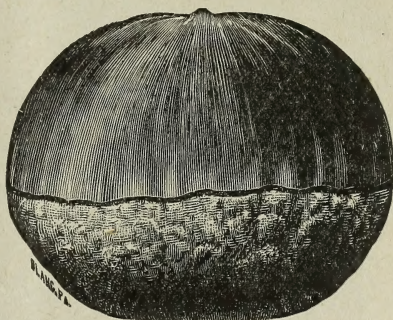

JAPAN JUDAS.—The Japan Judas is not known as well as it should be, though it is unquestionably one of the finest and most beautiful shrubs in cultivation. The flowers are pink and they completely cover the bush the first thing in spring. It makes a bush about the size of a Lilac; and is used for planting among the larger shrubs in beds or as single specimens. The flowers are darker pink than those of the native tree growing Judas.

WEeping DOgWOOD.

(*Cornus Florida Pendula.*)

Of all the weeping trees, there is none, to our mind, equal in beauty to this one. It is very hardy, and will thrive from Canada to Florida. As will be seen by the picture of a large specimen on our grounds, the branches are very pendulous, but the leader shoots up as straight as an arrow.

It bears a great profusion of large white flowers in spring, followed by bright red berries in fall, just the same as the White Flowered sort.

After growing it for upwards of ten years, we can recommend it as *one of the finest ornamental weeping trees grown.*



WHITE FLOWERED DOgWOOD.

(*Cornus Florida.*)

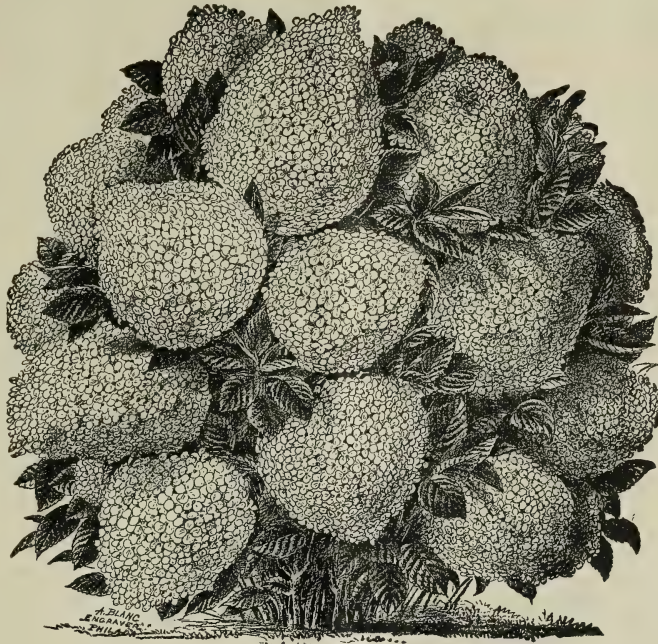

JAPAN SNOWBALL

(*Viburnum plicatum*)

A new variety of Snowball from Japan. Growth upright and compact. Foliage olive green through the summer, but toward fall it turns much darker and remains on the plant for some time after the first frosts. Flowers, though hardly as large as the old variety, are much more numerous. The leaves are in pairs along the stem, and from the base of each leaf a ball of flowers appears. There are often as many as ten pairs of these, or twenty balls, on a branch eighteen inches long. These balls, as they expand, all face upward, so that a full view of their great beauty is always to be had. To be a universal favorite a shrub must be hardy, easily transplanted and its growth of good shape, and beautiful both in leaf and flower, and the Japan Snowball embraces all of these points to the fullest extent.
