Next the Bulldogs journeyed up to Ol' Virginia to meet the strong Maury High team in Norfolk. When the dust of this battle lifted, Durham found itself holding the short end of a 3-7 score. The second tough one in a row came when Greensboro pinned a too-lucky 6-7 reverse to the Bulldog's tail.

But these losses were quickly forgotten to the

tune of a 14-7 shellacking of Wilson in a conference game, a 14-12 licking bestowed upon the Roanoke Magicians, and a 9-7 beating given Rocky Mount.

But as the end of the season drew near to the tune of a 14-0 defeating of a scrapping Fayetteville team, it became apparent that the clash for the Eastern State championship lay between Durham and its old enemy, Raleigh. But that clash ended in a 7-7 tie, thus proving nothing. It was at this point that a helpful Rocky Mount eleven stepped in to defeat Raleigh 9-7 while Durham beat Wilmington 25-0—giving the Bulldogs the Eastern Conference championship.

In Chapel Hill the Greensboro eleven which had previously defeated Durham was defeated 7-0, and undisputed possession of the state crown was won by Durham.

To conclude the season's football news, little Russ Perry was voted the most valuable player on the 1940 team.

The winning of this tourney marked the end of one of the most successful golf years in Durham High.

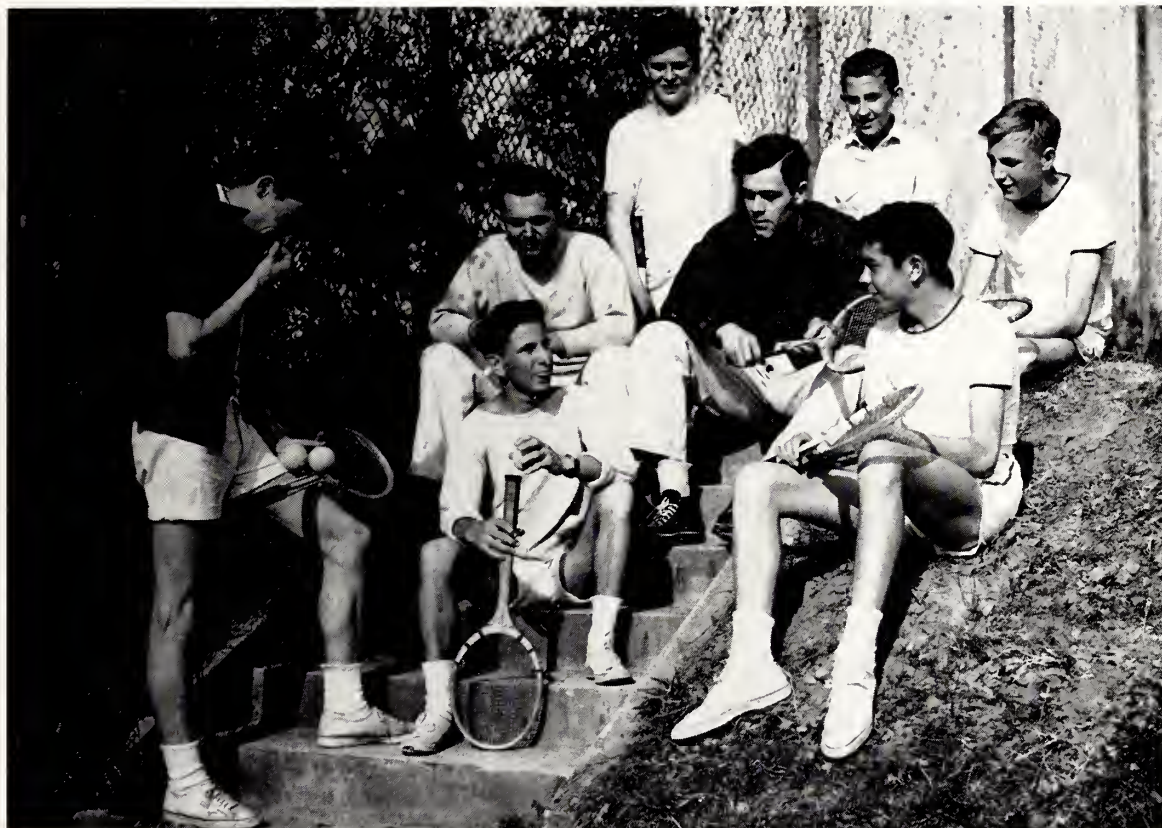

# First Graduate Talks of School Life

Visiting Durham after an absence of over forty years, Charles Barham, valedictorian of Durham High's first class, that of 1885, toured Durham High Friday morning under the guidance of C. S. Hooper, D.H.S. dean of boys, along with Claude E. Bishop, of Greensboro, his nephew.

Of his school life he said, "Our school was a two-story frame building, which had once been Faucette's tobacco factory, situated where the fire station on West Main street now is. We had full nine months school in those days, and went for six hours, with only fifteen minutes recess for lunch. At recess boys and girls would go to separate yards at the back of the school, divided by a high fence. As soon as recess was over, Professor Kennedy would beat on a drum, and we would march in. Since I was the only senior boy, I would lead the procession.

"The present site of Durham High school was then a part of Brodie Duke's farm. I used to come down here and pick black walnuts." In answer to a question, Mr. Barham stated that as soon as he arrived at school, the whole school of seventy-five (including the first through the ninth grades) would assemble; the principal would lead them in prayer after reading a chapter in the Bible; and then the school would all rise and sing some song to the accompaniment of the school harmonium.

"We had no organized sports," Mr. Barham went on. "Every morning the principal would call the whole school together and we would go through fifteen minutes of calisthenics. This was our only exercise. We brought our lunches in shoe boxes; we had an Honor System by which a pupil with too many demerits would be expelled." Among the demerits was one for dropping a pencil.

"At that time, Durham's population was 3,500; Main street was still a mudhole; horse-cars were still far off. The horseless carriage was a dream of lunatics."

He expressed amazement at Durham High's facilities for vocational and commercial education, and seemed especially delighted at the op-

portunities for taking scientific studies. "I do believe we had a physics book, but I don't think we ever studied it," Mr. Barham commented as he passed a physics class.

"You have a nice school here. And it looks all the nicer to me when I remember the school I went to fifty years ago."

And so, after a trip back through fifty years, the man who received the first diploma from Durham High—"because my name began with a 'B'"—bade goodbye to the Durham High school of fifty years after.
