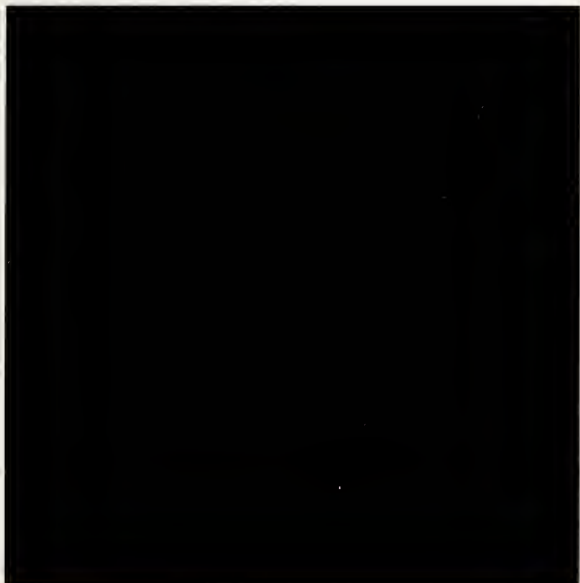

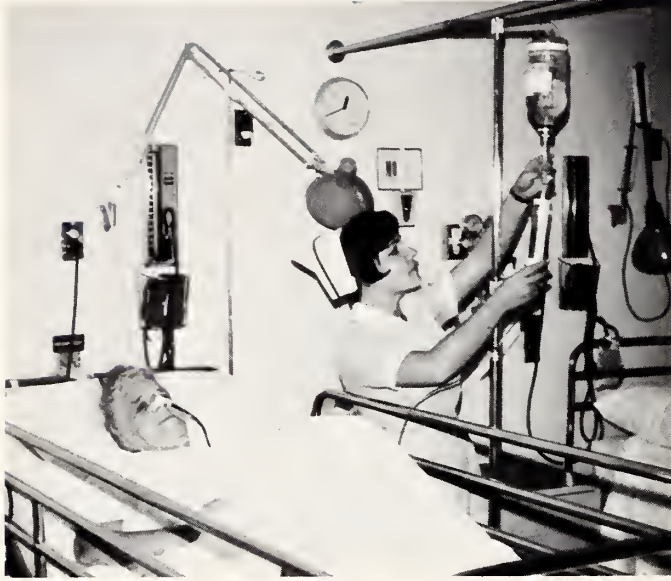
# RECOVERY ROOM

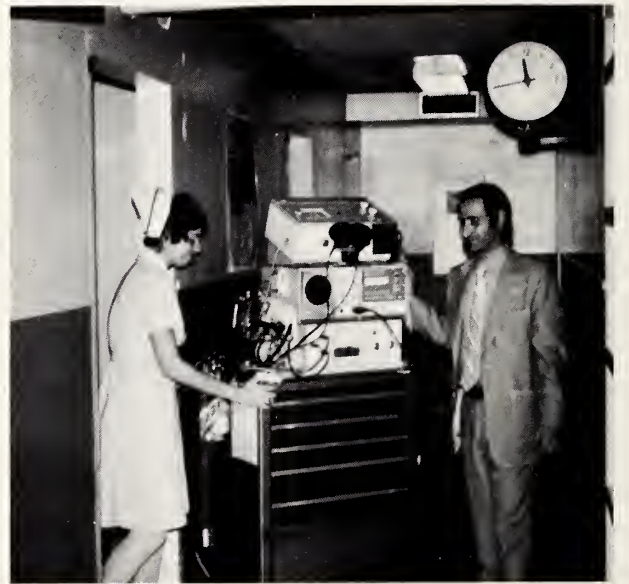


## INTENSIVE CARE

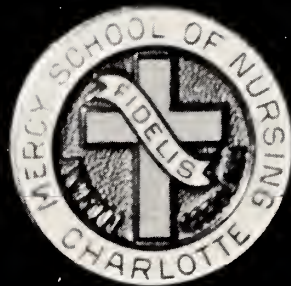
