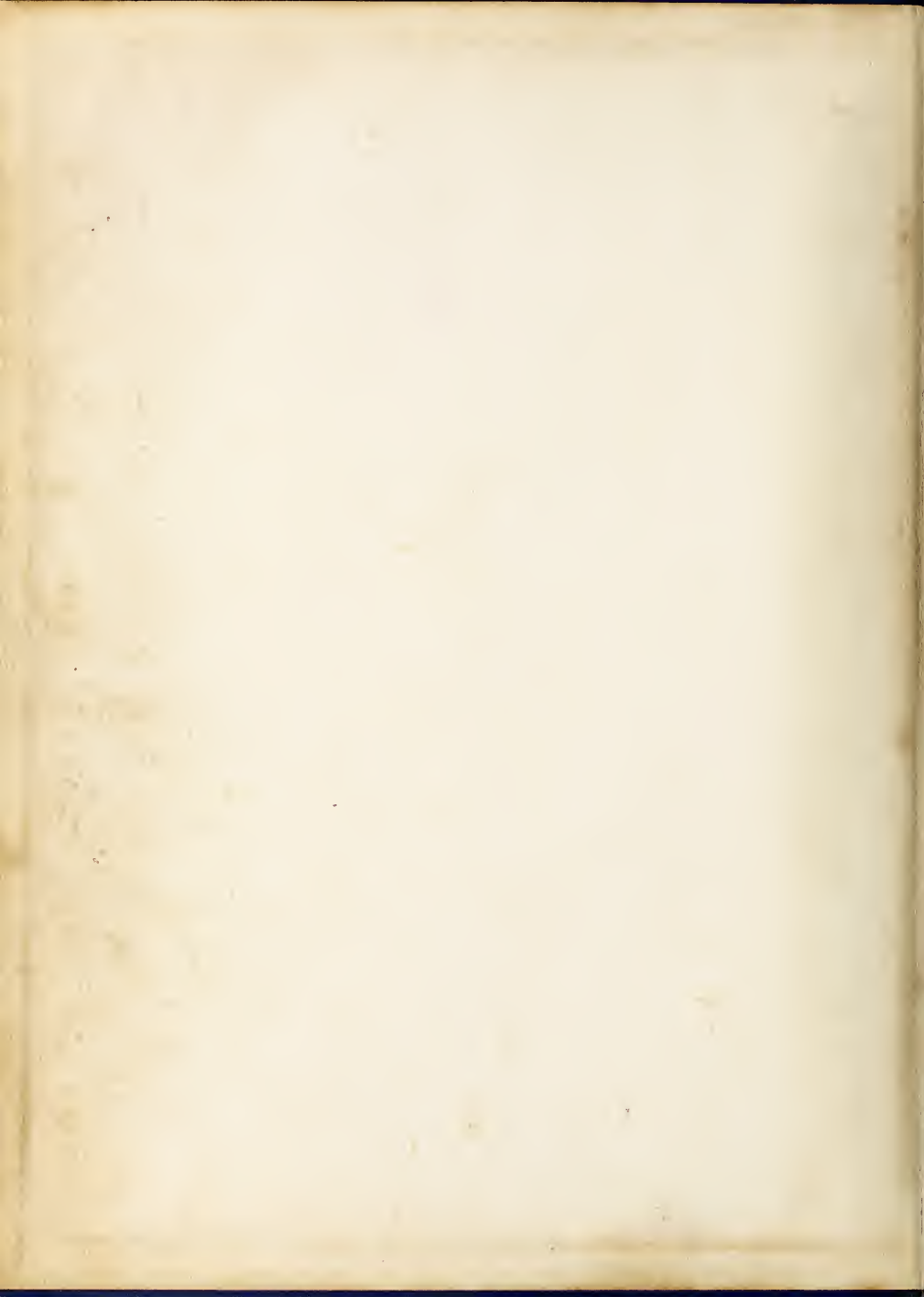
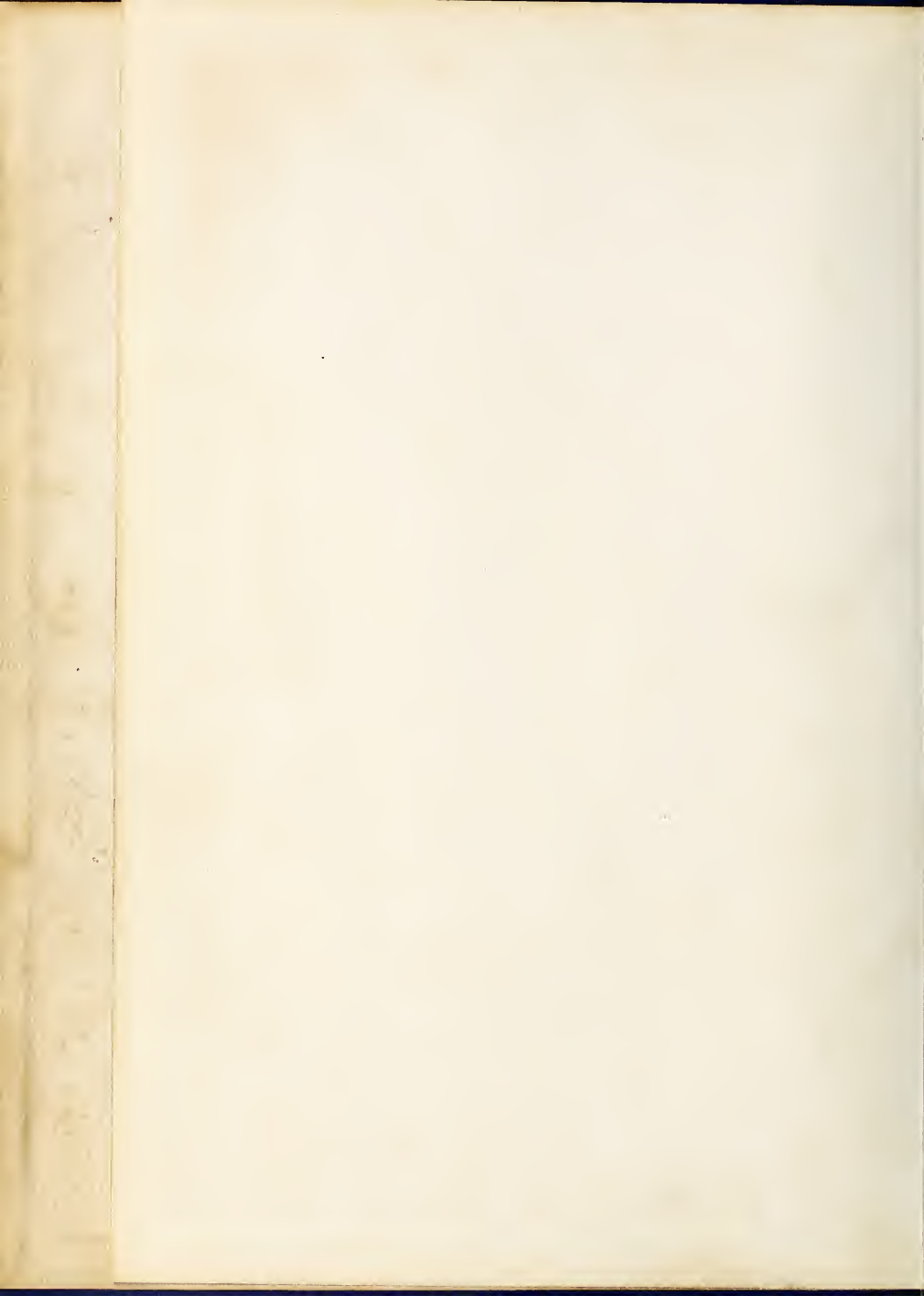

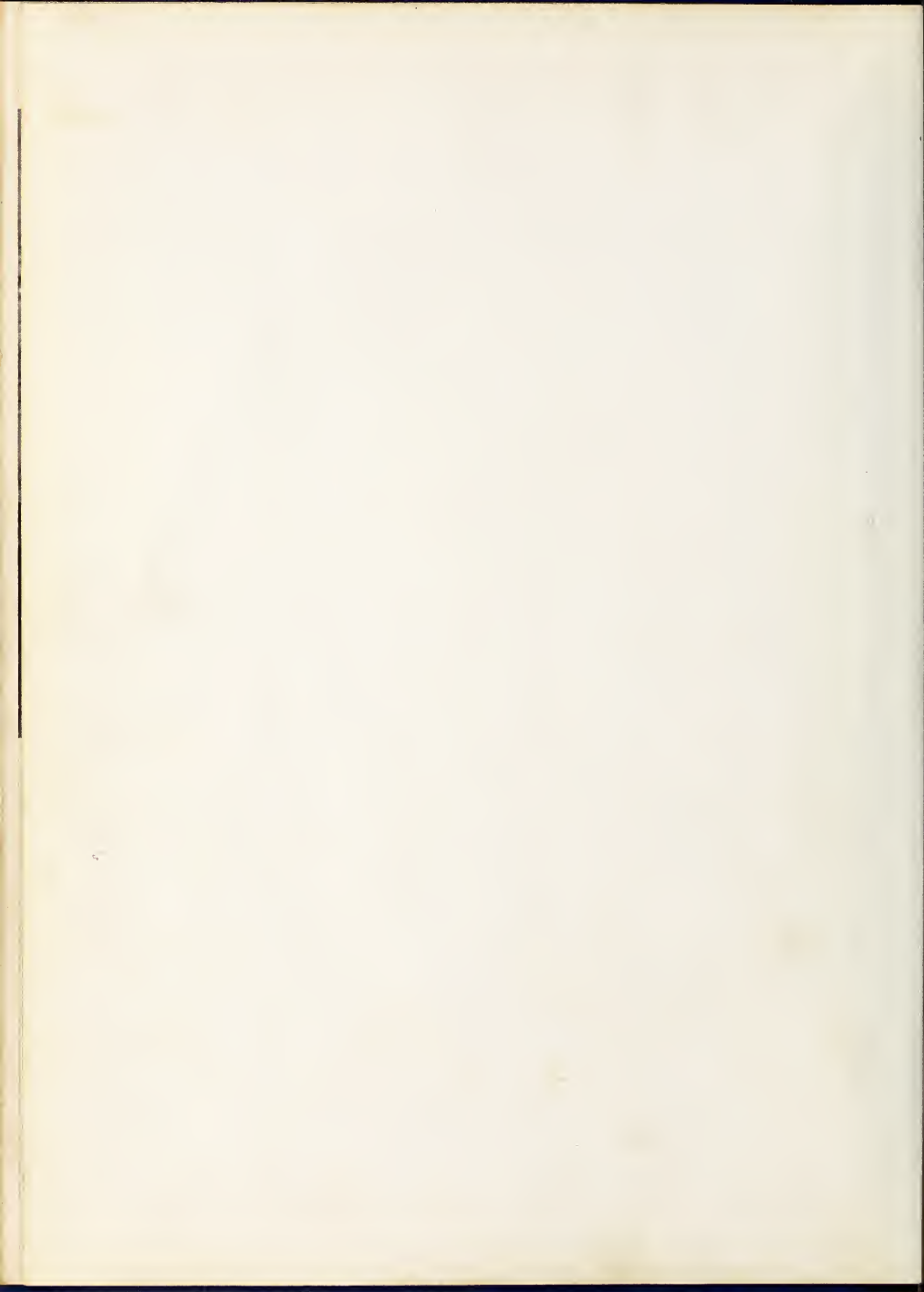
It would be indeed difficult to express our heartfelt appreciation for the many opportuni-

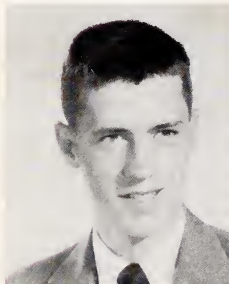


WINFORD BATTEN

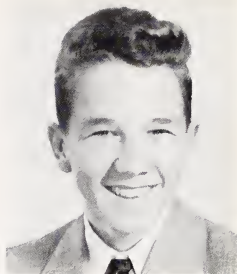
MARY ANN CALLIHAN

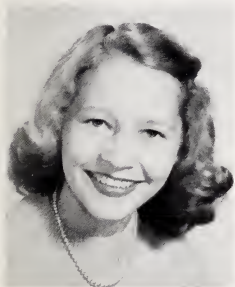
JOHN BOSTIC

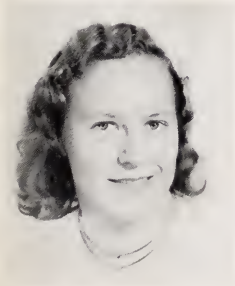
CURTIS CROTTS

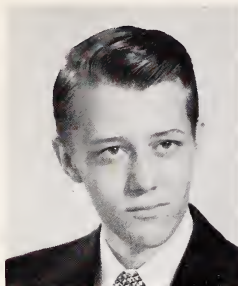


BETTY DYSON

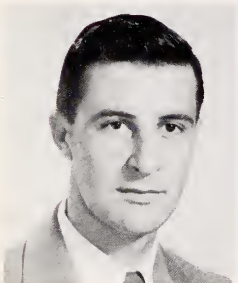
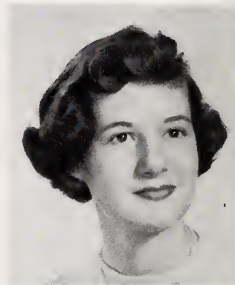
JOANN GADDY

HAROLD JOHNSON

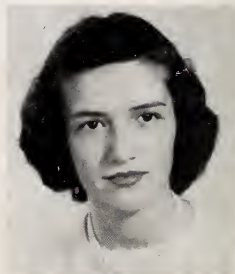
"Gabe"

BETTY HARVEL

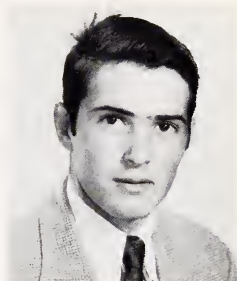

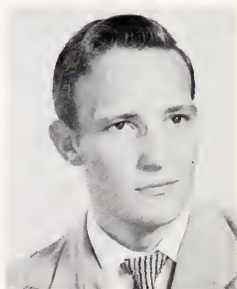
MARY HIX

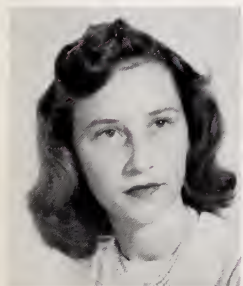
PAUL McLENDON

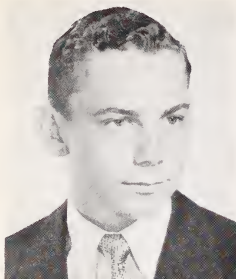


LUCILLE HURLEY

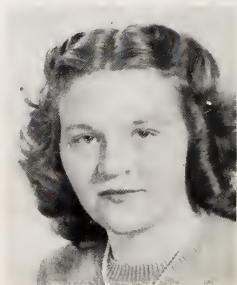


MARY ALICE KENNEDY

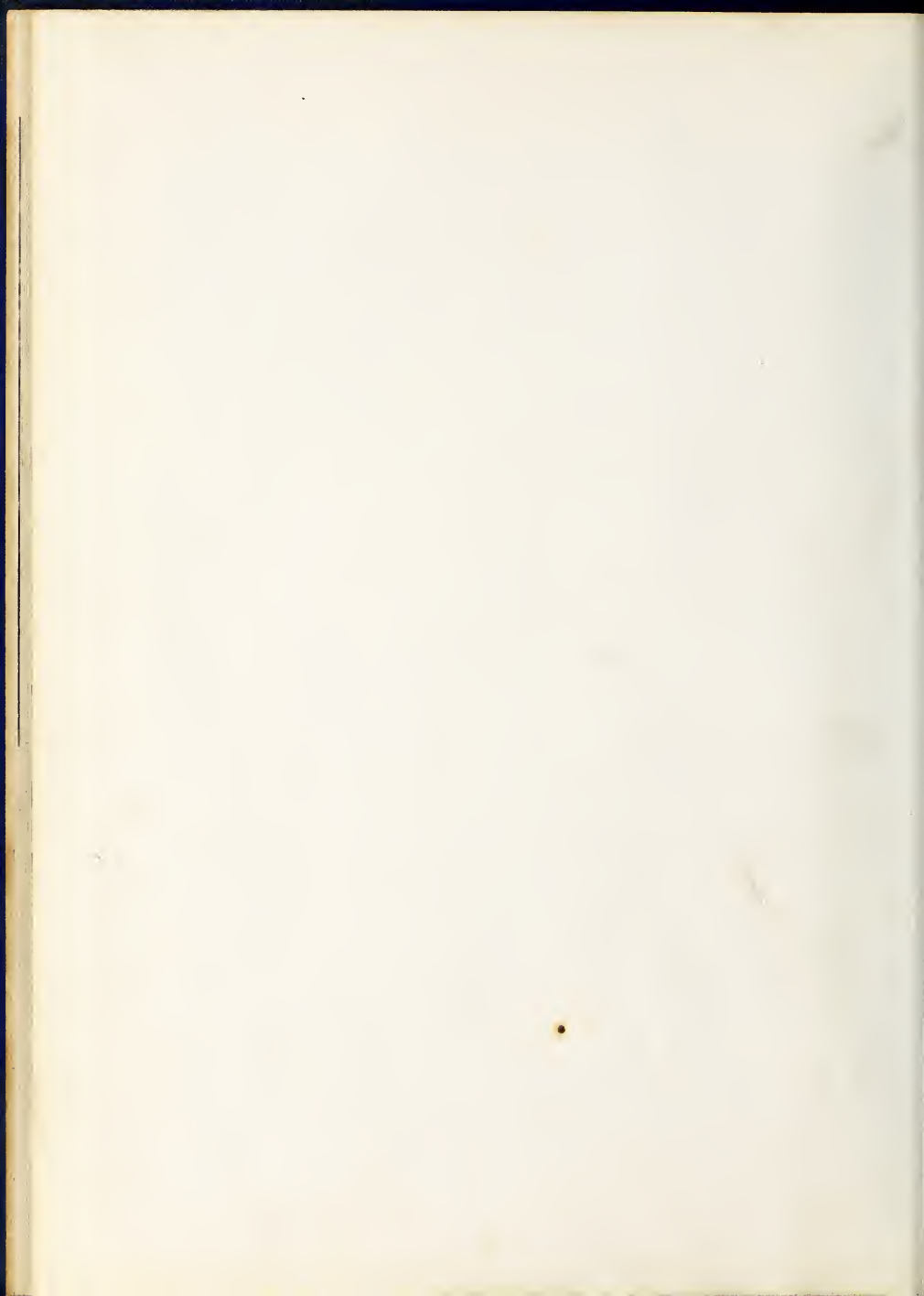
Bus Drivers
