The aim of the School is to educate young people in the field of Medical Technology, to give them technical experience in the form of internship, and thereby to equip them with the fundamentals of general laboratory procedures and practices, so that they will become worthy and efficient members of the profession.

MERCY HOSPITAL SCHOOL OF CYTOTECHNOLOGY

was established in 1958 for the purpose of training personnel in the field of Exfoliative Cytology. This work is of immeasurable importance in the early diagnosis of many types of cancer through the study of cells shed from various body tissues and body fluids. The School is approved by the Committee on Exfoliative Cytology of the College of American Pathologists and the Committee on Cytotechnology of the American Society of Clinical Pathologists.

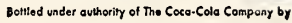
